



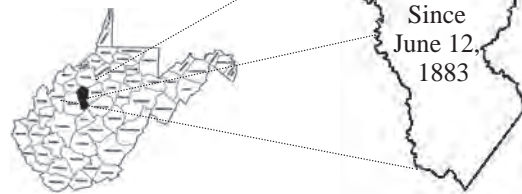

97th Commencement Includes 59 Graduates

The Calhoun County High School Class of 2021 commencement ceremony will include 59 graduates on Friday at 7 p.m. on the football field.

In an email on Monday afternoon, CM/HS principal Anita Stephenson released the names of the graduates (see Page 7) and reported that the

honor graduates will be announced at a later date.

At presstime on Tuesday, the 97th commencement program had not been received.

This year's 59 members is a decrease of 26 from 2020's 86 graduates. Other recent classes included: 2019, 76; 2018, 80; and 2017, 60.

Queen Flora Pageants, Tuesday 2021 Wood Festival Planned June 3-5

Because the 58th annual Calhoun County Wood Festival was canceled due to COVID-19, this year's 59th event will be a combination of celebrations, beginning with the Wood Festival Pageants on Tuesday, June 1, at 6 p.m., in the Calhoun County Park barn.

Highlight of the pageants will be the competition and crowning of a Queen Flora for each year.

Since this year's CCHS seniors were not able to compete for Queen Flora LVIII as juniors, they have an opportunity to earn the title on Tuesday, along with the candidates for Queen Flora LIX, who, as is tradition, are juniors at CCHS. See story below for additional information.

The 59th festival gets underway on Thursday, June 3, with booths opening at 10 a.m., and opening ceremonies, introduction of royalty, and more at 7 p.m. Bruce Jones and Friends will entertain at 7:45 p.m.

The festival continues on Friday, with booths opening at 10 a.m., and entertainment on the Main St. Stage beginning at 6 p.m. with Sherry Wade, Karaoke, followed by 1980s tribute band Night Moves and Nashville recording artist Chelsea Hicks.

Saturday's full-day of entertainment includes a 5K and Kids Run at 8 a.m. (registration begins at 7:30) and booths opening at 9 a.m. Kids Day activities will be at 9:30.

The parade line-up is

at 10:30, followed by the Grand Parade at 11:00, with parade marshals Chip and Janice Westfall.

The Wood Festival Car Show is from noon to 3 p.m. at Wayne Underwood Field (registration begins at 9 a.m.).

Splash and Dash Boat Race begins at 1 p.m. at the boat ramp on Russett Road, two miles East of Grantsville. Staging is at 12:30. A cornhole tournament gets underway on Market St. at 2 p.m.

Main Street Stage entertainment gets underway at noon, with Jeremy Fowler and his drum students, followed at 12:15 with Sammy Murphy and Friends.

County Breaks Even

When the Dept. of Health and Human Services updated COVID information on May 18, it listed Calhoun with seven new cases and a total of 366.

With no explanation, five cases were taken off on the next day's total. Since that day, the county has been listed with five new cases, bringing the total back to 366, and leaving the county a net

of zero in the last week, down from 40 and 41 the two previous weeks.

COVID-19 cases in Calhoun and surrounding counties decreased from 135 last week to 66 in the past seven days.

Other county cases were: Braxton, 19; Ritchie, 18; Wirt, 16; Roane, 7; Gilmer, 5; and Clay, 1.

Calhoun returned to green on Friday and has remained there.

School Personnel of the Year

Calhoun County Schools has announced its Teacher of the Year and Service Employee of the Year.

Mellody Walburn Teacher of the Year

Mellody Walburn, a high school teacher at Calhoun Middle/High School, teaches 10th grade English, 10th honors English, and creative writing.

She graduated from Ohio University with a bachelor of science in elementary education in 1992. After substitute teaching for a few years, she spent 10 years as a middle school English teacher in Ohio.

She moved to Jacksonville, Fla., in 2008, and taught third grade for two years while helping the school build a new middle school program. She taught 7th and 8th grade English and history until 2013.

Walburn moved to Calhoun and added a new certification to her license, which enabled her to teach high school English to 6th graders and 9th-12th graders.

She said, "I love teaching creative writing, as this is one of my passions." She also writes a weekly column for *The Calhoun Chronicle*, is a board member of Calhoun County Library, and a member of Calhoun Historical Society.

"As an educator, I know my students are the most important aspect of my

job. I strongly believe that a classroom environment should be student-centered," said Walburn.

"Every child should be made to feel that he or she is in control of the learning process and capable of success. Teaching is not an assembly line where I can process information simultaneously into many minds. Teaching should be a very individualized experience for each student."

