Beam resigns as Superintendent of Schools

Pocahontas County Schools Superintendent Terrence Beam shared a post May 25 on the district's Facebook page, saying he was resigning his position, effective June 30, 2023.

Beam's career in Pocahontas County began in 2009 when he was approached to fill in for two weeks as principal at Hillsboro Elementary School. The then retired Beam accepted the job and the rest, as they say, is history. Those two weeks turned into 14 years of service to the county's school system.

From principal at HES, Beam moved to the board of office first as director of federal projects and then, in 2015, as superintendent.

"A lot of times people ask me what was the best job I ever had and I've always said my best job was when I was principal at Panther Creek Elementary School in Nicholas County, but I'm not sure now," he said. "I think this was the best job I've ever had."

That job came with lots of trials, tribulations and achievements. The good – improvements to the five school buildings and moving the board office out of the floodplain; the bad – RIFs (Reduction in Force) and ex-

pulsions of students; and the ugly – the COVID-19 pandemic.

Through it all, Beam said the school system stayed strong and the staff excelled against all odds to help students learn, no matter the obstacle.

"We dealt with strikes," he said. "We dealt with COVID. We dealt with running levers and getting criticized, but if you look at the whole eight years, there have been a lot of things that have been good and have improved in our school system."

Beam is the first to say that it wasn't all because of him. The changes could not have been possible without the staff at the central office and at the schools. Along with Beam, the central office is also losing two directors – Ron Hall and Ruth Bland – who are both retiring.

"It's always dangerous to pick out particular people and thank them and brag on them, but I'm telling you, people have no idea the contributions that Mrs. Bland and Mr. Hall have given to this county," Beam said. "When Ron came, our buildings were falling apart. We couldn't get anything fixed. We couldn't get any money to get anything fixed, but he and I and [treasurer Sherry Radcliff] worked with the SBA [School Building Authority] to get MIP [Major

Improvement Project] awards, and we have put millions of dollars into our schools."

While much has been accomplished while Beam has been superintendent, he admits there are a few things that didn't come to fruition.

"I would say that failing to get a levy passed," he said. "I know that's a controversial issue and a lot of people are glad it didn't pass and that's fine. That's their opinion. It's not about not having enough money to run our school system, but it is about not having enough money to provide services to our schools that I wish we could like PRO officers. If we had a levy passed, we could provide PRO officers to our high school and middle schools and be able to fund it continuously. That's one thing that I regret."

"I wish we could build a brand new school," he added, "but we have been able to repair the ones we have and that's really what the people wanted. That's my job, is to do what the people and the board want me to do."

As far as his biggest accomplishment, Beam said he thinks he has helped the community trust the school system more and has personally earned the trust of many skeptics.

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State removes rural members of broadband council

In a stunning announcement at the very end of the May 25 Pocahontas County Broadband Council meeting, Mike Holstine said the legislature passed, and the Governor signed legislation that removed the two rural representatives from the State Broadband Council, and replaced them with two members who represent urban areas.

Holstine said that, although he was the current Vice-Chairman of that body, he was one of the two representatives removed from the State Broadband Council. He said this action by the state “came out of the blue,” and he is still trying to find out why rural representation was removed.

In other actions during this relatively short meeting, council members added a correction to the last meeting’s minutes. Because those minutes seemed to blame the delay with the ARC Broadband Project’s pole agreements on Mon Power, the council clarified those minutes to spread part

of the blame for the delays to the county.

Cory Nipper from T&L said that the addendum to that agreement has been approved by the County Commission, and the full agreement will be signed by the commissioners.

The agreement revisions with Frontier Communications over the use of its poles are still pending, according to Amanda Smarr of Region 4. She said they have received no feedback from Frontier about those revisions.

Nipper said the delays involving the pole agreements have delayed the projected timeline of the project, with construction now scheduled to begin in June of 2024, instead of the previous date of April 3, 2024.

Regarding applying for Community Connect grants, Brian Tew said Citynet has not yet provided areas in the county to apply for under that grant which are acceptable to them.

With the June 20 deadline for applying for Community Connect Grants fast approaching, Beezley said we appear to be at a standstill

with that grant.

Both Smarr and Holstine said, because the government has declared Frontier’s RDOF areas to be off limits to any other broadband projects using federal funds, potential areas of the county for broadband projects under the Community Connect grant are very limited. Any areas that remain available will likely bump into the Seneca Rocks Spruce Knob broadband areas, and the council has not yet had a conversation with that company about this.

The Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment Program (BEAD) broadband funding still depends on conducting the required public meetings. The first attempted public meeting on April 27 with “under-represented people” did not draw any public attendees.

Beezley said the council still needs to create a letter for the County Commission to send to the holders of RDOF areas in the county asking for those companies to provide progress reports about their broadband projects in their areas.

AG’s Statement on Supreme Court ruling on water and land

West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrisey issued the following statement following the U.S. Supreme Court Ruling on how far the federal government’s regulatory reach extends over rivers, lakes, streams, pools of water, wetlands and more.

Morrisey led a 26-state coalition in an amicus brief in support of the petitioners, Michael and Chantell Sackett in Sackett v. Environmental Protection Agency.

“We now have a clearer definition for Waters of the United States, and we’re pleased the Supreme Court ruled in a way that state lands and waters are less subject to the whims of unelected bureaucrats,” Morrisey said. “The EPA’s confused, convoluted and overbroad understanding of wetlands subject to its regulation would have been costly to property owners who would have spent years and tens or even hundreds of thousands of dollars just getting permission from the federal regulators to build on their own property.

