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## Resilient Warriors take next step

Pocahontas County High School Class of 2023 was all smiles Sunday as they entered the gymnasium together one last time to reflect on the tumultuous past four years. If the class could be described in one word, it would be “resilient.”

They survived the COVID-19 pandemic and learned by way of virtual classes as underclassmen. They grieved the loss of two classmates. They worked together to help save the life of a classmate. Through all that and more, they managed to find time for homework, sports, extracurricular activities, jobs and maybe a little bit of fun with friends.

Valedictorian Max O’Ganian reflected on the unique high school career he shared with his classmates and how they all managed to come out the other end, better and stronger people.

“Our time at Pocahontas County High School has been very distinctive,” he said. “We have had a unique experience and it often takes taking a step away to realize exactly what a special experience we have had. As I look up today, I know every



single one of you, and I am sure most valedictorians can’t say that.”

O’Ganian said that while the school may be small, the students had more opportunities than most – having the opportunity to play multiple sports, take AP classes and vocational courses. The rural setting may have some drawbacks, but the students were still able to make the best of their high school career and earn degrees.

“Yes, virtual sucked and we lost so much of what should make high school special,” he said. “But, we

learned things about ourselves and grew in ways that otherwise would have been impossible. We found an inner strength and level of maturity to persevere through it all. We found ways to have our sports seasons and succeed academically – even if it meant pushing through weeks of quarantine or canceled games, classes and tests.”

O’Ganian took a moment to recognize classmate Nicholas Stephens, who was in a near fatal car accident prior to their senior year. O’Ganian said Stephens was

a classmate and a friend. He also recognized the students who acted swiftly to help rescue Stephens that day.

O’Ganian also shared the results of the State Track Meet, which was held the day before in Charleston. Logan Wimer won 8th in shot putt, the girls 4x400 team won 8th, the boys 4x200 won 7th and the boys 4x400 placed third. The winners wore their medals with their graduation attire.

Now ready for the future, O’Ganian congratulated his

## SWA to establish volunteer work group to seek solutions to landfill issues

At its May 18 special meeting, the Pocahontas County Solid Waste Authority (SWA) offered transparency to the public about its financial problems.

The meeting was held in the circuit courtroom with about 25 citizens in attendance, plus several more attending virtually on Zoom Meeting.

County SWA Chairman Ed Riley opened the meeting then turned it over to Mark Holstine, who is the Executive Director of the West Virginia Solid Waste Management Board.

Holstine provided a brief history of Solid Waste Authorities in West Virginia, saying that they were established by the state legislature in 1989, at which time the Pocahontas County SWA was formed and took control over the county’s solid waste management from the county commission.

He said the county’s 43-acre landfill and green box program had already been established in 1986, however the commission stopped funding them when the SWA became active here in 1989. The commission still appoints two of the five members on the SWA Board with the WV Department of Environmental Protection; the local Soil Conservation District; and the West Virginia Public Service Commission each appointing one member.

Holstine said the current tipping fee at the landfill is \$72.75 and the new current green box annual fee is \$115, the latter having just been raised from \$107 per year at the last meeting. He explained that the landfill receives about 7,400 tons of waste per year, which makes it the smallest landfill in the state. The landfill is leased, and that lease is valid until 2033. Holstine said the estimated remaining landfill life is only four more years, and there is no additional land available to expand.

He explained there a state-controlled escrow account is set up to pay for the \$1.8 million that will eventually be needed to close and remediate the landfill. That account is funded by depositing \$5.95 per ton from the tipping fee, and currently has \$1.2 million in it.

Regarding the financial issues the county SWA faces, Holstine said that to raise the tipping fee enough to cover the nearly \$100,000 annual loss, would make the landfill unable to compete with the lower tipping fees at other area landfills. Doing so would most likely cause the loss of one of their major income sources - large commercial trash haulers, who would go to other lower cost landfills, such as Greenbrier County, Nicholas County, Tucker County or Tygart’s Valley.

Holstine said the county SWA has only three sources of income:

- Tipping fees of \$350,000 per year.
- Green Box fees of \$470,000 per year
- \$35,000 from the State Solid Waste Management Board.

Another financial drain on the SWA in the county, he said, are the losses they experience from their recycling program because it costs far more to run that program than the income it produces. Holstine said this is a statewide issue since the market for recyclables is extremely low, but the recycling loss in Pocahontas County is made worse because of losses due to theft, such as the recycling trailer from the Caesar Mountain green box site and of the gate at the Marlinton site; as well as vandalism and stolen parts from recycling trailers over the years.

After his service, he said he has considered joining the reserves and going into law enforcement. He was a member of the robotics team and STEM Club.