Nominated from other schools as Teacher of the Year were Jennifer Sang, Calhoun Middle School; Patricia Haught, Pleasant Hill School; and Sonja Hartshorn, Arnoldsburg Elementary School.

Dwayne Yatauro Service Employee Of the Year

Dwayne Yatauro started in Calhoun County as a substitute in 1998. In 2000, he was hired full-time as a bus mechanic.

School officials said that he has been dedicated to Calhoun County Schools for several years, and can fix anything, and is a true asset to the county.

This year, Yatauro has decided to retire, and will be missed. When asked what he enjoyed most about working for CCS, he said that it was eating lunch with his co-workers, but he was really looking forward to retirement.

After retirement, he plans to enjoy working in his garden and hunting.

Governor's Updates

Vaccinated Ages 16-35 Can Receive \$100 Awards

During a briefing last week, Gov. Jim Justice announced that online registration is now open for his "Beat 588 . . . Bad," West Virginia Strong Vaccine Incentive Program.

All West Virginians ages 16-35, who have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19, are now able to register online to receive either a \$100 savings bond or a \$100 gift card at appengine.egov.com/apps/wv/technology/vip.

The \$100 incentive is retroactive, meaning all West Virginians ages 16-35 who have received the COVID-19 vaccine at any point are eligible.

"Please go and register for your \$100," said Justice. "We really appreciate you getting vaccinated. Not only are you picking up a few extra bucks here, but you may very well have saved your life or saved others."

"We're going to continue with this program," Gov. Justice continued. "We want all 16-35-year-olds to get vaccinated as soon as possible."

West Virginia Senior Centers Re-opening Fully

Justice has announced that all senior centers across the state are ready to re-open fully.

The governor said that the W.Va. Bureau of Senior Services would be issuing safety guidelines.

[According to Calhoun County Committee on Aging director Rick Poling, his organization is looking over the 12 pages of regulations and will submit a plan for approval to re-open as soon as possible.]

Anyone who has not been fully vaccinated will still be required to wear a face covering inside the centers.

"You see, it's just more and more motivation," said Justice. "Anyone who has not been fully vaccinated is going to have to put up with wearing a mask in these centers. Please get vaccinated."

Vaccinations Available To Age 12 And Older.

All West Virginians interested in being vaccinated are urged to visit vaccinate.wv.gov or call the West Virginia Vaccine Info Line: 1-833-734-0965. The info line is open Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Saturday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The governor offered a reminder that free COVID-19 vaccination clinics will be held at all West Virginia State parks and State forests between now and Memorial Day.

West Virginia also continues to implement several new ideas to make COVID-19 vaccines more accessible. West Virginians can go to vaccines.gov for assistance in locating and securing an appointment at federal pharmacy partners. The Joint Interagency Task Force on COVID-19 vaccines continues to ask manufacturers and businesses to increase vaccine access for employees and families by holding vaccination clinics at their facilities. I dont at all believe I can come so you just come here. I think I would almost get well if you was to come. Sis talks almost every day about your coming. Do come & see us all. I will write next week & let you know how the election comes off.

Do excuse my miserable writing, & every week if you can. Remember me to F's and W's families. My best wishes for your health & happiness.

Louisa says tell you she would have written to day but she was so busy cutting carpet rags. The carpet is in the loom, but the filling failed, & she has to cut more. I tell her if she was at all industrious she might have had it done

Arnoldsburg
June 18th 1858
My Dear Mother

One line to you today, yet somehow, I think not why, a strange hope inhabits me to day that ere this reaches F. Creek, you will be here by tomorrow night. How happy, how inexpressibly happy, L. & myself would be! If you come here Perry would take you home whenever you wished to go. We would rather you would come immediately!

Court sat here last Tuesday. Closed Thursday evening. There were six lawyers here. When Worthie was here there was some difficulty respecting the election of officers. Talk difficulty has all been arranged in a favor of the West fork officers².

G.W. Silcott is fully established clerk for the coming six years. He is here now. Dr Chapman is here. His health is very delicate, & he is still unwell, & as he is not able to do any thing, concluded he would stay with us awhile.

My health has been better this week than it has for a long time, & I did a good deal of hard work during the court, which L. would have had to have done had I not been here.

I baked all of the pies, nearly all of the cakes, helped about the other cooking, setting tables, washing dishes, &c. We have had a good many travelers since W. was here. L. & I have just been shelling peas for dinner.

