

According to DHHR, the county has had 982 cases since the pandemic began--510 confirmed COVID-19 cases (by far the lowest in the State) and 472 probable cases. Deaths remain at five.

The county's infection rate on Tuesday was 25.12 (per 100,000), down from 36.17, with a percent positivity rate of 3.70, down from 4.98.

CAROLYN MARIE DeWEESE


Carolyn Marie DeWeese, 86, of Chloe, died Tuesday, Nov. 2, 2021, at Roane General Hospital.


pin as a member of Boilermaker's Union, Local 667, of Winfield. He was a 30-year member of Brooksville Missionary Baptist Church.



This Week In History

The following reports are taken from The Calhoun Chronicle archives:

1921, 100 years ago

An advertisement has been published by the State Road Commission for bids on the construction of the first three miles of the Grantsville-Arnoldsburg state road, the contract to be let Dec. 16. The Phillips Run bridge contract will be sold on Dec. 2, as previously advertised.

It is not likely that much will be accomplished on these projects before Spring, but the nightmare of the Phillips Run road will be over after this winter.

Kenna Lester, prominent citizen of Henrys Fork, was here for business on Monday. He is in the mercantile business on the Spencer pike at Short Stand, and is doing a good business.

L. Frank Norman, prominent farmer of Leafbank, received a severe injury to his knee several days ago, while chopping wood.

He slipped and fell, and strained or dislocated the joint in a very painful manner. He is getting along nicely now and was able to come to town on Wednesday.

Col. W.H. Bickel, the popular local oil and gas contractor, lost a fine beagle hound during court last week. He fears the dog followed someone away while the crowd was in town, and offers a reward for information leading to its return.

Silas and Chess Poling, prosperous farmers of Apple Farm, were business visitors in Grantsville on Monday.

I am in the hotel business at Spencer and would like for all of the Calhoun people to come to my place. It is the first hotel after you cross the bridge coming into Spencer. You will be as welcome as the flowers in May.

1946, 75 years ago

Qualified World War II veterans who want to buy family-size farms have little trouble getting adequate credit, but may have plenty of trouble finding farms that can be bought at reasonable prices, said Merle W. Faulkner, county supervisor for the Farm Security Administration.

Faulkner said that the "G.I. Bill of Rights" makes veterans eligible for Bankhead-Jones Farm ownership loans on the same basis as tenants. The loans are repayable over 40 years at three percent interest.

Faulkner said Congress appropriated \$50,000,000 to Bankhead-Jones loans. Half that amount is earmarked for loans to veterans.

'The veteran's big problem will be to find a farm that can be bought at its long-term earning capacity value," said Faulkner. Unless the veteran can find the right farm at the right price, adequate credit will do him no good; and it may actually do him harm, if more is paid for a farm than it is worth.

The county FSA supervisor said there are farms for sale, but that prices are inflated. The County FSA Advisory Committee, which Faulkner said must approve all farm purchase loans, has indicated it will turn down any application to buy a farm at more than its earning capacity value.

Question: What are all these types of chicken eggs you see in the grocery store? What other eggs can be safely consumed? (Asked by a curious consumer.)

Reply: There are a variety of eggs to choose from in stores today. You have medium, large, and extra-large eggs. Then, there's free-range eggs, cagefree eggs, organic eggs, Omega-3 eggs, and a bunch of combinations. Also, you have white eggs and brown Memorial Arch eggs, with the latter usually costing more.

Free-range implies that the chicken roams freely outside. U.S. Dept. of Agriculture requires only that the birds spend part of the time outside to use this label, which raises the question, how "free" are cagefree chickens and their eggs? Cage-free means that the birds are not kept in a cage, but are confined to a barn or some other building rather than a cage.

Organic eggs come from chickens that have been fed all natural foods that do not contain any pesticides or herbicides. Omega-3 eggs come from hens that have been given special food that promotes production of the fatty acid Omega-3, which is advertised to be good for your heart.