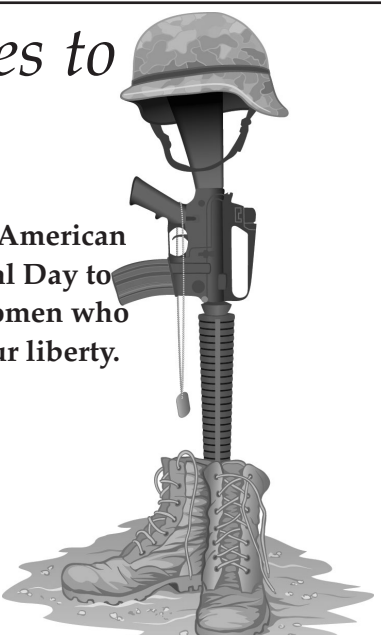
While Wimer has his orders for basic training, the others are still in the paperwork process. Once they have completed all the requirements, they will be leaving for training later this summer.

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# Commission approves Broadband Pole Agreement with Mon Power

The Pocahontas County Commission cleared away one of the last hurdles to the construction of high-speed Internet service to a large area in the county. The project, known as the ARC Broadband Project, came about when the County Broadband Council applied for and received \$2.5 million in 2021 from the Appalachian Regional Commission Power Grant. The project was later supplemented by an additional \$1 million from Internet Service Provider (ISP) Citynet. When

completed, it will provide broadband service east out of Marlinton along Route 39, turn north on Route 92 to Dunmore and back south on Route 28.

The start of construction on the project has been delayed because of governmental regulations such as permits and studies. Its current timeline projects completion by July of 2024.

The current delay which has stalled the project for months, has been the approval of agreements with Mon Power (First Energy) and Frontier Communications to attach fiber lines to their existing utility poles. Lawyers for Mon Power

and for the county finally worked out an agreement, and the commission approved that agreement at its May 16 meeting.

Although they still need to reach a similar agreement with Frontier, the Broadband Council is hopeful that the same agreement terms will be acceptable to Frontier. The agreement with Mon Power, however, will cover the majority of the poles needed for this project.

Also at the meeting, the commission agreed to switch the county government's telephone service

# BOE receives update from math coach

At the May 16 Pocahontas County Board of Education meeting, math coach Joanna Burt-Kinderman gave an update on math scores and grants for the upcoming school year.

Burt-Kinderman shared the 2022 test results, which were the best she has seen in her career with Pocahontas County Schools.

"Of the seven grades we get tested - third through eighth and eleventh - six of them tested above state average proficiency," she said. "That's the first time in twelve years that I've been doing this job. That's the

best we've seen yet. That's really exciting."

She added that the 11th grade was second out of the 55 state districts and seventh of the 114 high schools in the state.

While the score reflects well on the students' retention of math lessons, Burt-Kinderman said there is always room to improve.

"I think it's in three parts - more models, more fluency and more math time," she said. "By models, I mean all the stuff that probably looks weird to you on kids' homework, is really tracking - like drawing pictures to learn how to add, subtract, multiply and divide. To develop a deep flexible understanding what it means when

you learn to long multiply or long divide."

Burt-Kinderman explained that math has evolved and while middle school math looks similar to what board members learned in school, high school and elementary math has changed. The high school students are doing more and learning in different ways and the younger students are using new methods that have helped them learn math.

The board thanked Burt-Kinderman for her continued efforts in getting new ideas and grant funding for the math program, as well as for her update about the progress of the students.

# Tourism growth celebrated at annual Tourism Summit

Cara Rose, Executive Director of the Pocahontas County Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB) delivered the opening remarks at the 2023 county Tourism Summit held at the Opera House in Marlinton May 9. The event highlights the Nature's Mountain Playground's tourism successes.

Rose talked about the Hotel/Motel Tax revenue as being a barometer of the tourism success here. She pointed out that those tax revenues were \$1.6 million in fiscal year 2007-2008, and grew to \$2.65 million in 2021-2022, unhindered even by the COVID pandemic.

Similarly, she said, tourism

seasonal trends show that growth in spring, summer and fall events such as the county receiving the International Mountain Biking Association's designation as a Silver Ride Center, as well as growth in other warm weather activities, are beginning to close the tourism gap with the winter ski season. Rose said that some projections show that if these trends continue, it is possible that those other three seasons will approach the success of the winter season by the year 2030.

Rose said that the Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) promotes the growth of tourism by protecting the environment and by supporting local culture, local residents and the community's economic growth. She said

those are reasons the CVB has been so involved with the Housing Task Force, the Broadband Council and the Mon Forest Towns initiatives.

After a great lunch, provided by Rayetta's Lunchbox, Linda Adams talked briefly about some of the grants the CVB has been utilizing.

