## Red Devils Play First Match At Home, Defeat Doddridge

The CCHS volleyball team had already had a long week and a long season when it hosted Doddridge County on Thursday, Sept. 22. The Lady Red Devils had played each of the previous three nights and had a record of 4-12 on the season--all 16 matches on the road.

A good crowd was on hand to cheer them on when they met the Lady Bulldogs on the court.

Karlee Garrett, who led CCHS with 19 points, served out the final three points as the team won the first set, 25-20.

Joselynn Yeager, who

had 18 points, had three of her five aces in the second set as the local team won, 25-13.

Christee Craddock (12 points) and Abi Waldron (10) had most of their combined 15 assists in the third to help close out the match in straight sets, 25-16.

Calhoun is scheduled to host Wirt on Wednesday, play at Gilmer on Thursday, and play at Webster on Monday, with volleyball getting underway at 6 p.m.

## COVID Cases Lowest In County, Area In 4 Months

According to Dept. of Health and Human Resources, Calhoun had seven COVID-19 cases in the last week, which was the lowest since May.

The county has been green since Sept. 21.

The seven cases included two confirmed and five probable. The county's total is 2,181 cases since the pandemic

began--1,094 confirmed and 1,087 probable.

Calhoun's confirmed cases remain the lowest of all counties, and probable cases remain the highest percentage in West Virginia. County deaths have remained at 15 since May 3, the lowest in the state.

Net new cases in area counties, in addition to

Calhoun, in the last week (and county totals/deaths) are: Roane, 37 (4,115/43); Braxton, 12 (4,741/48); Clay, 9 (2,624/49); Gilmer, 6 (2,438/22); Ritchie, 6 (2,850/32); and Wirt, 2 (1,694/25).

New cases in the area were 79, nearly half of last week's 140, also the lowest since May. Cases (Continued on Page 2)

## COVID Cases Lowest--

(Continued from Page 1) New deaths in the U.S. now total 20,643.

New West Virginia cases were 2,727, a decrease from the previous three weeks of 3,668, 5,707 and 5,696. Total cases during the pandemic are 599,436.

The number of deaths reported by DHHR in the last seven days was 32, six more than last week's 26. Total deaths in West Virginia are 7,402.

The daily percent positivity for West Virginia was 9.0 on Tuesday, and has averaged 8.3 percent other the past week.

The number of new cases in the United States was 396,479, a decrease for the 10th straight week from 414,344, 468,755, 614,482, 655,697, 657, 690, 778,018, 827,955, 887,303, 919,743 and 936,492. Total cases since the pandemic began are 97,905,915.

Worldwide deaths in the last week were 9,760, nearly half of last week's 18,805, and higher than the previous week's 6,861.

Total deaths from the pandemic are 6,545,547.

DHHR reported that 993,801 West Virginia residents have been fully vaccinated (55.5%), an increase of 1,224 in the last week. There have been 565,417 booster shots given, an increase of 4,330 from last week.



# Around Calhoun

Our hummingbirds have now flown the coop, as it were. If we see one now, it is usually in the late afternoon or just before dusk.

We will leave one of the feeders up until the end of October to help the stragglers on their way to Central America to spend the winter.

\* \* \* \*

There are almost no male goldfinches left that have not at least begun their winter molt, so that their beautiful, bright yellow plumage is turning to the color of the outside of the yolk of a boiled egg.

\* \* \* \*

We do not have to fully fill the sunflower seed feeders on a daily basis right now, as many of the birds that summer in the holler have already left us behind to enjoy the winter without their presence.

As the sky begins to lighten every morning, I listen to the birds when I go outside, and I find that the music of summer months, as the birds wake up and chat with one another, has been replaced with much less bird talk. Its amazing how relatively quiet the mornings have become.

\* \* \* \*

Autumn rolled in late last week, accompanied by a cold front that reminds us to prepare to bring all of the outdoor plants that we want to live into the house until next spring.

We should be able to bring them all in with one possible exception, a seven-foot tall ponytail, or elephant foot palm tree that we also need to re-pot before we bring it in.

The darn thing weighs close to 100 pounds, so that tends to complicate things a little, but we will get it in the house one way or another.

The coyotes have been

very vocal lately, sometimes sounding like they are close to the yard, but they won't come into close enough range for me to discourage them with extreme prejudice.