Wont you have some? Wont you come & see us, have you no way of coming? I think a carriage can go without difficulty. I picked up some pieces of our dresses to send Almira by W. But I forgot them. Please to write soon & often.

G.W. Silcott expressed himself very sorry that he did not see W. Said he would have rode all night to have seen him. Tell A. that Jack was here two nights of court & I had some agreeable conversation with him.

Amie writes to her mother and receives a letter in return.

Arnoldsburg
July 2nd, 1858
My Dear Mother,

Although I am nearly crazy with the toothache, yet will I give you a few brief lines to day. I was much pleased to hear from F. Creek by George, yet would have been much better pleased had G. taken a carriage, & brought you back.

The weather has been excessively warm for some time back, too warm to travel. We did not believe that G. would go on to F. Creek although he said that he would. If Perry had been at home he would have put a carriage by him for you.

I wish you was here. How were you all pleased with George this time? I suppose he took you quite by surprise. Floydie was very proud of the sweet cake you sent him. He divided it with Warrie & Sissie & then said "pa, let me take a piece up stairs to baby³".

Floyd & the children think a great deal of their baby brother which came to our town last Tuesday morning about a quarter past three. This is the fourth day of L.'s confinement & I think she is quite smart, & her third son is quite a promising fellow, although a little smaller than any of her baby's.

However it seems fat enough, & I think will be right pretty. Has a nice head of hair. Louisa says she did hope you would have come & staid a month or two with her. Mrs Conard⁴ is staying with her a little while.

The Rush Run Community Education Outreach Service (CEOS) club held its final meeting on May 4, 1:30 p.m., at Ann McCartney's home.

Due to lack of membership, because of duress, distance to travel, old age (me), and, of course, the virus, we had to call it quits.

We were down to only five full-time members. We celebrated president Sue Collins and Michele Smith's May birthdays with cake and ice cream.

We also talked about what to do with our club money and decided to give it to worthy causes in Calhoun County.

It was nice to be together after a year of no meetings.

Attending were Sue Collins, president; Ann McCarthy, treasurer and vice president; myself, secretary and reporter; and members Carol Sloane and Michele Smith.

Collins issued the following statement:

"We are sad to say this is the last CEOS club in Calhoun. Due to lack of members, we are closing after 94 years. Calhoun will no longer have a CEOS club. There will be

a few tears shed over this. We are proud of the friendships that we have made and what we have done for our community, and the fun that we have had over the years. I would like to recognize three of our members for their years of service: Irene Conrad, 71 years, Lyda Harris, 44 years, and Virgie Harris, 31 years.

We would like to thank everyone who has helped us over the years.

The club would also like to thank Mr. (Robert) Bonar for taking our scrapbooks. They will be placed in the Calhoun Historical building, so that anyone can look at them."

Calhoun County CEOS History

Two clubs, now known as CEOS groups, were organized in Calhoun County in 1927 under the name of Farm Women's clubs. They were located in the Russett and Mt. Zion communities.

During 1930-31, Extension agent Herman Bowers and his wife organized five new Farm Women's clubs.

The major activities of these clubs were home management, food and clothing study, social wel-

fare work, home ground improvement campaign, and recreation, and community activities.

During the spring of 1931, the County Farm Women's Bureau was organized and the group became the County Council.

In the early 1930s, clubs conducted McGuffey programs, consisting of readings, recitations, and dialogues from the old McGuffey Readers.

Admission was 15 and 25 cents, with proceeds going to the Calhoun Cottage to be built at Jackson's Mill.

In 1932, Miss Gertrude Humphries, State Home Demonstration agent, and Mrs. Otis Shriver, president of the State Farm Women's Bureau, met with the Calhoun County women to assist with organization matters.

In 1938, the county clubs began using the club yearbooks, and it was reported that this was met with approval. A county constitution and bylaws were adopted in 1943.

From Farm Women's clubs to Home Demonstration clubs, to Extension Homemakers, and then CEOS groups, Calhoun clubs endured. Males joined the clubs

in the 1980s, and one Calhoun male served as the Parkersburg Area representative. Calhoun County has also had a State president and members on the State board.

From a tiny beginning in 1927, the cream of improving home and community continued, as men and women from Calhoun County came together to learn and to serve their communities.

The Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) nutrition program is a supplemental food program for pregnant, post-partum, or breastfeeding women, and infants and children up to age of five.

their exact location. They will be healthier, happier, and not reproducing and fighting. Thank you for your cooperation.

"So far, we have spayed and neutered 492 community cats (275 females and 217 males).

"Please keep your personal cats indoors or put a collar on them Thursday, May 27. If you have questions, call Linda Buchanan, 354-7506."