“We are also happy to see the Court reject EPA’s request for deference to its misguided new ‘waters of the United States’ rule, which we have led a coalition in challenging. The Supreme Court has now agreed with what we successfully said there: EPA’s new rule is ‘inconsistent with the text and structure’ of the Clean Water Act.”

“Today is a big day for farmers, home-builders, contractors, property owners and those who care about economic activity not being subject to overreach by the federal government,” Morrisey added. “Next, we will continue our successful fight by taking

down the new Biden rulemaking.”

In Sackett, the Supreme Court embraced the “relatively permanent” test previously described in a plurality opinion from Justice Scalia: “In sum, we hold that the CWA (Clean Water Act) extends to only those ‘wetlands with continuous surface connection to bodies that are ‘waters of the United States’ in their own right,” so that they are “indistinguishable” from those waters.

Manchin Secures MVP in Debt Ceiling Agreement

U.S. Senator Joe Manchin III (D-WV), Chairman of the U.S Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee, released the following statement on his securing of the Mountain Valley Pipeline into the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023.

“Last summer, I introduced legislation to complete the Mountain Valley Pipeline. I am pleased Speaker McCarthy and his leadership team see the tremendous value in completing the MVP to increase

domestic energy production and drive down costs across America and especially in West Virginia. I am proud to have fought for this critical project and to have secured the bipartisan support necessary to get it across the finish line.”

Manchin and Capito announce \$10 million for Brownfields Clean Up

U.S. Senator Joe Manchin (D-WV), member of the Senate Appropriations Committee and Chairman of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee, and U.S. Senator Shelley Moore Capito (R-W.Va.), Ranking Member of the Senate Environment and Public Works (EPW) Committee, and member of the Senate Appropriations Committee, announced \$10 million from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Brownfields Program for 10 initiatives across West Virginia. The funding is made possible in large part through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and will support assessing and remediating contaminated sites back into productive use.

Included among those receiving awards was the Pocahontas County Commission: \$497,697 for former Howes Leather Company/ East Fork Industrial Park

Circuit Court

The following hearings were recently held in Pocahontas County Circuit Court before the Honorable Judges Robert E. Richardson and Jennifer P. Dent:

Erick Shawn Romanello, 43, of Marlinton, tendered a written plea agreement to the court wherein he will plead guilty to the felony offense of driving while license revoked for driving under the influence of alcohol, third offense, and adjudication will be deferred to allow the defendant to be placed on a two-year diversion agreement with normal terms and condition. If Romanello successfully completes the diversion period, he may withdraw the plea of guilty and the matter will be dismissed. Court costs are to be paid during the diversion period.

Amanda Long (Brewer), 42, of Hillsboro, has completed the drug court program. She remains on probation until 2025. Defense counsel tendered a motion for early release of probation at a later date.

Spencer Combs tendered a written plea agreement to the court wherein he

pleaded guilty to sexual assault, third degree. The agreement reflects that adjudication will be deferred and the defendant will be placed on a diversion period for one year with normal terms and conditions. If the diversion period is completed, Combs will be allowed to withdraw his plea and the matter will be dismissed. Court costs are to be paid during the diversion period.

David W. Mace, 37, of Marlinton, appeared by video from Tygart Valley Regional Jail for a status hearing. Defense counsel presented motions to sever charges and set the matter for trial. Mace was indicted on three counts, strangulation, two counts, wanton endangerment involving a firearm, a felony.

Christopher Michael Waybright, 38, of Arbovale, pleaded not guilty to one count grand larceny. He remains on previously posted bond.

Roy Myers, 48, of Durbin, defense counsel tendered a motion to withdraw as a conflict exists with the office of the public defender. The court appointed another attorney.

Roger W. Sills was sentenced to five years in the custody of the state penitentiary as to the felony offense of wanton endangerment involving a firearm, and one year in the regional jail for the misdemeanor offense of brandishing a deadly weapon. Sentence is suspended and Sills was placed on probation for one year.

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Do our dogs love us?
Conclusion

“Patricius, never again can thou give me a thousand kisses. Never canst thou be contentedly in my lap. In sadness have I buried thee, thou deservist.” ~ Ancient Roman epitaph for a beloved dog.

The evolutionary journey from wolf to domesticated dog was long and entailed many physical and physiological changes. By the end of the last ice age, some 12,000 years ago, dogs were in the company of humans. It would be some time before humans intentionally set out to domesticate another animal to serve them.

The next animals domesticated were goats and sheep, about 10,000 years ago. This period also marked the dawn of agriculture. Of the thousands of creatures domesticated by man since then, only 14 are mammals.

Many more animals and plants were destined for domestication, freeing up sapiens from a foraging lifestyle. Dogs would represent a valuable asset in the activities of farming.

Tame or domesticated; what's the difference?

Let's touch on the difference between tame and domesticated, as those terms are sometimes assumed to be the same thing – they are not.

When that big Harley passed you on your vacation last year, your whole family was amazed to see a raccoon riding on the shoulders of the operator. “Oh, how cute,” everyone exclaimed simultaneously.

That raccoon was likely adopted as a youngster. Somebody tamed this animal to be comfortable riding on the bike, but it is still not a

domesticated raccoon.

Domestication is something entirely different. According to Quizlet.com, domestication is a permanent genetic alteration of an animal species that leads to an inherent set of behavioral or physical traits helpful to humans.

The hog-riding raccoon was obtained early enough that a certain degree of taming is possible, yet it remains wild.

Enough already. You want to know what evidence supports the belief that our dogs love us; and unconditionally.

