Question: Can you use laundry detergent in the

Reply. This is an old one, but don't worry! Not much would happen. The earth is too massive to be calculated what would happen if all the people on Earth jumped at once in one location. (That'd have to be a pretty big location, but you can calculate anything theoretically.)

There are about seven billion people on Earth, which would be a total weight of approximately 800 billion pounds, using a weight of 115 pounds per person (kids counteracting adults). Then, let's say the average jump is one foot and everyone jumped at exactly the same time.

In addition to increases in first class rates, second and third class also went up M ay 16. Such increases for those classes are to be phased in over a five-year
period, or 10 years for non-profit organizations, provided Congress appropriates the necessary funds to ease the transition to full rates.

No changes are made in the rates for parcel post, which is the principal component of fourth class mail Initial increases will be made in the "book rate," which is classified as fourth class. Also upped are special mail.