In general, white eggs come from white chickens and brown eggs come from brown (or reddish brown) chickens. The nutritional value of brown and white eggs is almost identical. The higher price of brown eggs does not reflect better quality, but that specific breeds of brown hens are larger than white ones, and require more food, hence the higher cost.

When it comes to edible eggs, you have a large choice of type, size, flavor and cost. Here's a list of egg sources, which may not be complete: duck, goose, quail, ostrich, pigeon, pheasant, partridge, emu, gull, and guinea fowl.

You are not restricted to bird eggs. There are also Schmulbach was born in eggs from fish: sturgeon, salmon, cod, shaker, hake and white fish. These may not seem as palatable as regular eggs, and they can be expensive. For example, caviar made from the roe (eggs) of sturgeon can cost hundreds of dollars an ounce.

I'll stop there. I don't want to egg you on.





February 1st 1864

My Dear Mother

It is quite late at night. I have been writing to Lydia Ellen, & thought that I would address a few lines to you. It is very long since I have heard from you. I have no doubt but there is a letter from you at Glenville. I have not had an opportunity of sending there for a long time, but shall have next Friday.

I regret very much that we have not a post office nearer, as then I should write much more frequently. We are all enjoying our usual health, excepting Almira who has a swollen face caused from the tooth ache. She is much better to day, & will be quite well, I think, in a few days.

How are you getting along, dear Mother, this winter? I imagine you are having a very lonely time. Well, I will promise to not keep Almira longer from you than Spring. I intend to visit you myself early in the Spring, as soon as my school is finished. When this week closes my school will be half out.

I have a very pleasant school. I am teaching in the house that Jane George lived in & you know it must be a pleasant school room. I am getting along this winter very well in every respect. I have an abundance of every thing needful. I have plenty of good wood cut at my door. If I could just have my husband's society I think there would be none happier than I.

I think it is quite time the war stopped. Quite enough precious lives have been lost. It makes me sad to think of any more good men dying. And yet the great cause can receive no higher tribute of devotion than that which the soldier pays when he dies for his country

It is not easy to magnify that tribute above its merits. Eloquent words & lofty strains of poetry may do him honor; but beyond their praise, his sacrifice of blood is infinitely sublime. It is true that not all who die are animated by just principles. The class of men to which my admiration turns comprises all those who appreciate life, & yet cheerfully yield it; who have much to live for, yet nobly lay down their lives.

Governor's Updates

Vaccine For Children Ages 5-11

Gov. Jim Justice announced during a briefing last week that, with the CDC now recommending Pfizer-BioNTech's pediatric COVID-19 vaccine for use by children ages 5-11, West Virginia's Joint Interagency Task Force has begun distributing and administering doses of the vaccine to children across the state.

"We've been preparing for weeks for these vaccines for our kids to be approved," said Justice. "We were ready to go and we've hit the ground running."

He was joined virtually by Dr. Jessica McColley of Cabin Creek Health Systems and her seven-year-old son, Jacob.

Championing the safety and effectiveness of the pediatric COVID-19 vaccine, McColley administered the vaccine to her son live on-air.

"Jacob is a strong guy, and he's getting to pick out some Legos for this," said McColley.

"Jacob, I'm really, really proud of you," said Justice said. "We congratulate this young man. It's wonderful.'

"The 5-to-11-year-olds will receive about onethird of the dose of adults, with 10 micrograms, whereas adults are at 33 micrograms for Pfizer," said McColley.

"We know that children's immune systems are so much better than ours. All of the studies have proven that they gain a robust immune response from just that 10 micrograms."

"Jacob is a role model for many others," said. State coronavirus czar Dr. Clay Marsh. "Just remember, spread in children with the Delta variant of COVID-19 is like it is in adults, except that children tend to be asymptomatic much more frequently than adults do.

"We know that 8,300 children (ages 5-11) had been hospitalized with COVID-19, and 44% of the very complex multi-system inflammatory syndrome associated with COVID-19 occurs in (these) children, which can be a really devastating complication of COVID-19 in this age group.