“What's Love Got to Do with It?” Tina Turner, a music legend, R.I.P.

In 1914, workers in Bonn, Germany, found a 14,000 year old grave containing the remains of a man and woman. Proof of affection for dogs by Paleolithic people was found in the tomb – the woman's hand was resting on a canine skeleton.

One of the obstacles in proving any form of animal emotion is that we rarely consider animal intelligence on its own terms.

Therefore, earlier research was conducted with a pre-existing confirmation bias. Wild animals couldn't possibly share some of the same emotions with the exalted human being, regardless of the degree of domestication, or so we thought.

For some humans, saying that animals feel what humans feel is a form of blasphemy.

After all, we sapiens continue to exert dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves upon the earth. And if we assumed that obligation, it appears we did a piss-poor job of it.

Even science once approached canine cognitive

research with extreme anthropocentric bias.

Two major modern studies have shattered the notion that dogs do not reciprocate the love we give them. The results demonstrate that the physiology of love for dogs and humans is indistinguishable.

Dr. Gregory Berns, a neuroscientist at Emory University, had lost many dogs, and he knew the grief that came with each loss. The adage, “When you buy a dog, you're buying a heartache,” holds true for most of us who adore our canine family members; they will likely die before us.

But we accept this eventuality because there really is no relationship quite like that between two of the oldest friends on Earth - human and dog. Phrases like “unconditional love” and “perfect companionability” come to mind.

Dr. Berns was interested in using Magnetic Resonance Imaging, M.R.I., to study the canine brain to determine if dogs experience love as humans do. His most significant concern, at this point, was how to get dogs to hold perfectly still during the entirety of the scan.

Dr. Berns built a mock M.R.I. in his basement to overcome this challenge. He got his terrier to comply with stillness after a three-month training period. The doctor now knew doing a successful fMRI scan on a dog was possible and recruited 90 other dogs for his study.

Bern's study was designed to determine dog preferences based on brain activity observed using an fMRI. Specifically, Dr. Bern wanted to know if dogs preferred praise from their caretakers over food.

By tracking the canine brain's reward centers, Dr. Bern found that most dogs “Respond equally to food and praise.”

About 20% of this group of dogs responded more strongly to praise than food. Bern concluded, “The vast majority of dogs love us at least as much as food.”

A 2015 study conducted in Japan further demonstrated the strong attachment of dogs to their caretakers, an attachment similar to that between a human mother and

her newborn.

How would they know this?

Good question: This experiment involved testing the subject's urine, both human and dog. Researchers collected urine before mother and baby gazed into each other's eyes, as well as that between dog and caretaker.

It is the eye contact that causes the brain to release oxytocin, such as that between an infant and mother. Oxytocin, the “love hormone,” is pivotal in maternal bonding, altruism and trust. Its traces can be detected in urine.

(The word owner carries a negative connotation for some, so caretaker is generally preferred in describing the relationship between human and dog. Owner is a word that should be reserved for one's material property only.)

An interesting side note on this study was that in addition to dogs, babies and mothers, the study also used some tame wolves. The oxytocin response was far greater in dogs than in wolves because wild animals do not generally make deep eye contact.

This discovery would explain the oxytocin response when a loved one comes into view, be it a dog or a human. The embrace of eyes further stimulates love. Scientists refer to this phenomenon as a positive feedback loop be-

tween mother and baby and dog and human.

Dogs, like humans, are great at making deep connections through eye contact.

Speaking of dogs!

Alexis Devine, of Tacoma, Washington, decided to try a canine study on her Sheepadoodle, Bunny.

Alexis admits she is not a trained researcher, just a curious woman with a dog. But her D.I.Y. research project caught the attention of real canine researchers when she began posting Bunny's extraordinary communicative abilities online.

Alexis wondered if there was a way that Bunny could let her know when she wanted to go out.

Dog Talk Buttons, designed initially as an alternative communication method for non-verbal people, were first selected to teach Bunny how to let Alexis know when she wanted to go out.

Each button has a word printed on it, such as Want, Out, Eat, Go, Walk, etc. When the button is depressed by the dog's paw or nose, a pre-recorded voice says the word for the benefit of the dog's caretaker.

And it grew from there, with many surprises along the way.

Author's Note: Not all dogs are interested in using the buttons. The same goes

for cats; some of our feline friends successfully use dog talk buttons.

For Bunny, a demonstrably intelligent dog, her learning curve wasn't that steep. She was soon increasing her vocabulary and using multiple words for short sentences.

According to a recent article, she is up to 92 words that she uses regularly.

Combining single words, Bunny can tell Alexis a wide range of desires and emotions. Examples: “Bunny-Friend,” “Now-Happy,” Mom-Love-You.”

One day Alexis saw Bunny looking into a mirror.

Now, we all know it is conventional wisdom that dogs don't recognize themselves in a mirror; and that is true. But Bunny's response was totally unexpected when she said, “Who-This?”


On another occasion, Bunny pressed the buttons “Help-Ouch.” Alexis asked her in spoken English, “Where, ouch?”

Bunny replied, “Paw.” And, indeed, when Alexis examined Bunny's paws, there was a foxtail burr lodged between her toes.

I'm not sure if Bunny said “Thank You,” but it wouldn't surprise me in the least.