The main speaker, Andy Williams of the West Virginia University's Outdoor Economic Development Collaborative, spoke about developing successful tourism economies. He said one of the keys to doing that is finding the sweet spot between tourism, economic development and management of public lands.

# HSPC offers free spay/neutering and reduced cost microchipping

The Humane Society of Pocahontas County recently received its largest grant yet, which will help finance the spaying and neutering of hundreds of family cats and dogs, as well as several colonies of feral community cats.

The \$22,543 West Virginia Spay and Neuter (WVSNP) grant was awarded to HSPC through the West Virginia Department of Agriculture.

HSPC has received a WVSNP award for the past five years, though none have been this large. According to the website for the West Virginia Department of Agriculture, its WVSNP grants are funded by registration fees paid by pet food manufacturers which sell their products in West Virginia. These grants are not funded by taxes and require a detailed application process.

HSPC is also providing \$17,000 in matching funds, dedicating a total of \$39,500 to help families afford this important medical procedure, and conducting Trap/Neuter/Release (TNR) of cats countywide in order to control feral population growth.

HSPC recognizes the importance of pets to families, and helps families with

the responsibility to spay and neuter. Besides controlling population, spaying and neutering usually results in better behaved pets who are less apt to roam and become nuisances to neighbors, or fall prey to cars and coyotes.

To obtain a free voucher, Pocahontas County residents can call 304-799-6767 and leave their name and phone number for a call back, or send a private message via the HSPC Facebook page.

HSPC will have a table at the June 2 First Friday event where you will be able to begin the free voucher process in person.


HSPC is also excited to offer a pet micro-chipping clinic June 10, for only \$10 per cat or dog. You can reserve chips for your pets at First Friday June 2. Veterinarians will perform the simple process of implanting a permanent chip using a syringe to place the tiny chip beneath your pet's skin on the back of the neck. Any scanner will detect this chip and it will prove ownership of your cat or dog if it is lost or stolen. This chipping

process ordinarily costs \$25 to \$60 in a vet office, but will be available Saturday, June 10, from 10 a.m. to noon at HSPC, 410 Second Avenue in Marlinton. One \$10 fee covers chip, insertion and lifetime registration.

Reserve your microchips at First Friday, or just show up at the clinic Saturday morning, June 10. Frankford Vet will also offer vaccinations at reasonable costs at the same time and location.

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**Do our dogs love us? Part One**

“Without data, you’re just another person with an opinion.” W. Edwards Deming

In a recent episode of *For Your Consideration*, we examined the sophisticated system of canine smell. Canine cognitive research conducted at Cornell University demonstrated that, in addition to the astonishing acuity of a dog’s olfactory system, their sense of smell has recently been discovered to have a direct connection to the visual cortex in the brain.

How the dog experiences smell utilizing the visual portion of the brain awaits further research. It may be a sense experience that humans can never fully appreciate, like the echolocation of bats and porpoises.

We will now enter an even more challenging aspect of research, canine emotions, specifically the ability to love. Anyone who has paid close attention to their dog knows they have many of the same emotions as humans.

Lust is driven by testosterone and estrogen, while attraction arises from releasing dopamine, serotonin and norepinephrine. At some point in the love process, we feel attachment mediated by vasopressin and oxytocin. \*

And those butterflies we feel in our tummies when we see our beloved? Phenylethylamine causes those flutters and, in my case, a loss of rational thinking.

Like it or not, romantic or not, that’s love from a purely scientific viewpoint.

However, you’ll only convince some that love is merely a chemical reaction. We place this emotion way above and beyond a simple explanation. Humans almost universally regard love as something ethereal, something almost Godly.

The above doesn’t answer the question of whether our dogs love us, though. We know that we love them, but do they return the sentiment?

Over the last several months, I have asked many of my dog caretaker friends if they think their dogs love them.

Only one response was vaguely like the chemical explanation; everyone else felt that their dogs love them because they show it through body language, desire to be near us, and that love resides in their eyes.

And indeed, unlike most other animals, dogs will look deeply into our eyes. At

times that visual embrace can only be described as adoring.

Now, that should ruffle the feathers of the reductionists out there and those fearful of venturing into the valley of anthropomorphism.

**Why just dogs; what about cats?**

You may wonder why I have not included our feline friends in this article. The answer to whether or not our dogs love us is well-studied of late, so there is data to back up my assertions.

The research methods used to confirm canine amore is partly based on training dogs to be completely still while undergoing functional magnetic resonance imaging, fMRI.

Imagine training a cat to do that. It sounds a lot like the proverbial “Harder than herding cats” – in other words, a logistical nightmare.

ence, you may have noticed the proliferation of canine studies in the last few decades. Of course, we don’t need science to tell us our dogs love us. We have always believed our dogs love us, and now science is coming to the same conclusion.

