



1948, 75 YEARS: *Big Homecoming Game Next Week:*

Friday, October 22 has been designated Homecoming Day at Calhoun County high school and plans are rapidly being formulated to make it the biggest and best in the history of the school.

At 2 p.m. on that date there will be the large parade, which will include the Calhoun and the Pennsboro bands, large and beautiful floats by school and town organizations and of course the beautiful coronation ceremonies in which the queen of each school will be honored.

The feature of the day will be the Calhoun-Pennsboro football game which Oct. 14, 1947: In a Bell X-1 rocket airplane dropped from a B-29 bomber, Chuck will be plated on the local field at 8 p.m. Both teams have highly respectable records and it is expected to be a bitter battle between two of the top-ranking teams of the Little Kanawha Regional conference.

Oct. 12, 1877: Howard Mason Gore was born in Harrison County. He served as U.S. secretary of agriculture and the 14th governor of West Virginia.

Oct. 12, 2020: Actress Conchata Ferrell died. Born in Loudendale, Kanawha County, Ferrell was best known as Berta the housekeeper on the CBS sitcom Two and a Half Men. She enjoyed a long career



on stage, film and television.

Oct. 13, 1863: The Battle of Bulltown took place. The location was valuable during the Civil War because the Weston & Gauley Bridge Turnpike crossed the Little Kanawha River on a covered bridge at this site.





Yeager roke the sound barrier by flying 700 miles per hour.

He set another speed record on December 12, 1953, by flying two-and-a-half times the speed of sound in a Bell X-1A.

Oct. 14, 1949: WSAZ-TV went on the air on channel 5. Early shows included the first telecast of a Marshall College (now University) basketball game on December 3, 1949.



CURIOSITY CORNER by Dr. Jerry D. Wilson, Emeritus Professor of Physics, Lander University



Often, I'm asked about the meanings of words and phrases. The questions are genuine, and the definitions and origins are interesting. Yet, on their own, they're too short to make up a full column. Here's a collection of "Miscellaneous Meanings." Enjoy!

Dirigible: an airship that can be directed (dirige) as compared to a balloon that merely drifts with the wind. Improper emphasis on the second syllable may give rise to the belief that the word is derived from the "rigid" part of the structural framework. Blimps are not rigid and a bit limp, but they are directable dirigibles.

Earmarked: Something that has been set aside or distinguished in some way so it won't be used for another purpose. This comes from the practice of marking the ear of a sheep or other animal for ownership or some other purpose. Sheep and pigs were once commonly identified with dabs of tar or paint on their ears ("earmarked"). A few years ago, when in the Lake District in England, I noticed sheep with dabs of red and green colors on their ears. I had to ask. It was a way of marking the expecting and non-expecting ewes.

Eavesdrop: to listen or overhear. (I screw it up and say "easedrop.") The "eaves" is the overhanging edge of a roof, and the rain running off it was called the "eavesdrop" ... dripping eaves. The place between the edge of the eaves and the wall of the house was a great place for snoopers and peepers to listen under a window in the old days, and these scoundrels became known as "eavesdroppers." Now we can eavesdrop indoors by listening to someone in another room, or do it electronically without even being there. Eleven and twelve: We have thirteen (3 + 10), fourteen (4 + 10), etc. Why not oneteen and twoteen? Well, the first part of eleven implies "one" (an old spelling was "onlevene"). The "twe" of the twelve indicates "two." But what about the "-leven" and "lve" parts? It is generally thought that these endings meant "leftover" or "remaining." Hence, eleven would be "one left over" and twelve "two left over." This would imply the common maximum of counting was ten... or that you ran out of fingers.





NOTICE OF FILING AND HEARING

On July 31, 2023, Mountaineer Gas Company (Mountaineer) filed its annual Application for approval of an Infrastructure Replacement and Expansion Program for 2024 (2024 IREP) with revised IREP rates for 2024, pursuant to W.Va. Code § 24-2-lk, which authorizes the Public Service Commission of West Virginia to approve cost recovery of projects to replace, upgrade and expand natural gas utility infrastructure that are deemed to be just and reasonable and in the public interest.

In its Application, Mountaineer forecasts capital investment for calendar year 2024 of \$67 million as part of its multi-year plan. The 2024 IREP covers several categories of plant asset replacements and improvements, including mains, service lines, measurement and regulator stations, and house regulators. These plant investments are proposed to be made in Mountaineer service territories throughout the State. These investments are identified in the Application, which is on file and available for public inspection at the Commission's offices at 201 Brooks Street, Charleston, West Virginia and which may be viewed on the Commission's website, www.psc.state.wv.us.