They are smart coyotes and they have a niche to fill in Nature's scheme of things, but they are not allowed to hunt in our yard or anywhere within a couple of hundred yards of our house.

The last time a coyote was in sight of our deck, it was treated to the sound of a 12-gauge shotgun firing three-inch magnums into the air over its head. It ran away with a tucked tail--and they now avoid our yard altogether.

They howl from the holler up and down the creek, and they howl from both sides of the hill above our house, but, other than making the hair on my neck stand at attention, they leave us alone.

\* \* \* \*

There will soon be another electric bicycle on the roads near Grantsville. A fellow came into the office on Monday and ended up purchasing a Rad Power electric bike online. I said that I would be available if he needs any help assembling it when it arrives.

If he does need assistance, I just might ride my bike to his house, so that we can get his new bike ready to ride and then go enjoy an afternoon of quiet riding through the country.

## Letters to Mary and Other Communications

### Michael A. Ayers-- A Calhoun Native In the Civil War

(Continued from Last Week)

Lexington, Va.

June 12, 1864

Dear Father & Mother:

As another opportunity has presented itself, I avail myself of it to send you a short note.

Adolphus and myself are in good health, so is Bill & the other boys. I hope this may find you both in good health.

We arrived here yesterday evening having marched from Staunton in two days, and drove a small force of the enemy all the way before us. I suppose about 3000 men under Col. McCausland, we had some 8 or 10 men killed & probably the same wounded. The rebs lost about the same. Yesterday when we approached this place they burned the bridge over North River and fired on the advance of our column with their artillery, but our guns soon got a position and made them skeedaddle.

We skirmished pretty sharply with their sharpshooters who were along the bank of the river, about 4 o'clock P.M. the citizens hung out a white flag and the firing ceased. Several shells from our guns struck right in the town and hit some houses, cause the rebs had been firing from the streets. Our whole column are here to day resting.

The Military Institute, a noble and costly structure, with a splendid library has today been laid in ashes, also Ex. Gov Letcher's residence. The Washington College has been entirely ruined. We secured a rebel banner, and took prisoner Genl. Francis H Smith the superintendent of the Institute.

I visited the grave of "Stonewall" Jackson this morning, picked a sprig of grass from his tomb, and inscribed my name on the flagpole at the head of his tomb.

I will here tell you what kind of prices things are selling for, which I obtained from a lady this morning, flour is (\$250) two hundred & fifty dollars per barrel, coffee 20 dollars per lb. brown sugar 12 dollars per lb., butter 8 dollars per lb., bacon 12 dollars per lb. There now what do you think of that? and yet they say we cannot bring them to terms by fighting. I have paid 20 dollars for 2 lbs of butter & this day gave five for a half dozen biscuits, meals at the hotel are 5 dollars each, and to top off 1 dollar of our money is worth just 10 of theirs.

Expect we will march in the morning, so good bye, love to you both, & kind regards to the Major & his family,

Mrs. Simpson please give my kind regards to "Mattie", and tell her I would write to her, but am really without the means of prepaying the postage, at present. I would like to hear from her very well, but am out of reach of the mail. If any of you write to me send by way of Martinsburg, Va.

Camp Piatt, West Va.  
June 30th., 1864

Beloved Mary:

While at breakfast this morning I received your very kind and affectionate letter of 19th. inst. and was really glad to hear from you, and that you were still in good health.

Our Division arrived at this place yesterday, after a long and terrible march.

We left Staunton on 10th inst, and was two days on the march to Lexington, fought each day, and on the 2nd. day we had a sharp fight and drove the rebs out of Lexington and took possession of the place. We remained there Sunday and Monday, and started Tuesday, marched as far as Buchannon where our cavalry had a sharp fight the day before, from here we crossed the Blue Ridge, passed between the "Peaks of Otter" two very noted mountains, said to be the highest in Virginia.

We struck the Va. & Tenn. Railroad at Liberty and moved down the track which we completely destroyed for 10 miles, not leaving a rail or crosstie or bridge for that distance. On Friday 17th. we arrived before the town of Lynchburg and about 5 o'clock in the afternoon the fight commenced and continued till dark, having steadily driven the enemy for a mile and a half. We lay in line of battle all night and at 6 A.M. on the 18th. the fight opened again.