## Marlinton Mayor's Corner

Now, just to let everyone know, "whatever can go wrong – will go wrong."

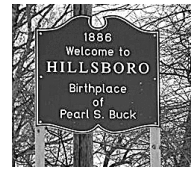
I purchased a flag – that would not fly. Due to its custom design, and the fact that the outer layers were only sewn around the outer border, the flag kept blousing-

## What's Cookin'?

### Carrot Cake

- 1 Tbsp. baking soda
- 1/2 cup warm water
- 3 cups finely shredded carrots
- 1 cup plain yogurt
- 1 1/2 cups brown sugar
- 1 cup unsweetened apple sauce
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 2 lg. eggs
- 1 Tbsp. cinnamon
- 1 tsp. ground nutmeg
- 1 tsp. ground cloves (opt)
- 1 tsp. salt
- 2 cups raisins or craisins

- 2 cups whole wheat flour
  - 2 cups unbleached flour
- Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Grease two 8" or 9" cake pans.

In a small bowl, combine baking soda and warm water. Set mixture aside.

In a large bowl, beat the eggs then add everything but the flours. Mix well. Add flours and mix well.

Add baking soda mixture and blend.

Pour into greased cake pans. Place the pans in the hot oven and bake for 1 hour or until a tester inserted into the center comes out clean. Leave the cake in the pans on a rack for 10-15 minutes

then turn cakes out onto cooling rack to cool completely before icing the cake.

### ICING

- 2- 8 oz. pkgs. cream cheese (room temp)
- 1 1/2 sticks butter (room temp)
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 4 cups sifted confectioners sugar

With hand or stand mixer, cream cream cheese until smooth. Add butter and blend until smooth.

Add vanilla and mix well. Add confectioners sugar and mix until incorporated.

Spread between layers and on top and sides.

Sue had worked at a sewing factory and at Snowshoe. She loved Elvis and loved to sing his songs.

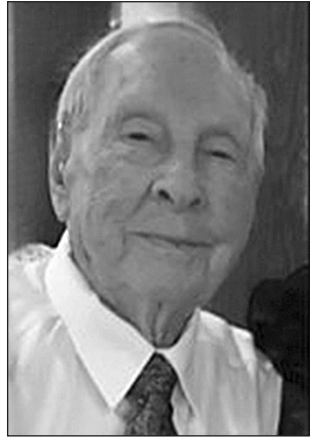
She attended the New Hope Church of the Brethren.