So, readers, if you are still reluctant to accept that dogs

8 Tbsp. chilled, unsalted
butter, cut into 1/2 inch
pieces
1 lg. egg, lightly beaten
1/2 cup plus 1 Tbsp. half
& half or milk
1 lg. egg white, lightly
beaten
2 Tbsp. sugar
Adjust oven rack to lower-
middle position. Heat oven
to 425 degrees.
Mix flour, baking powder,
salt and sugar in bowl of
food processor.
Toss butter over flour mix-
ture, tossing to coat butter
with flour mix. Cut butter
into mix with five 1-second
pulses. Continue cutting in
butter with 1-second pulses
until flour is pale yellow and
resembles coarse cornmeal.
Butter bits should be no
larger than small peas.
Turn mixture into medium
bowl.
Mix beaten egg with half
& half or milk and pour into
flour mixture. Combine
with large rubber spatula
until large clumps form.
Turn mixture onto a floured
work surface and knead
lightly until it comes to-
gether. Pat dough lightly into
9" x 6" rectangle about 3/4
inch thick, being careful not
to overwork dough. Flour a
2 1/2-inch biscuit cutter; cut
out 6 rounds.
Place on baking sheet 1-
inch apart. Brush with egg
white and sprinkle with
sugar.
Bake 12-14 minutes until
golden brown. Place on

cooling rack and let cool 10
minutes.

Split biscuits in half. To
serve, spoon 1/6 of fruit over
bottom, then top with
whipped cream and biscuit
top.

Whipped Cream

1 cup chilled whipping
cream
1 Tbsp. sugar
1 tsp. vanilla extract
Chill a 1 1/2 quart bowl
and beaters for handheld
mixer in freezer for at least
20 minutes.

Add all ingredients to
chilled bowl.

Beat on low speed until
small bubbles form, about
30 seconds. Increase speed
to high and continue beating
until cream is smooth, thick,
and nearly double in volume
- about 20 to 30 seconds.

Be careful not to overbeat
or you will have sweet but-
ter.

I do hope you will choose
to make whipping cream or
at least use a canned dairy
product.

Resist using the one that is
nothing but chemicals.

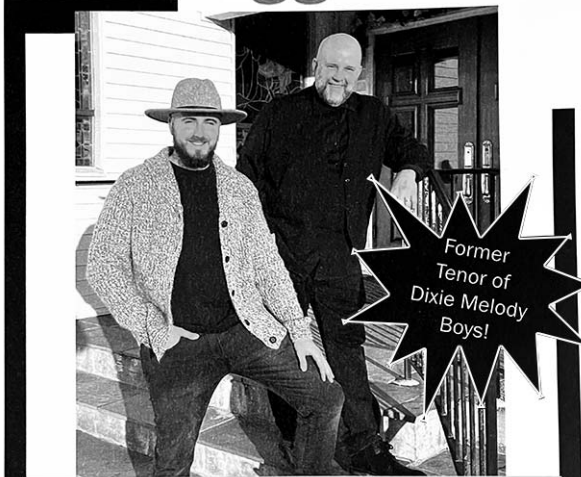

“We especially remember with love and appreciation those friends and loved ones who have passed on during the last year and have been interred in the Arbovale Cemetery,” he added.

As he discussed the history of Memorial Day and the many ways it is celebrated across the country, Gett mentioned Grafton, which has had a Memorial Day parade since 1868. He asked Dunmore resident JoAnn Fromhart to share her memories of the parade.

Fromhart remembers that all school children were part of the parade, with the girls carrying bouquets of flowers and the boys carrying American Flags. They paraded to the National Cemetery in Grafton where they placed the flowers and flags on the 1,000 graves.

Memorial Day was founded as a way to honor fallen soldiers and was first observed in 1868 when it was known as Decoration Day. Although it has grown to be a day to remember all lost loved ones, it is more a time to reflect on all the men and women who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Gett himself joined the U.S. Army in January 1970, just ahead of the draft.

“You see, I overslept and

missed a draft physical exam,” he said. “They move you right to the top of the draft list for doing that. To make a long story a little shorter, when I went to be inducted, they pulled me aside and offered me an ‘opportunity.’ They wanted me to join some ‘hush-hush’ outfit. There would be special training and other good things, but I’d have to sign up for two more years of service. And, oh by the way, I wouldn’t go to Vietnam. I volunteered.”

The “hush-hush” outfit turned out to be the ASA – Army Security Agency. It was the Army’s part of the National Security Agency, better known as the NSA.

“You see, the NSA is under the Department of Defense,” Gett explained. “It’s military. It’s mostly civilian employees, but it’s military. And it’s not like you see on TV. No black suits, guns and covert, clandestine spy stuff. Well, not much anyway. It’s mostly geeks, or nerds, or whatever. They get to play with – ‘operate’ – the far-out, fancy, classified electronics and computers.

“They call us Spooks and we kind of think that’s cool,” he added.

Gett was sent to Electronic Warfare and Electronic Intelligence Schools. After that was complete, everyone was sent to field stations in places like Turkey, Ethiopia, Thailand,

Australia and in the United States in places like Vint Hill Farms, Virginia; Two Rock Ranch, California; and even Sugar Grove, West Virginia.

Gett was sent to Shemya, Alaska.

“It’s the next to the last island out in the Aleutian chain off of Alaska,” he said. “Almost to Russia. The island is two miles by four miles, and flat. You could stand outside and see water on all sides around you.”

Fifteen hundred men lived on the island, 150 of whom were Army personnel. The rest were Air Force. Gett said they were told there were women behind every tree. Unfortunately, there were no trees on Shemya.

Everything Gett worked on during his time at Shemya was classified. That is, until January of this year. There is a federal regulation that states all classified items become unclassified after 50 years.

“Well, almost everything,” he said, laughing.