Our Brigade was moved off to the right about four miles, but by some means, we were ordered back to the left wing of our line, and about noon we went into action. Our Brigade formed and marched right up in front of the rebel breastworks, amid a heavy fire, driving them back behind their works. We reached a hollow and rested a few minutes, when we were ordered to charge, our line move up the hill gallantly, and then came one of the terriblest fires, which it was almost impossible to stand before, and before which the right of our Brigade gave way.

Our Regiment stood like a wall of stone and was the last to give way, when the whole line had fallen back, it was here we lost nearly all that was lost in the action. We had one Lieutenant (Barr of Co. D.) was shot dead. Morgan Rexroad was killed. Frank Smith was left for dead, having been shot through the head. Frank Proudfoot was shot through the breast and mortally wounded. We lost 5 killed and about 20 wounded.

## Deer Archery And Crossbow Seasons

Gov. Jim Justice reminds the public that West Virginia's deer archery and crossbow seasons are underway. Hunters may purchase their license and stamps at wvhunt.com or at an authorized license retailer.

"With the start of fall and the opening of deer seasons and all of the goodness that's coming just around the corner, there isn't a better time to be in West Virginia than right now," said Justice.

"I want to encourage everyone to find an excuse to participate in this incredible season and enjoy our forests and public hunting lands as fall color begins to set in around the state in the coming weeks.

"I've said it before, hunting is a time-honored West Virginia tradition and I'm so honored to highlight all of the opportunities that we have here in our beautiful state."

West Virginia's deer archery and crossbow seasons will remain open through Dec. 31. The state's antlerless deer split seasons will open in select counties starting Oct. 20, the two-week buck firearms season is scheduled to open Nov. 21, and a deer muzzleloader season will be open Dec. 12-18.

A split season for youths, Class Q/QQ, and Class XS hunters will be open Oct. 15-16 and Dec. 26-27.

"If it's been a while since you've gone hunting in West Virginia, the fall seasons are a great time to get back in the game," said DNR director Brett McMillion.

"I want to thank Gov. Justice for always championing our natural resources and promoting our hunting and fishing opportunities to the world. Without his help, we wouldn't be able to do all that we're doing to

encourage folks to enjoy outdoor adventures in our great state."

The deer archery and crossbow seasons are a good opportunity for hunters to stock their freezers with meat for winter. Hunters may take up to two deer in one day, but only one antlered deer may be taken per day.

Additional deer stamps are limited to two per hunter. West Virginia residents and senior hunters must buy a Class RB stamp to take additional archery or crossbow deer, but West Virginia resident landowners hunting on their own property, and Class DT license holders, are not required to purchase additional archery stamps.

The Class RRB stamp is required for non-resident hunters who want to take additional deer.

WVDNR reminds hunters that Logan, McDowell, Mingo and Wyoming counties are under special regulations. In these counties, only two archery deer may be taken, one of which must be antlerless.

In 10 additional counties or portions thereof, hunters must take an antlerless deer in any regular deer season before harvesting a second antlered deer in that county.

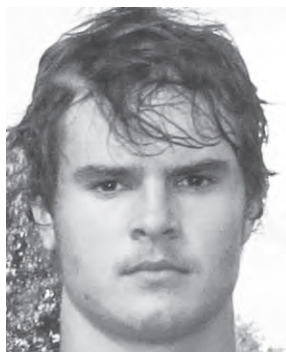

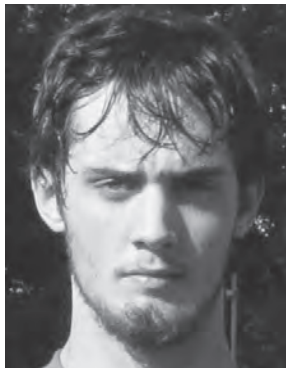

## This Week In Red Devil Football History

### "Celebrating 100 Years"

Sept. 27, 1924: Cairo visits Grantsville for Calhoun County's first game against an opponent from Ritchie County. The home team scores in every quarter to overwhelm the visiting Pharaohs, 47-0.

Hubert Hardman and Jim Riddle lead the way in scoring with 19 and 12 points, respectively. David Oles and Tuck Waldo each score touchdowns, while Henry Kight adds two extra points, and Holly Sturm one. (?) Hamilton kicks a PAT to round out the scoring.