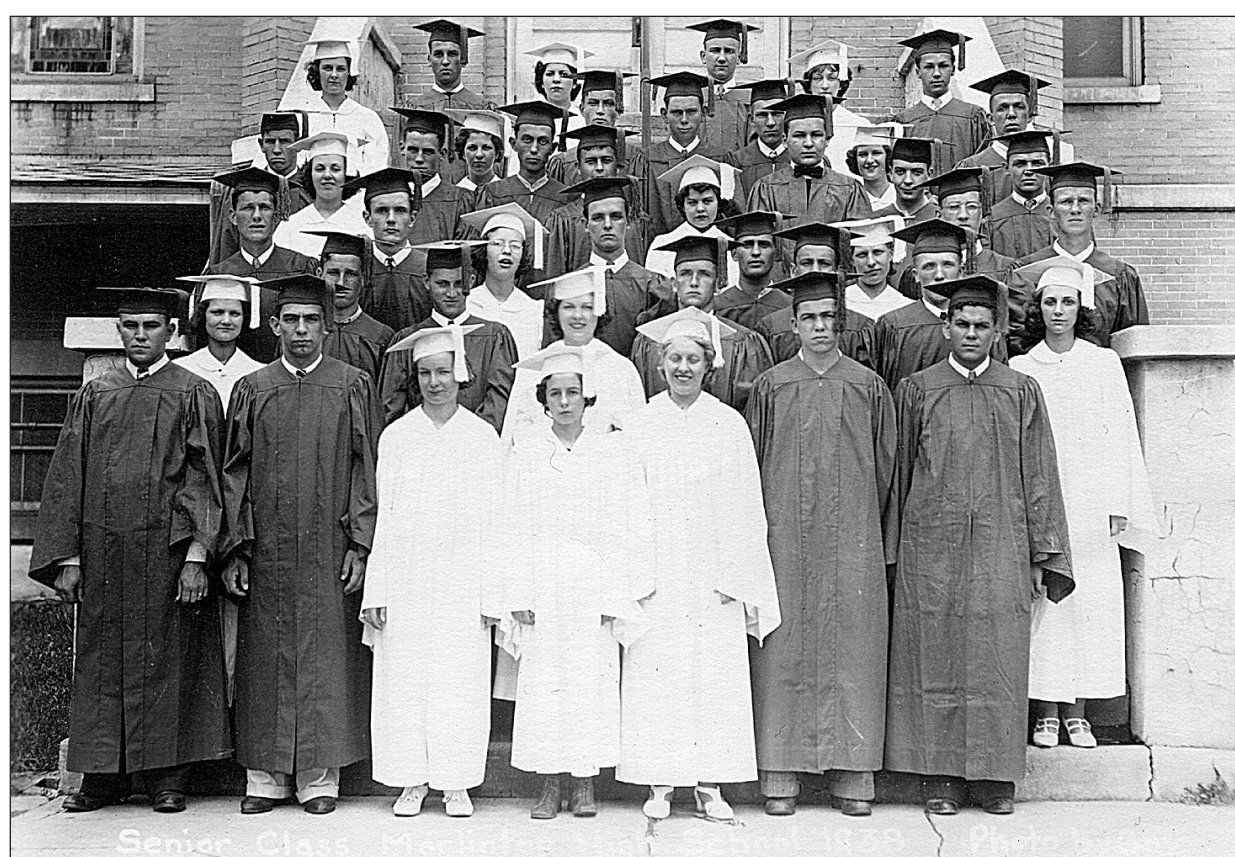

And Elijah Harmon, an old time hunter, walked down many a deer when there was a tracking snow on the ground.

## Footsteps through History

It has been so long since there was a well authenticated case of a panther being seen in the mountains of this county that the general belief has blown up that there was not a panther left. There seems to be no doubt that there is a panther in the Cranberry mountains. The first heard of it was from Ed Patterson, who saw the tracks of some large animal which had been following a deer trail in a muddy path.

Last week, Andrew and John Moore went to Cranberry to fish. They are absolutely reliable, and are not given to exaggeration. They were shy of believing that they saw a panther, and the reader can judge whether it was one or not. They had fished down North Fork and had prepared to lay out at the forks. They got everything ready and started up the South Prong for a short fish. When they got up about half a mile to the foot of the island, where the path comes in, they were standing close together, talking of turning back. It was nearly sundown. John had his eyes turned up the river and saw the animal jump across the stream, about a hundred yards above him. He remarked that he had seen a deer. They immediately started up the back channel to get a sight of the animal, if possible, as it crossed the back channel.

They were fortunate to the last degree. As they reached a point nearly opposite where it was seen, the pan-

ther came out of the brush ahead of them and walked slowly away in a diagonal direction. They saw at once that it was not a deer. They thought once that it was a cinnamon bear, but catching sight of its long, prehensile tail, drooping to the ground and turning up at the end, they spotted it as a panther... The size they put as three times as large as a big dog. The panther approached a log and put its forefeet upon it, and they had a good look at its foot. Its front legs were as large as a man's arm, sleeve and all. It was when the panther was in this attitude that it slightly turned its head and caught sight of the men. Like a flash of light, it sprang clear across the back channel and took to the mountainside...

The boys say that it made no noise whatsoever as it ran through the woods. They went to see where it had sprung across the stream. It had sailed across, without raising perceptibly, a distance of about 25 feet, and had lighted on a rock. The print of its wet feet was to be seen on the rock. From thence, it had jumped ashore in a muddy place and it made a track in the mud like a horse. At nowhere else could they discover the imprint of its foot.

The presence of this panther will discourage fishing parties to Cranberry where the trout are about exhausted. It will not be pleasant camping out when the fire burns down, with a

## AG announces 'Kids Kick Opioids' Design Contest winners

West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrissey announced eight students from Central and Southeastern West Virginia as regional winners of the office's seventh Kids Kick Opioids contest, a competition designed to spur creativity and raise awareness of prescription painkiller abuse.

Regional winners are Samantha Kennedy, of Clay County Middle School; Brooklynn Neel, Sarah Arthur and Haylee Surface, of Mountain View Elementary and Middle in Monroe County; Autumn Hively, of Hillsboro Elementary School, and Mitchell Koerber, of Marlinton Middle School, both in Pocahontas County; and Lailyn Yost and Emma Crawford, of Ridgeview Elementary School in Raleigh County.

"Drug abuse needlessly claims too many lives, and our hope is the entries from these artistic students will bring greater awareness and change—these entries really showcase the tremendous talent of our elementary and middle school participants," Morrissey said. "These artworks underscore the impact of the opioid epidemic on our young students. They are growing up in a time when drug abuse runs rampant. Our hope is their artwork will bring about greater awareness and a renewed commitment to change." The Attorney General re-

ceived a total of 2,347 entries from 66 middle and elementary schools across West Virginia. The submissions included a mix of drawings, poems and other designs aimed at promoting awareness.