“We had worldwide touchtone long distance phones – secure phones with end-to-end encryption for classified conversations,” he continued.

“Real-time worldwide secure communications by voice, teletype and other ways, as well.”

When asked what he did at Shemya, Gett said he would tell people, “oh, we played cards and listened to

the radio” which he says was not far from the truth.

“The work I was involved in was all highly-classified at the time and was part of a project codenamed AN-DERS,” he said. “It was a joint Army and Air Force facility that operated a one-of-a-kind ground-based telemetry data collection system codenamed HARDBALL.”

According to a now unclassified book from the NSA library, Gett said HARDBALL was used to collect data from Soviet intercontinental ballistic missiles (ICBMs) that impacted in the Soviet Kamchatka peninsula test range impact area, as well as collect data from Soviet military satellites that sent data to Soviet telemetry receiving locations in the far eastern land area of the Soviet Union.

“We coordinated with other facilities worldwide in real-time 24/7 through the Defense Special Missile and Astronautics Center located in NSAs headquarters at Ft. Mead, Maryland,” Gett said. “In God We Trust, all the others, we monitor.”

Reflecting on his time with the ASA, Gett said the Army found the right place to utilize his skills during his service time.

“All things considered, I guess the Army truly did know what they were doing when they sent me to the Army Security Agency instead of Vietnam,” he said. “I wouldn’t have been of

any real use to them in Vietnam and probably would have done something dumb and gotten shot. But, putting me in that outfit, with that training, gave me the opportunity to be of real service to my country during the Cold War. I’m grateful to have had the chance to do that.”

Technology has changed a lot since then and Gett continued his “nerd” ways by being a computer technician with his daughter-in-law Christine Rebinski and their business Computers-R-Us. Although he has left the business now to be fully retired, he continues to use technology on a regular basis.

“I teach a Sunday School class – adult Bible study – on Sunday mornings over Zoom on the Internet,” he said. “Class members join in live video conferencing from several states – from Ohio to Florida, and states in between. We have a great time. It’s a direct result of the COVID-19 pandemic, which created the need. The Internet and Zoom are the tools. We’ve been meeting for more than three years now and will continue for who knows how long.

“The world is very different now,” he added.

Memorial Day is a day to remember the past, but it’s also important to be cognizant of the present and those who are continuing the fight for freedom around the world.

The mission continues,” Gett said. “Men and women in our armed forces around the world continue to serve diligently to protect our freedom. And so, friends, let us remember, as a grateful nation, and show our appreciation for the honorable and faithful service of those who have died while serving in our armed forces, as well as all those who have served in the armed forces and are no longer with us.

The Memorial Day service also included special music by Jim Anderton and Carolyn Sheets, as well as a presentation of memorial flowers for those who have been interred at Arbovale Cemetery since Memorial Day 2022.

Those remembered were: Amy Copen, Wallace Simmons, William Gowan, Audrea Gown, Juanita Filuta, Jessie Lambert, Irene Small, Robert Burner, Zona Hoover, Wayne Sheets, Richard “Dick” Brockway, Nell “Dee” Gett, Deborah Oberle, William Oberle, Danny Lambert, Norine Simmons, Betty Oxier, Betty Woodrum, Dorothy Coleman, Karen Varner, Brenda Gragg, Charles Taylor, Sylvia Thompson and Kathryn Hedrick.

“I feel like the majority of the community has been supportive of me,” he said. “You always have a few that you can’t please no matter what you do and that’s okay. That’s part of the job. It’s been interesting. I’ve had some real contentious relationships with people that we’ve now come around to where we’re friends.

“The board members I worked for, my goodness,” he continued. “They have supported me so well and going along with some of my crazy ideas. I couldn’t have done the job the way I’ve done it without their support. I just thank everybody. I appreciate the citizens of Pocahontas and how they’ve treated me.”

Beam was also able to make a special bond with the students, first as a principal and then as a superintendent.

“I’ve had kids call me and say, ‘Mr. Beam, can I ask you a question?’” he said. “You don’t hear that too often. I’ve had kids at the high school ‘friend’ me on Facebook. Of course, I’ve not accepted those friends. I will after I leave here, but it wasn’t the proper thing for me to do when I was working here.”

Beam’s favorite part of his job was visiting the classrooms – he spent time in every single classroom each year – seeing the students learn, work together and be silly.

“The kids – I love the kids. About five percent of them are knuckle heads, just like five percent of the adults are, too,” he said, laughing. “The kids are so respectful. I go in

their classrooms and they’re always nice to me and they’d say, ‘come over here and be in our little group.’ That’s cool. For an old man like me, for kids to accept me and say we know you. It’s the little things that make the difference.

“I’m in the schools all the time and the kids know me by name,” he continued. “It’s not that I need face recognition. It’s just that they need to know their superintendent cares about their education and can come to their class and spend twenty minutes. That’s been the most enjoyable part of my job - watching them learn or cutting up or whatever they’re doing – just seeing them grow.”

That commitment stays fresh in the students’ minds and when Beam is on stage at graduation, those students will remind him of special moments from the past that have stuck with them.

At last year’s graduation, Summer Hall, who had Beam as a principal when she was in kindergarten, remembered a special bond they had.

“When I saw her on graduation day, I said, ‘do you remember a special thing we have in common?’ and she said, ‘we have the same birthday,’” Beam said. “Just those little connections with kids is why I do this job.”

Even when Beam had to discipline the students, he said they always approached the situation with respect.

“They never fail to amaze

you,” he said of the students. “They disappoint you sometimes. I’ve had a lot of them that have had to come in and I’ve had to expel, but none of them have been disrespectful. They’ve understood and they’ve apologized for acting the way they’ve acted.