"Preliminary studies of the pediatric vaccine do not demonstrate any complications like heart inflammation in this group of children. So, with that really good news, we hope that all parents take an opportunity and advantage to protect your child in this age group.

Vaccines are being delivered. Pay attention to your local providers and contact them to make sure that those are available for you where you live."

Justice announced West that Virginia grandfamilies, with grandchildren ages 5-11, are eligible to receive a \$150 school voucher for getting vaccinated against COVID-19 through the Healthy Grandfamilies vaccination incentive program.

The program offers a \$150 voucher for school supplies to all vaccinated grandfamilies in West Virginia--families where grandparents are the primary caregivers for their grandchildren.

To qualify, all vaccine-eligible members of the grandfamily, including grandparents and grandchildren ages five and older, must have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Veterans Day, formerly Armistice Day, is observed annually in honor of all those, living and dead, who served with the U.S. armed forces in wartime. Armistice Day was proclaimed in 1919 to commemorate the termination (at 11 a.m. on Nov. 11, 1918) of World War I. On the first anniversary of the truce, U.S. President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation eulogizing fallen Allied soldiers and referring to Nov. 11 as Armistice Day. It became a holiday in the U.S., France, United Kingdom, and Canada.

World War II

World War II or the Second World War was a true worldwide military conflict; the combination of two separate conflicts, one beginning in Asia, 1937, as the Second Sino-Japanese War, and the other beginning in Europe, 1939, with the invasion of Poland.

It split a majority of the world's nations into two opposing military alliances: the Allies and the Axis. Countries involved mobilized more than 100 million military personnel.

The conflict ended in Europe first. Hitler decided to await the end in Berlin. where he could still manipulate what was left of the command apparatus. On the afternoon of Apr. 30, 1945, Hitler committed suicide in his Berlin bunker, after naming Grand Admiral Karl Doenitz to succeed him as chief of state. Doenitz had no course open to him other than surrender. His representative, Gen. Alfred Jodl, signed an unconditional surrender of all German armed forces at Eisenhower's headquarters in Reims on May 7. The U.S. and British governments declared Mav 8 as V-E (Victory in Europe) Day. The full unconditional surrender took effect at one minute past midnight after a second signing in Berlin with Soviet participation. Allied victory was absolute when on Aug. 14, 1945, after the dropping of atomic bombs on the Japanese cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, Japan announced its surrender. The formal signing took place on Sept. 2 in Tokyo Bay aboard the battleship Missouri. This war ushered in a new age of weaponry and tactics, such as heavy bombers (for strategic warfare), jet-engine fighters, rockets (both short range and ballistic), radar, and the atomic bomb. The end of the war on the 11th hour of the 11th Army, 1918-1919. day of the 11th month of 1918 prompted relief and jubilation in all of the warring countries.

Truman complied, ordering the Air Force to refurbish the atomic bomb loading pits at Okinawa, Japan, which were used during World War II. Atomic bombs were then carried to Okinawa unassembled and put together at the base, lacking only the essential nuclear cores. OnApr.5, the Joint Chiefs of Staff ordered immediate atomic retaliation against Soviet and Chinese bases in Manchuria, if large numbers of new troops entered the war. Truman approved the transfer of nine nuclear warheads, as well as orders outlining their use the next day. The Korean War did not officially end until 1953, when President Dwight Eisenhower imposed а precarious armistice.

The Vietnam War was a military struggle fought from 1959 to 1975, involving the North Vietnamese and the National Liberation Front (NLF) in conflict with U.S. forces and the South Vietnamese army. From 1946 until 1954, the Vietnamese had struggled for independence from France during the First Indochina War.

control of Vietnamese Communists, who had opposed France and who aimed for a unified Vietnam under Communist rule. The South was controlled by Vietnamese who had collaborated with the French.

The U.S. became involved in Vietnam because it believed that if all of Vietnam fell under a Communist government, Communism would spread throughout Southeast Asia and beyond.

