Vaccinated Ages 16-35 Can Receive \$100 Awards

During a briefing last week, Gov. Jim Justice announced that online registration is now open for his "Beat 588 . . . Bad," West Virginia Strong Vaccine Incentive Program.

All West Virginians ages 16-35, who have been Royal, Va.; three sons, Kenny Summers of Burnsville fully vaccinated against COVID-19, are now able to register online to receive either a \$100 savings bond or a \$100 gift card at appengine.egov.com/apps/wv/ technology/vip.

The \$100 incentive is retroactive, meaning all She was preceded in death by her husband, Oras West Virginians ages 16-35 who have received the COVID-19 vaccine at any point are eligible.

> "Please go and register for your \$100," said Justice. "We really appreciate you getting vaccinated. Not only are you picking up a few extra bucks here, but you may very well have saved your life or saved

> "We're going to continue with this program," Gov. Justice continued. "We want all 16-35-year-olds to get vaccinated as soon as possible."

Justice has announced that all senior centers across the state are ready to re-open fully.

The governor said that the W.Va. Bureau of Senior Services would be issuing safety guidelines. [According to Calhoun County Committee on

This Week In History

1921, 100 years ago

Mr. and Mrs. Carl Garretson of Creston were visitors in Grantsville the latter part of last week.

Captain Brooke Dodson of Spencer was here for a day or two the latter part of the week visiting with his sister, Mrs. Lorentz Hamilton.

Oral C. Hathaway, Russell Hathaway, Ralph Morris and Richard Marshall went to Parkersburg on Monday to see the picture, "Way Down East." They report a fine time and a big show.

C.C. Starcher, a prominent citizen of Altizer, was here on Saturday on a business mission. He was accompanied by his son, Clarence, who has grown up into a great big man, since moving away from here a few years ago.

A movement is afoot in Grantsville to arrange an agreement between the various stores, banks and other business places, by which everything in town will be closed up after 8 p.m. It is a movement in which everyone should join, and which would benefit us all and the town greatly. It would give the merchants, bankers and their employees time for recreation and pleasure, and after a little while, it would not cut down sales to any appreciable extent.

A large number of Pine Creek people were attracted here on Monday to attend a little lawsuit that failed to materialize. Rufus Jarvis and Leonard Nichols had an argument, which finally turned into fisticuffs, and it appears that Rufus got the worst end of the bargain. A warrant was issued for Nichols and the trial set for Monday. Just about the time that the stage was properly set and the curtain ready to go up, the prosecution decided not to push the case against Nichols, and Jarvis paid the costs, and the affair was ended.

1946, 75 years ago

Clyde Boggs, S1/C CMS, is stationed at Bikini Atoll with the 53rd construction battalion. He will participate in the atomic bomb test that is scheduled to take place this summer. Clyde has been in the Seabees 13 months and expects his discharge as soon as the atomic bomb test is over.

1971, 50 years ago

A fitting story of strife was found in "The Center Magazine," by Carl Weisacker, a German philosopher

There were three frogs that fell into a can of milk. The first frog, an optimist, said, "I'll get out somehow," but he didn't, and he drowned. The second, a pessimist said, "I can't do anything." He also drowned. The third frog was what I would call a realist, who didn't know what to do about it. It was butter, and the frog was able to jump out of the milk can. So, it is not a question of being optimistic or pessimistic, but of going ahead with work one feels might be useful.

CURIOSITY CORNER

by Dr. Jerry D. Wilson, Emeritus Professor of Physics, Lander University



Question: Can you use laundry detergent in the dishwasher? (Asked by a curious college student.)

Reply: You can, but it's not advisable. The detergents in the products might be similar, but laundry detergent usually contains brighteners, stain removers, fragrances, and so on. You could be exposing your dishes to harsh chemicals that you don't want on your dishes that might not rinse off. Also, some of the additives might be volatile and produce something that you wouldn't want to breathe in.

On top of this, you might void the warranty on your dishwasher, if you use a product not made for dish cleaning.

In researching this question, I came across an interesting side light: the invention of the dishwasher! A wooden machine with a hand-turned wheel that splashed water on dishes was patented in 1850. It wasn't very efficient, though. The first practical machine was developed by Josephine Cochran in 1886. It was a hand-operated mechanical dishwasher, but it did the job. The machine was unveiled at the 1893 World's Fair, but only got notice from large restaurants.

It wasn't until the 1950s that the dishwasher caught on for home use. Cochran founded a company to manufacture home dishwashers, which eventually became KitchenAid.

Question: I read somewhere that if the entire population of China (1.3 billion people) jumped all at once, it would disrupt the earth. Is this true? (Asked by a jumpy reader.)

Reply: This is an old one, but don't worry! Not leader Bill Blizzard was was illegal in every state, much would happen. The earth is too massive to be displaced. To make it more interesting, physicists have calculated what would happen if all the people on Earth jumped at once in one location. (That'd have to be a pretty big location, but you can calculate anything theoretically.)

There are about seven billion people on Earth, which would be a total weight of approximately 800 billion pounds, using a weight of 115 pounds per person (kids counteracting adults). Then, let's say the average jump is one foot and everyone jumped at exactly the same time.

Keep in mind, there is a law of physics known as the conservation of linear momentum. That is, the momentum (mv, mass times velocity) of a system is conserved in the absence of an external force. The jumping is an internal force to the Earth-people system, so momentum is conserved and on jumping, the people have momentum in one direction and the earth would get momentum in the other direction. They have to cancel out to be conserved. The people would move one foot up and it is calculated that the Earth would move a finite, but very short distance . . . less than the radius of a single hydrogen atom.

After traveling their respective distances, gravity would bring them back together and all would be as it was . . . very crowded.



My Dear Mother,

The weather has been excessively warm for some time back, too warm to travel. We did not believe that G. would go on to F. Creek although he said that he would. If Perry had been at home he would have put a carriage by him for you.

I wish you was here. How were you all pleased with George this time? I suppose he took you quite by surprise. Floydie was very proud of the sweet cake you sent him. He divided it with Warrie & Sissie & then said "pa, let me take a piece up stairs to baby³"

Floyd & the children think a great deal of their baby brother which came to our town last Tuesday of Wright Cemetery held 1965 continues to make morning about a quarter past three. This is the fourth day of L.'s confinement & I think she is quite smart, & her third son is quite a promising fellow, although a little smaller than any of her baby's.