“I don’t agree with everything that they do,” he continued. “When they do some dumb stuff, I tell them that’s what it is, but you don’t throw them out. You try to repair them, and I’ve had to expel some students that I could have kept out for an entire year, but they were salvageable, and they had learned their lesson. They weren’t a danger to anybody, they just made dumb decisions.

“If you leave them out of school, who knows what’s going to happen then. They may never come back to school.”

The decision to leave Pocahontas County was a tough one for Beam, but he said that when an opportunity is dropped in your lap, you have to take it.

“I’m not retiring,” he said. “I’m resigning. I have a new challenge ahead.”

The Pocahontas County Board of Education also has a new challenge ahead. On Tuesday, the board will accept Beam’s resignation and then it will decide whether it will appoint a new superintendent or post the position for applications.

Whatever the board decides, Beam said he hopes

they find someone with the same goals that he had during his eight years as superintendent.

“I hope that they find somebody who cares about kids as much as I do and is willing to stand up for what is right – maybe not what is politically correct – but what is right and maintains a connection with our kids,” he said. “Kids need adults in their life that, hopefully, are good examples.

“I’m hoping the next superintendent that they find is somebody who lives here, knows about the area or has the same values as the people of Pocahontas County. It’s a conservative county. I’m a conservative person. I don’t get into the politics of it, but my beliefs are very close to those of most of the people in Pocahontas County. I think that’s what has made it a smooth ride so far, too.”

Although his new job will take him out of Pocahontas County, Beam says he won’t be a stranger.

“It’s a new chapter,” he said. “I’m going to come back. I’m going to stop and

see people. There’s no way that I could not. We made real genuine connections. We’ve been through a lot in this county with all the different issues. We did what the people wanted, and I think that’s what I and the board members are charged

to do.

“We represent the community,” he continued. “We have our own ideas about certain things, but overall, you’ve got to look after your community. If you don’t, then you’re not doing your job.”

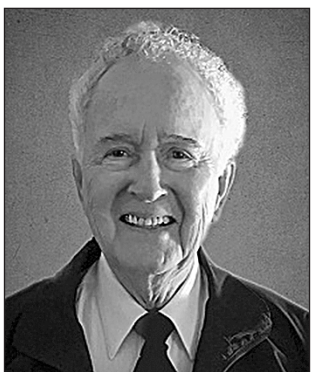
Columbus, Ohio; sister, Dorothy Lane, of Winston-Salem, North Carolina; several nieces and nephews; and many loving friends.

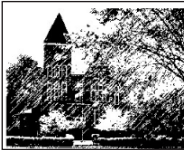

PFC Oren Richard Moore - KIA 1952 ‘Lest We Forget’



OREN RICHARD MOORE was born in Huntersville, Pocahontas County, West Virginia, on March 29, 1930, the son of Charles King Moore and Icie Gladys (nee Harvey) Moore Fertig.

In 1951, Oren entered the United States Marine Corps, and attained the Rank of Private First Class. He was serving with Company C, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines, 1st Marine Division in Korea.

On 06 October 1952, PFC Oren Richard Moore was Killed In Action by Gunshot or Small Arms Fire, in the BATTLE ZONE: WESTERN OUTPOSTS TOWN OR AREA: CHANGMOK-TONG HILL OR OUTPOST: THE HOOK.

PFC Oren Richard Moore’s body was returned to the U.S. and he was buried with Military Honors at Mountain View Cemetery, in Pocahontas County, West Virginia.

PFC Oren Richard Moore was awarded the Purple Heart, the Combat Action Ribbon, the Korean Service Medal, the United Nations Service Medal, the National Defense Service Medal and the Korean War Service Medal. (Information from Find A Grave, Photo from Preserving Pocahontas Archives ; ID: PHP001062)

Footsteps through History

Thursday, June 3, 1878

A correspondent of the Wheeling Register, May 18th, speaks of an interview with Isaac Smith, a Wetzel County citizen, who has reached the ripe age of 110 years, having been born in Pocahontas County in 1788. He was in the War of 1812 and the Mexican War, but says if his services are needed he is willing to report for duty in the pending war.

The one hundred and twenty-second session at Hampden Sydney College, Prince Edward County, Virginia ends June 15, 1898. Hence, the first session must have closed in June 1776...

One hundred and twenty-eight students are enrolled in the current session... There are two students from Pocahontas, Messrs. J. A. Sydenstricker and J. S. Kennison; with twelve others from West Virginia. The names of the students represent many of the choicest people in the two Virginias.

Even the proprietors of The Pocahontas Times have suffered by the advance of paper. This is due to three causes: the formation of a paper trust; more paper is consumed, there being more papers sold; and sulphur has been made a contraband of war. Sulphuric acid is a prime factor in the reducing of forest trees to pulp. Sul-

phur comes mainly from Sicily. It being a contraband of war has too many risks to run in passing through the Straits of Gibraltar. There are sulphur mines in Louisiana and Nevada, but it takes a larger sum to produce it from American mines.

Renick’s Valley is a peculiar town. It has three houses, all stores, and what is most peculiar is that each store seems to be a larger establishment than the one that used to be kept there. Falling Spring, the next place, has four stores, and claims to sell more goods than Lewisburg. The same set of fossils ornament the store porches. When passing to find these landmarks, if in the morning, look on a porch on the east of the road; in the evening, look to the west. They seek the shade, but are not what is generally known as shady characters.

We must not fail to give the latest intelligence from J.