Judges recognized winning entries from 65 students overall. Those designs will be displayed in the State Capitol in the fall.

The statewide winner and runner up will be announced soon. That winning entry will appear in newspapers across West Virginia as the Attorney General's next public service announcement.

Kids Kick Opioids represents one of many initiatives through which the Attorney General has sought to combat West Virginia's drug overdose death rate, including a lawsuit against the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration that achieved sweeping reforms to the nation's drug quota system.

The Attorney General also has fought the opioid crisis with civil litigation, multistate initiatives, funding to target opioid abuse, criminal prosecutions, new technology, engagement with the faith-based community and education.

The West Virginia Board of Pharmacy, West Virginia Association of School Nurses and the Capitol Police assisted the Attorney General in judging the public service announcement contest.

from Frontier conventional landline service to STI Connect Voice over Internet Protocol (VOIP) telephone service. By doing this, the county will save nearly \$450 per month on its telephone bill.

They also agreed to allow County Emergency Management to sponsor a new Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) which was formerly known as Community Watch. CERT is part of a Nationally Accredited volunteer program in

which local volunteers will receive training to serve in a back-up role to the county's first responders. They will assist law enforcement and fire department personnel by providing manpower in situations such as traffic control and search and rescue.

At Commissioner John Rebinski's request, the commission approved several changes of employment for the Pocahontas County EMS Ambulance Service: Keith Boehmer from being a full-time driver to being a part-time driver; and Sheila Varner from being a part-time EMT/Driver to full-time. The commission also approved the hiring of Holly

Arbogast as a part-time EMT/Driver. Rebinski said they now have eight employees for the ambulance service, of which, six are part-time and two are full-time.

In addition, the commission approved an agreement between Records Management and the Preservation Board; and approved the 2023 proposal by the WV-CORP, regarding providing Workers Compensation Coverage for the county.

Because of a change in the scope of the advertised position, the commission did not open or make a selection of the bid proposals received for site clearing for the new

911 Center behind PMH. They will re-advertise for that job with the new description of the required work.

They also took no action of the Hay Removal Lease at the East Fork Industrial Park, wanting more time to consider that.

The commissioners went into an Executive Session to discuss a budget revision for the 911 Center, since it also involved some personnel issues. Upon returning to open session, they announced they will put any decision on this off to a future meeting to get more accurate financial information for the revision.

Holstine said he has no easy answers to the financial problems, citing three possible solutions:

1. Continue landfill operations somehow. But doing this will continue the loss of money unless they purchase additional land, which would require a new permit that takes several years to obtain and is expensive, and will continue to lose money.

2. Construct and operate a transfer station, which will also involve purchasing additional land, obtaining a new permit, and is even more expensive to operate.

3. Do away with use of the landfill, and only haul residential trash from the green boxes to the Lewisburg land-

fill, and pay their tipping fee. Besides being expensive to do this, it will cost them the income from commercial trash customers, dramatically raise the green box fees, and risk having people dump their trash all over the county – literally throwing it over the hill.

The SWA board voted to have Holstine oversee a volunteer work group of citizens and other stakeholders to try and find additional innovative solutions to the SWA's financial crisis.

Holstine asked citizens to sign up as volunteers for this work group, which will analyze the existing program to possibly increase its effectiveness and cost efficiency; search for alternative income sources; and suggest other sensible solutions which will work for the good of the citizens.

minum lounge chair with wide strapping weaved in and out. If he had it on the shore, its legs buried halfway into the sand, but sometimes he sat it in the creek to enjoy the cool water while leisurely fishing.

I usually proceeded to look for a pile of rocks near the shore to start scavenging for crawfish and hellgrammites. Occasionally Dad purchased a small container of night crawlers at the local country store but most of the time we used canned corn and dug up our own crawlies to fish with.

Whenever I wasn't fishing, I enjoyed playing in the water, watching the fish care-

lessly swim around me, digging in the course wet sand (not the same as beach sand), flipping over rocks and watching for snakes, or snoozing on the blanket. My good ol' dog normally sat on the bank to alert at any possible dangers – whether people, snakes or other animals – as he vigilantly kept watch over me. He sometimes enjoyed jumping and splashing around in the water with me.

I remember one of many times when my beloved dog saved my life.

On that particular day we had decided to spend it at "the rope" location instead of the waterfall. The creek had several different beachy areas which spanned a few miles and most were only reachable by foot. Many spots only

had a clearing of about a 6x10 foot area so it could only accommodate one family. You needed to arrive early to get your preferred spot for the day. A few locations could handle more people but the seclusion of most spots made for a more relaxing day. "The rope" was a popular spot since it had the rope to swing out on and plummet into the water below. "The slide" was also a highly favored area that could accommodate many people.