Sept. 27, 1941: Calhoun defeats Ravenwood, 40-0, at Flinn Field. This

is CCHS's first victory over the Jackson County school and the start of a four-game win streak over Ravenswood. Scoring TDs for Calhoun are (?) Bennett (3), Buddy Hathaway (2), and (?) Robinson (1). The team also scores on a safety.

Sept. 27, 1963: For the first and only time, the Red Devils play a game outside the state of West Virginia, taking on the Belpre Eagles just across the river from Parkersburg in Ohio. This is the second of a two-game series.

Calhoun won the 1962 matchup, 13-7, in Grantsville. Dan Heiney scores a pair of touchdowns and Terry Richards adds another to lead the Red Devils to a 18-14 victory.

Sept. 25, 1970: Calhoun scores a narrow 14-13 homecoming win over Williamstown. Holly Bell rushes for 104 yards and Johnny Queen scores both touchdowns. Chuck Heiney caught a pass from Gary Smith after the second touchdown for a two-point conversion that gave the Red Devils the victory.

Sept. 28, 1990: For the first time ever, three Calhoun running backs rush for 100 yards in the same game. It came against Gilmer County in Glenville. Brian Stump had 119 yards and two touchdowns, Brian Evans adds 114 and also scores twice, and Rob Richards totals 102. Steve Whited runs for 52 yards and a touchdown on only three carries, and Mike Boatright scores another touchdown.

On defense, Evans in-

tercepts a pass and Rick Smith snares three, returning one for a touchdown, and Calhoun wins handily, 48-0.

Sept. 29, 1995: Calhoun defeats Gilmer, 42-14, on homecoming night at Wayne Underwood Field. Three Red Devil backs top the century mark in rushing yards: Jason Rider (184), Eugene Long (102) and Steve Wilmoth (101).

Defensively, David Marks leads the way with 12 tackles and a fumble recovery, while Gary Miller and Mike Nelson intercept Titan passes. Rider (3), Wilmoth (2) and Long (1) tally touchdowns for the Red Devils, and David Hurtado is 6-for-6 kicking extra points.

Sept. 30, 2005: Following a 42-18 loss at Williamstown the week before, the Red Devils up their record to 4-1 with a 28-0 homecoming win against Wahama. Chad Conley and Paul Goodrich score two touchdowns each, Michael Sullivan kicks two extra points and Steven Cunningham hauls in a pass from Matt Houchin for a two-point conversion.

Goodrich (182) and Conley (111) are the leading rushers in the game. Zac Yeager (14) and Goodrich (13) lead the team in tackles, while Caleb Hart recovers a White Falcon fumble, and Cunningham intercepts a pair of Wahama passes.

## Play Again Tuesday Red Devils Host Paden City For Homecoming

When Trinity Christian School informed CM/HS athletic director Ernie Tingler that it would not be able to field enough healthy players for a game last Friday, it gave the Red Devils an extra week to prepare for the annual homecoming game this Friday at 7 p.m. against Paden City (1-2).

When it was rescheduled for Tuesday, Oct. 4, at 6:30 p.m., it also meant that CCHS (0-4) would play again just four days later.

Through the first four games, Ian Persinger and Owen Taylor lead the Red Devils in scoring with 14 points--two touchdowns and a two-point conversion run for each.

Owen Grose and Hunter Thacker have each caught a TD pass and Jayton Gibson has rushed for another. Rounding out the 48 offensive points is a Logan Tingler two-point conversion pass reception.

Persinger has rushed for 243 yards on 51 carries (4.8 per carry). He has completed 4-of-7 passes for 57 yards, while Taylor

is 9-of-35 for 31 yards. Thacker has caught six passes for 31 yards, and Grose has two receptions for 37.

Persinger has returned 11 kickoffs for 307 yards and Gibson has nine returns for 121.

Grose has kicked off eight times for 212 yards.

On defense, the leading tacklers (solos/assists) are Jayton Gibson 40, Ian Persinger 28, Adam Hughes 28, Owen Taylor 22, Owen Grose 14, Logan Tingler 14.

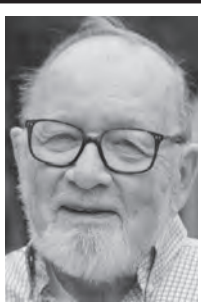
## 1972, 50 years ago

# CURIOSITY CORNER

**Question:** What are maraschino cherries? That is, how are they made and are they real cherries? (Asked by a curious cherry eater.)