W. Schisler, the keeper of one of the best wayside inns. He labors at a disadvantage of living at the top of Droop, as the air at that elevation makes a man ravenous. Schisler’s menu is all right in quantity and quality, and he is a public benefactor, as is every man who keeps a good hotel. He talks on all subjects from farming to philosophy. He has a famous raspberry patch; shows you the twin heifers, twenty-two months old, each of which has a fine bull calf, and his fish pond which has thousands of carp, some of which would weigh eight pounds.

Harvey Francisco has erected a Memorial Chapel in honor of his venerated grandfather, C. L. Francisco, late of the Warm Springs. It is about three miles west of Warm Springs on the Huntersville road. It was to have been dedicated last Sabbath, May 29.

Mrs. Minerva Beard, of Huntersville, is ill. Her son, Dr. Harry Beard, of Lewisburg, received a telegram Sunday evening about dark and rode to Huntersville that night.

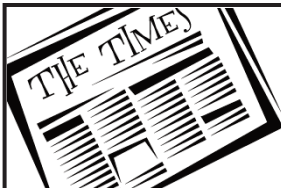

FATAL SHOOTING

Boyd Luther Gainer, aged 21, of Kerens, died in an Elkins hospital last Wednesday morning from gunshot wounds. Carl Teter, aged 45 years, of Dry Fork, is in the Pocahontas County jail on a charge of murder. The shooting occurred on Tuesday night at Spruce, in the assistant train master’s office. Both men were employed by the Western Maryland Railway Company.

State Police officers said Teter was drinking and was still under the influence of intoxicants when he gave himself up. They could ascribe no motive for the killing.

FIELD NOTES

Boude Beverage, of Dry Creek, was in town Wednesday to report a kill of five foxes the past fur season – two reds and three grays. He filled three other reds full of shot. These retired to rock dens and ceased from troubling about the farm.

Mr. Beverage was over in the Black Forest last week to get his daily limit of trout.

He camped on Black Mountain Run, sheltering of nights in a pine bough lean-to in proper pioneer style. On an old logging road grade in a grassy spot he came upon a grouse mother with fifteen or more chicks. The little ones hid the best they could. The hen crippled around to lure him away from her little ones. Mr. Beverage was not taking any chances of stepping on a single little grouse so he took the best way out of there. This was following the hen until she took wing.

Mr. Beverage has the habit of hooking big brown trout out of beaver dams, so when he came to a nice big pond, he began to look around for a likely place to drop a hook. Just then a beaver as large as a good sized shepherd dog came swimming toward him. It came within fifteen feet of the man, and then swam up and down, as if patrolling. Sticks and stones chunked at it did not phase it one bit until a stone bit it on

the back. Then the beaver did slap the water with its tail and dived, only to come up immediately and continue to swim up and down. Mr. Beverage figured the beaver had young in the big lodge in the pond, and it was not any too particular about company that day.

On last Thursday, Oscar and Austin Sharp got another hurry call from M. P. Vandevender, of Big Spring Fork of Elk River, to come immediately with their bear dogs – a bear had killed and eaten sheep on his Middle Mountain farm. They went over; got the bear up and going. After a long chase, the bear took to a tree on Slaty Fork. A grandson of L. D. Sharp got to the bear first, and shot him down. Grandpa Sharp was coming strong, but the boy out traveled him. This was a medium sized bear. This was Oscar’s tenth bear hunt this season, and seventh bear.

Since the above was written and put in type the word comes this bear was shot and killed by young Ivan Sharp and young Henry Gibson, each aged about 12 years. They shot at the same time and both hit.

100-Years-Ago in The Pocahontas Times

Received of C. M. Elliott, of the Huntersville district, fourteen pieces of wampum on the 26th day of May, 1923.

This is the first Indian money that I know of being found in Pocahontas County.

The other day when Mr. Elliott was in town, he said that they had been picking up shells with holes through the center and stringing them together, and I said wampum right off the bat. When he went home, he sent some samples in an envelope and they were clearly identified by illustrations and descriptions in the books...

When the white people first discovered America, Indians were important people. They deteriorated later on account of imported vices and diseases. They had an established monetary system and it was a pretty sound medium of exchange. It was made from sea shells and the system was in force from the Atlantic to the Pacific. In this part of the country, the money was sometimes called roanoke from which the city of Roanoke gets its name. Another name was peak. And I am pretty sure

that the samples Mr. Elliott sent me the other day are peak for that is the kind of wampum that was made from conch shells and this has all the appearance of conch shell material. Roanoke was from cockle shells...

Councilman T. D. Moore of the cemetery committee, is carrying out a systematic plan to beautify Mt. View Cemetery by planting evergreens. Scores of Norway spruce and arborvitae have been set out. That public spirited citizen Harvey Cromer, of Cheat Bridge, is sending down a wagon load of balsam, or, as locally known as blister pines, from Cheat Mountain. Good old Joe Buzzard will furnish a lot of fine young cedars. The

advice of Mr. Frank S. Labar, expert nursery man and landscape gardener, has also been most kindly available. It does seem that when a body attempts to do a thing that the right kind of people just naturally spring up to give assistance.

Mrs. William Shearer met with a serious accident Friday at her home on Red Lick Mountain, by the explosion of a dynamite cap. Her right hand was mangled, losing four fingers, and also painful wounds about the face and body.

Not knowing the powerful nature of the explosive, she applied a lighted match to the cap with disastrous results.