The U.S. supported the South Vietnamese government in order to prevent the spread of Communism. The U.S. involvement deepened in August, 1964, when North Vietnamese torpedo boats attacked two American destroyers in the Gulf of Tonkin.

The first U.S. ground troops arrived in March 1965, and by the end of the year, there were 80,000 U.S. troops in Vietnam. By 1969 there were 543,000. That year, U.S. president Richard M. Nixon began to withdraw troops while stepping up the bombing of North Vietnam.

Three to four million Vietnamese on both sides were killed, in addition to 1.5 to two million Laotians and Cambodians. More than 58,000 Americans lost their lives.

Persian Gulf

The Persian Gulf War began in August, 1990, when Iraqi forces invaded and occupied Kuwait.

The conflict culminated in fighting in January and February, 1991, between Iraq and an international coalition led by the U.S.

The Iraqi attack began shortly after midnight on Aug. 2, 1990. About 150,000 Iraqi troops overwhelmed the unprepared and inexperienced Kuwaiti forces, which numbered about 20,000.

The U.N. Security Council and the Arab League immediately condemned the Iraqi invasion. Four days later, the Security Council imposed an economic embargo on Iraq that prohibited nearly all trade.

Beginning a week after the Iraqi takeover of Kuwait and continuing for several months, an international force gathered in Saudi Arabia.

The U.S. sent more than 400,000 troops, and another 200,000 troops came from 15 other countries. Other nations contributed ships, air forces, and medical units.

Security Council passed a resolution to allow member states to "use all necessary means" to force Iraq from Kuwait, if Iraq remained after Jan. 15, 1991.

On Jan. 12, 1991, the U.S. Congress passed a resolution authorizing the president to use force. When the U.N. deadline passed without an Iraqi withdrawal, a vast majority of coalition members joined in the decision to attack Iraq. In the early morning of Jan. 17, 1991, coalition forces began a massive air attack on Iraqi targets.

On Feb. 24, the coalition launched its land offensive. Two days after the ground war began, Iraq announced it was leaving Kuwait. On Feb. 28, with the collapse of Iraqi resistance and the recapture of Kuwait, the coalition declared a ceasefire

On Mar. 2, the U.N. Security Council issued a resolution laying down the conditions for the ceasefire, which were accepted by Iraq in a meeting of military commanders on Mar. 3.

Almost all of the casualties occurred on the Iraqi side, estimated at 20,000 to 35,000. The coalition losses were extremely light by comparison: 240 killed, 148 of whom were Americans.

Viewed by many as a second Gulf War, the Iraq War began on Mar. 20, 2003, when the U.S. led a coalition of some 40 countries into battle with Iraq.

land, air and water assaults, and achieved its objective of controlling most of the large cities. On Apr. 15, 2003, the invasion was declared complete.

Afghanistan War

The war in Afghanistan (Operation Enduring Freedom, 2001-2021) was the first major conflict of the 21st Century and became the longest war in American history. Though the origins of the war involve the ongoing Afghan Civil War and the Soviet invasion and occupation of the 1970s and 1980s, the current war began in October 2001 in response to the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks on the U.S.

The war began on Oct. 7, 2001, with the first phase of what became known as the Global War on Terror. Allied air strikes devastated Taliban and al-Qaeda targets.

On the ground, American, British and other allied special forces worked with the Northern Alliance to begin a military offensive to overthrow the Taliban. The attacks led to the fall of Kabul on Nov. 13, 2001, as the Taliban retreated from most of northern Afghanistan.

U.S. Navy Seals helicoptered into Pakistan on May 1, 2011, and killed Osama bin Laden, founder and leader of al-Qaeda and the architect of many attacks on Americans, most significantly the terror attacks of Sept. 11, 2001.

On Aug. 30, 2021, the United States departed from Afghanistan and ended the longest war in the country's history. The combat mission lasted almost 20 years and was ended by President Joe Biden.

The Department of Defense's Defense Casualty Analysis System tracked a total of 2,456 U.S. military deaths and 20,763 wounded during the course of Operation Enduring

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