**Reply:** Yes, we are talking about those bright red cherries commonly found in fruit cocktail, cakes and ice cream, and perched on top of the whipped cream on a milkshake or sundae.

They are real cherries, with a bit of treatment. The name "maraschino" comes from the marasca cherry of Croatian origin, from which maraschino liqueur is made. Whole cherries preserved in this liqueur were known as maraschino cherries. They became popular in Europe in the nineteenth century, but the supply of marasca cherries was small. So, other cherries became preserved in various ways and sold as "maraschino."

During Prohibition in the 1920s, the alcoholic maraschino liqueur cherries became illegal and a manufacturing process was developed using light-colored sweet cherries, such as Royal Ann or Rainier varieties. Today, maraschino cherries are the cherries first preserved in a brine solution to bleach the fruit, and then soaked in a suspension of food coloring (usually red dye, but you can also get green maraschino cherries). These are saturated with sugar and packed in sugar syrup that is flavored with oil of bitter almonds or a similar flavor.

**Question:** Where did the term "Yankee" come from? (Asked by a curious Southerner.)

**Reply:** That's a good question and I think I answered it some time ago. I'm a Yankee from Ohio (I came down and stayed awhile.) Having been in South Carolina for over 45 years now, I'm somewhat southernized. I don't drink sweetened iced tea, but boiled peanuts are good.

It is thought that "Yankee" is derived from the name "Jan Kass," which was a derogatory nickname meaning "John Cheese." Dutch settlers in colonial times applied it to English settlers. Then came the song "Yankee Doodle," to mock the poorly equipped revolutionary forces.

Somewhere along the way, it was applied to Northerners, remaining in the union during the Civil War. Finally, during World War I, Americans were collectively known as Yankees, or "Yanks," as in the song "The Yanks Are Coming." That nickname has generally stuck with us, particularly in South America.

Sept. 29, 1861: The Kanawha Valley experienced severe flooding. The Kanawha River reached 46.87 feet in Charleston, more than 16 feet above flood stage.

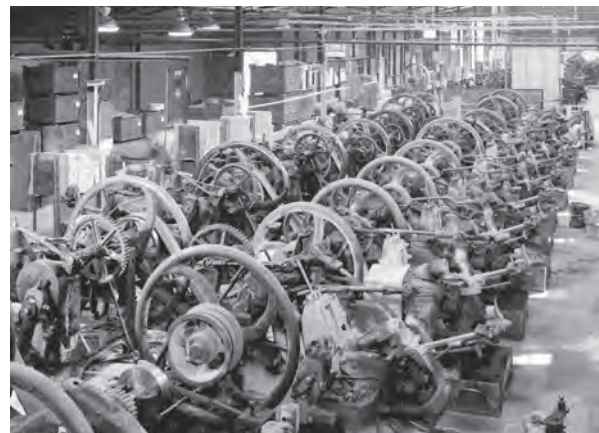


Sept. 29, 1927: Artist June Kilgore was born in Huntington. She was an abstract expressionist painter who spent 30 years as an art professor at Marshall University.

Sept. 30, 2010: Facing an economic downturn and foreign competition, Wheeling-La Belle Nail Co. (shown below) closed. It was founded in 1852 as LaBelle Iron-works. By 1875, the city was known as the Nail City, and La Belle was Wheeling's leading nail producer.

Oct. 1, 1896: Rural Free Delivery began in West Virginia's Eastern Panhandle (shown below). Before this, there was no rural mail delivery, although more than half the country's citizens lived in rural areas.

Oct. 2, 1949: The first class began training at the State Police Academy in Institute. The 20 cadets graduated on Dec. 20, 1949.

Oct. 3, 1935: A patient at Weston State Hospital started a fire in the main building that destroyed six men's wards and caused a cupola to fall through the roof. The building was repaired, and the hospital remained in service for nearly 60 more years.

Oct. 4, 1934: Sam Huff was born near Morgantown. He was part of a fearsome defense that led West Virginia University to a 38-7 record between 1952 and 1955, including three consecutive wins over rival Penn State.

Oct. 5, 1992: Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church (shown above) in Grafton was designated as a National Historic Landmark, one of only 16 in the state. The first Mother's Day observance took place at the church on May 10, 1908.