It is reported that the contractors on the Price Hill road below Marlinton have already moved more yardage than was estimated on the contract. If this is correct it

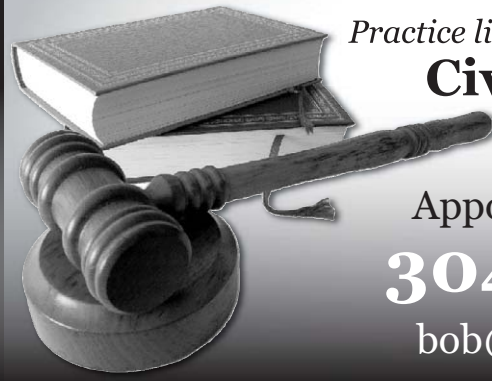

Lamb’s Ear ~ A homegrown bandage

Considering the fact that I love being outside, and I am a super penny pincher, I often handle minor wounds differently than many people I know; sometimes, even worse injuries, as well. Why spend money on bandages when they’re not needed? Just grow them.

When my boys were young and inevitably received scrapes, cuts, etc., as children do, they rarely ran to me during the summer to ask for a bandage. If it was in season, they used the opportunity to pick some Lamb’s Ear from the garden. They thought the velvety soft leaves were fun to touch and play with and super cool when used an instant bandage.

About

Lamb’s Ear, *Stachys byzantine*, is a perennial herb native to Turkey, Armenia and Iran, but is cultivated throughout the world. Some of its other names include: Lamb’s Wool, Silver Carpet, Donkey’s Ear, Jesus Flannel, Woolly Betony, Wood Betony, Big Ears, Lamb’s Tongue and Woolly Hedgenettle.

Lamb’s Ear is of the mint family. It grows to 12 to 18 inches tall in hardy zones 4-8. It usually produces tall purple flower heads that bloom from May through July, and it flaunts grayish-green oblong leaves which are covered in velvety silvery fuzz. When crushed, the leaves may have an apple-like or fruity smell. Lamb’s Ear effortlessly spreads by roots, or by crawling, creating a dense mat along the ground; it also spreads by seed distribution. Preferring full sun and dry to medium soil, Lamb’s Ear grows well

in poor soil conditions.

Lamb’s Ear pairs nicely with rose gardens and works well for borders and rock gardens as it is a ground cover that attracts bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. It may become invasive in some areas.

Cultivating

Start seeds indoors 8-to-10 weeks before the last frost date but be patient as it may take a month to germinate. Procreating from a cutting or split from a parent plant is an easy way to start some in a new location. Lamb’s Ear is drought tolerant, preferring drier soil, and tolerant to many animals such as deer and rabbits. Planting in moist soil may cause the development of diseases or root rot so good drainage is important for healthy plants. Cut Lamb’s Ear back in the fall to prevent the leaves from rotting.

Historical uses

The use of Lamb’s Ear for bandages dates back to the medieval times, and is commonly referred to during the American Civil War. The soft fuzzy leaves sop up blood and causes clotting which slows bleeding. Sometimes used as a dressing by itself, Lamb’s Ear was also used to hold other herbs and poultices on a wound.

In the West Indies, the leaves have been used in cooking and as a tea, which tastes similar to chamomile.

This plant is widely consumed as aromatic teas in Europe and Asia.

Medical reports

One study stated, “Various *Stachys* species (especially *St. byzantina* and *St. persica*) are valuable sources of natural compounds with important biological properties.”

In another study, on the decoction of *Stachys* species,

done by ScienceDirect, said, “Therapeutic enzymes inhibition experiments showed moderate anti-cholinesterase... and strong anti-tyrosinase... properties for *Stachys* herbal teas.”

“Cholinesterase inhibitors...” according to the National Library of Medicine, NBK544336, “... are a group of drugs that block the normal breakdown of acetylcholine ... Most commonly, their use is in treating neurodegenerative diseases such as Alzheimer disease, Parkinson disease and Lewy body dementia ... as well as frequent use in patients with myasthenia gravis...”

Constituents and actions

Lamb’s Ear is antiseptic, antimicrobial, astringent, anticancer, antispasmodic, sedative and diuretic. It contains the alkaloids, stachydrone, trigonelline and betonicine, which are antibacterial, antimitotic, anti-inflammatory, analgesic (pain relief), local anesthetic, hypnotic, psychotropic, has antitumor activity and many others.

Uses

Externally, Lamb’s Ear is used as a bandage, for bruises, wounds, neuralgia and other nerve pains, muscle cramps, skin or mouth wash, canker sores, to line footwear – and for toilet paper.

Internally this plant is used for hypertension, dropsy, asthma, dysentery, diarrhea, Dyspepsia, bladder stones, kidney stone, headache, gout, nephrosis, neuralgia and other nerve pains, muscle cramps and sore throat.

It is best to harvest Lamb’s Ear in the summer as it begins to flower. To make an infusion, pour one cup of boiling water over 1 tsp. dried aerial parts and allow it to steep for 10-to-15 min-

utes. You can drink this three times per day. Alternatively, a tincture of 1-2 ml, three times per day can be used. For more severe issues and headaches, a doubled strength dose (2 tsp. dried or 2-4 ml tincture) can be used.

Take home

- Lamb’s ear is edible with a fruity taste similar to a combination of apples and pineapples. Can be used in salads or made into infusions/ teas.
- Velvety soft renewable and compostable resource for bandages
- Has a long list of uses both externally and internally
- Easily grown multipurpose plant
- A low maintenance pleasant ground cover with purplish-pink blooms

- Fun to handle and good for kids’ gardens
- Toilet paper that can be harvested in your back yard – septic tanks may not like it, though.