While I swam near the base of the rock that we hurled ourselves off of, my dog, which had been patiently waiting for me on the shore, abruptly came to attention and started growling and barking profusely in my

direction. My dad, also on the shore, instantly noted what was going on and yelled to inform me there was a copperhead coming to visit. He got the gun while I swam in the opposite direction so he had a clear shot. If my dog had not alerted us to the danger, the copperhead could have easily gotten close enough to strike without warning.

Not all of our trips to the creek were as eventful as that one, but they all had positive lasting memories.

What kind of memories are you making with your children?

Will they remember the time you spent with them or the images on a screen in front of them? They will remember.

\* Cell service is spotty across the Forest and if you get into trouble you may be on your own for a while before help can reach you. \* Enjoying the water? Wear a lifejacket. According to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, 85% of all boating-related fatalities were not wearing a life jacket. Life jackets save lives.

Williams said that, in West Virginia, economic growth is difficult because of a declining population, the state having lost 12% of its population since 1950 including 3% in the last 10 years. He said there are about 40,000 jobs unfilled in the state, and graduates of WVU are obtaining their PhDs then accepting jobs in other states. However, he said, recreation-based counties continue to attract new residents and higher incomes. Williams cites as an example that

many people with high paying jobs are relocating from Silicon Valley, California, to Utah because they want to have access to nearby outdoor recreation.

Williams said outdoor recreation activities account for \$887 billion nationwide, which is more than the fuel, automotive, healthcare and insurance industries generate. In West Virginia, outdoor recreation creates \$1.6 billion and 19,000 jobs, but only accounts for 2.7% of the state's employment, so according to Williams, there is nowhere to go but up for the WV outdoor recreation industries because West Virginia has the greatest density

of rivers and white water in the U.S.; the third most popular climbing areas in the Mid-Atlantic; and a growing number of trails.

He said to grow our outdoor economy, we need to promote our unique story in an honest, authentic way and celebrate our culture. If we do this, Williams said, "tourism is the red carpet to residency." In-other-words, just like the people moving to Utah from Silicon Valley, tourists will first visit here and many will end up moving here to be close to all the outdoor activities they love.

Luci Mosesso talked about the "Leave No Trace" program, which emphasizes

doing a better job protecting the outdoors.

Chelsea Faulkner talked about the nationwide marketing themes the CVB employs such as the Uncommon Trails; Uncommon Experiences; Uncommon Routes themes to promote tourism here.

Rose then introduced Brynn Kusic, the Operations Manager of the Pocahontas County Opera House, as the winner of the 2023 Tourism Person of the Year, citing her enthusiastic dedication to making the Opera House thrive, as well as her contributions to creating Discovery Junction.