Effective this year, the Sheriff's office will no longer conduct the annual Real Estate Tax Lien Sale. WV Legislature passed Senate Bill 552 into law during this year's session that now makes the WV State Auditor responsible for conducting these sales. The Sheriff's Tax Office must certify a list of Delinquent properties to the WV State Auditor's Office at the close of business on October 31 each year. Once this list is submitted to the Auditor's Office, the landowner must then contact the Auditor's Office in order to redeem the property before it is sold or after it is sold by them. There is a very limited time after this sale occurs for any redemptions to be made due to this new process.

The list of 2021 delinquent properties has been sent to the newspaper and will be published and Certified letters are being sent to the last known address at time of assessment.

**Please use this as a reminder of the importance of paying your Real Estate Taxes by October 31 each year to avoid further hassle and unnecessary fees of redeeming your property through the WV State Auditor's Office.**

## Bobwhite Quail To Be Stocked

At the Claudia L. Workman Wildlife Education Center, Gov. Jim Justice announced a new statewide initiative to stock Bobwhite Quail at Wildlife Management areas across West Virginia.

Through the governor's Quail Stocking Initiative, W.Va. Division of Natural Resources will stock over 20,000 birds at management areas.

DNR has already stocked over 12,000 quail, and will continue stocking from August through October, weather and habitat conditions permitting.

Transmitters have been placed on some of the quail to monitor survival and habitat use. Game cameras have also been placed at several locations to monitor through video and pictures.

"I've missed these little rascals, and lots of people have," said Justice. "It's a bird that has been here forever, and it's wildlife that we need to protect and bring back. This is a great step forward, and I'm proud to be part of this. I know it will work. A lot of people have grown up and haven't seen or heard a quail in West Virginia.

Northern Bobwhite Quail is a native species and was once found across West Virginia. The winters of 1977, 1978 and 1979 devastated their population.

The state's Bobwhite population reached its peak in the 1920s, when the state was about 70 percent agricultural land, but has faced sharp decline during the last several decades.

Through this reintroduction effort, landowners, hunters and bird watchers will once again be able to hear the familiar "bobwhite" whistle.

"We're trying to bring back something that people have missed," said Justice. "And for generations to come, if we're able to bring quail back, people will get used to it and love it, and they'll miss it if it ever leaves us again."

Bobwhites live in coveys, which are groups of 5-30 birds. Their young are the size of bumblebees and are able to leave the nest about a day after hatching.

Up to three hatchings, or clutches, can be produced before the season ends in October. Adult bobwhites are almost exclusively seed-eaters, consuming the seeds of grasses and other plants.

As part of the stocking, DNR has coordinated habitat restoration projects at seven of the state's WMAs. DNR maintains nearly 100 WMAs, which provide visitors and residents with undisturbed hunting, fishing, and other outdoor recreation.

Stocking locations include Burnsville Lake Wildlife Management Area.

"This idea was generated by our governor because he had an extreme interest in this program," said DNR director Brett McMillion. "This has been an exciting project, and we do believe that there will be some natural regeneration."

### Vaccine

Mid-Ohio Valley Health Dept. has announced that its offices have received doses of the Moderna bivalent booster vaccine for COVID-19 for those 18 and older.

According to the news release, "COVID-19 vaccine booster shots are important for maintaining protection against severe illness, hospitalization, or death from the virus.

All individuals should receive their initial primary series before receiving the bivalent booster. If they have recently had another COVID booster, they should be two months past receiving that dose.

Everyone may visit the COVID-19 Vaccine Due Date Calculator, located on DHHR's COVID website and at movhd.com, to see when they are eligible for the bivalent booster.

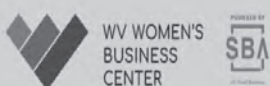

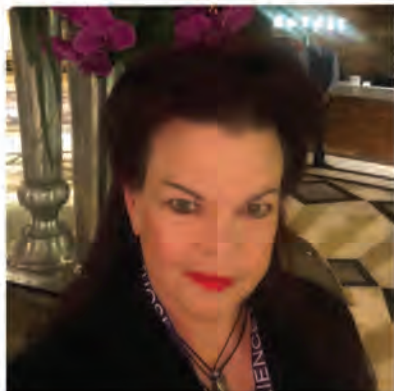