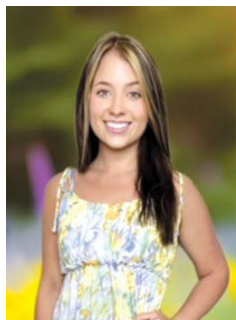

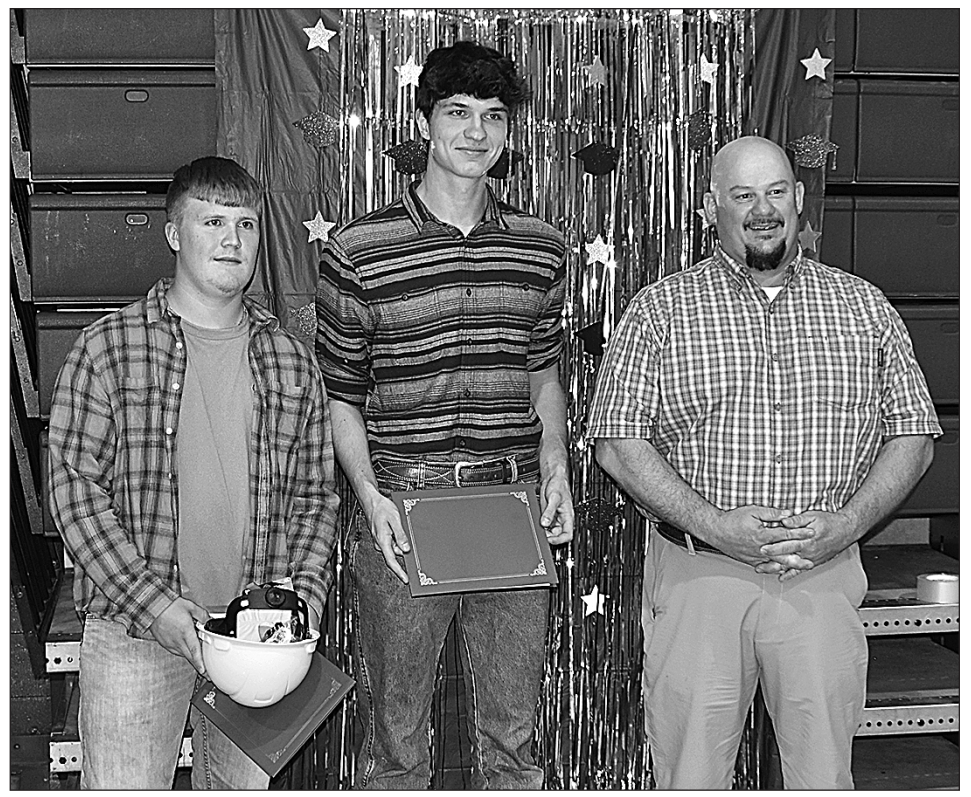



**THEY DROVE OL' SHANE AWAY**

AFTER sticking it out for almost a year in the big city, my cousin Shane has gone home to West Virginia. The only explanation he gave me was that if he stuck around any longer he'd yawn himself to death.

Typical case history. I've seen it happen to other free spirits like him. West Virginians don't like being minorities any better than anybody else.

City people, upon learning a man is from West Virginia, often reply: "West Virginian, huh? Then how come you're wearing shoes?"

The man may be dressed in the same flawless dinner jacket everybody else at the head table is wearing. He may be a professional man, perhaps the principal speaker. But, invariably, the tired wisecrack about the shoes.

Even worse are the city idiots who apparently didn't get any geography in school and don't know West Virginia has been a state in its own right more than 100 years. These people, meeting a man from the Mountain State reply: "West Virginia, you say? Why, I've got relatives in Roanoke."

This is as absurd as telling a man from Dallas: "A Texan, eh? That's a coincidence. I used to date a girl in Phoenix."

This is why many West Virginians identify their state as "West - By God - Virginia."

It is not pronounced as a blasphemy. It is spoken with the same reverence as "under God" in the Pledge of Allegiance. For what power, other than God, could create a state with coal enough to heat the world, oil enough to lubricate it, natural gas enough to illuminate it, and brains enough to run it?"

West Virginians are easy going people. You don't see any of them in the protest marches or the sit-down demonstrations. They don't do much talking, and no talking at all if they don't feel they can improve on the

silence.

So West Virginians accept quietly the patronizing questions city people ask, string them along, and let them believe whatever they want to.

As a result, city people form some weird opinions about West Virginians. Here are a few:

A honeymoon in West Virginia, consists of a man and his bride climbing into the old jalopy and riding until dark.

The average West Virginian lives so far back in the sticks that his third grade school teacher was a bear.

Money is so scarce in West Virginia that most people barter. A dressed hog is a \$5 bill, and they use chickens for change.

When you win at Bingo down there, they let you keep the corn, and sometimes people get married just to get the rice. In the hamlet taverns down there a man orders potato chips by telling the barmaid, "Gimmie a bag of them big, d—d corn-flakes."

Smug city people feel this way secretly, but cover it up with pseudo apologies for what they have.

"I guess we like the house well enough. We only paid \$70,000 for it but, what the heck, it's a place to sleep."

"It's only an \$8 bourbon - if you buy it in case lots - but in a mixed cocktail who can tell?"

This sort of downplay rangles a West Virginian, who regards periodic libations with respect, and treats it as the pleasant little interlude it

ought to be.

He triggers the situation with the good humor it deserves, by laying down his ax, ballpoint pen, slide rule or whatever tool he's working with, and announcing:

"This old tool tickles my hand, and I can't work when I'm laughing."

Then out comes the bourbon, not often in a decanter, but as often that way as in a jug, and the invitation to touch glasses.

The accepted response is, "Well, now, I don't care if I do."

SHANE, like all other West Virginians, hated "being missionaried."

A host apologized for not having any corn likker, and asked him to try a cocktail called the martini. He then explained how, and with what, martinis are made. Shane could have told the man: "Yep. That's the way I mixed martinis for a number of years at the Greenbrier in White Sulphur Springs."

But he didn't.

The capstone on Shane's disillusionment was some educated city character at a party, telling him: "Washington, D. C. is just 40 miles from here. That's the National Capital, you know."

That was the night before my ignorant old hillbilly cousin loaded his golf clubs and his 20 Hickey-Freeman suits and his custom-made English shoes into his private plane and headed back home to backward, undernourished, poverty stricken West-By God-Virginia.