Mountaineer proposes to recover costs associated with these investments through an additional increment within the fixed or volumetric base rate component of its rates, depending on the applicable rate schedule under which service is rendered, to be effective on January 1, 2024. As a part of Mountaineer's pending general base rate proceeding, Case No. 23-0280-G-42T, IREP investment made prior to January 1, 2023, will be moved into new base rates to take effect on January 1, 2024. Mountaineer projects that if the program and increased rates are approved as requested, the average monthly bill for its various classes of customers will be changed on January 1, 2024 as shown below:

) Increases for Large Commercial and Industrial customers assume transport customers purchase their natural gas at the same price as the Company's Purchased Gas Adjustment rate.

The increases shown above are compared to the rates currently in place and are based on averages of all customers in the indicated class. Each class may receive an increase greater or less than stated here. Individual customers may receive increases that are greater or less than average. Furthermore, the requested rates and charges are only a proposal and are subject to change (increase or decrease) by the Public Service Commission in its review of this filing. Any increase in rates and charges will not become effective until authorized and approved by the Public Service Commission.

The Commission set a procedural schedule, including a hearing date on the Application, if necessary, that will begin at 9:30 a.m. on November 27, 2023, continuing on November 28, 2023, if necessary, in the Howard M. If no opposition to the Application is received by the Commission within one week of the hearing date, the hearing may be waived and the Commission may issue a final order within 150 days of the Application filing date.





Mt Zion PSD Holds Meeting Oct. 2nd

The Mt. Zion Public Service District board met for their monthly meeting on Monday, October 2nd, 2023, being called to order by Anita West.

Newly appointed Board Member Aryeh White explained in order to conduct business they must follow Roberts Rule of Order and he came prepared with a copy (816 page book) to explain the proper procedures for holding meetings in an attempt to bring order to chaos. The opening of the meeting seemed disconcerting to the Board as Mr. White attempted to explain the procedure for conducting a meeting that did not have an active chair. The meeting would be "Pro Tempore," "Pro tempore" which is a Latin phrase that translates to "for the time being". It's often used to describe a person who acts as a placeholder in the absence of a superior. So for that purpose, Anita West, as Secretary made a motion to appoint Ari White as the newest member of the Mt. Zion PSD Board, with a second from Robin Hughes. Once the matter was passed by a unanimous vote, Robin Hughes then nominated Ari White to become Chair person of the board, Anita West abstained from voting.

Newly elected Chairman Aryeh White obtained from voting on the approval of previous meeting minutes because he had not read them, the motion carried with a 2-0 vote from Board Members Robin Hughes and Anita West. With several matters having already been discussed at length using the Roberts Rules of Order, Jeremy Westfall, Operator, asked Mr. White where he had come up with all the aforementioned rules. To which Aryeh White responded, from the book of Roberts Rules of Order which had been around for greater than 100 years and he showed him the book he brought with him.

Following the approval of the minutes, public comments and concerns were addressed. Ronald Brown, a water customer as well as an employee of Calhoun Homes asked when a specific hydrant had been last flushed at Calhoun Homes. When no satisfactory answer was given Mr. Brown said that Mr. Westfall was not doing his job. To which Mr. Westfall responded, "I guess so." Robin Hughes, Board member as well as Manager of Calhoun Homes stated that she had spoken to the WV State Fire Marshall's office who had informed her that the line should be flushed from the appearance of the water. Jeremy Westfall responded by saying that the line did not belong to the PSD, but rather Calhoun Homes so it was their responsibility, but Mr. Brown concluded that it was an issue with the PSD because they had the right of way. Mr. Westfall said that in order to flush the meter as had been requested the Mt. Zion PSD Board would need to come up with \$20,000 to \$30,000 to cover the cost. Mark Sankoff, Engineer for Protesta stated that it was a private line, but that it needed flushed. At this time Ari White interjected saying that if it was the opinion of the WV Fire Marshall that mattered, it should be gotten in writing. The Board would need to clarify whose role it is to flush the line and the amount it will cost. Because of the verbal content of the meeting that was getting out of control, Ari informed all those present that from this point forward everyone would stop the finger pointing, address everything to him as chair or he would call them out of order.

Ronnie Brown proceeded to address Aryeh White, with his concerns that he didn't like coming into the office and learning facts about other people's water bill, what they owed, etc. Mr. White said that it sounded like that could be a matter of liability and breach of contract. Iona Rhodes then spoke up and asked if Board Members should be allowed to call ask about others peoples bills. Board President Ari White stated that the Mt. Zion PSD would adopt a written procedure to prevent further liabilities. Anita West said that they should first see if their current rules and regulations covered it.

Mark Sankoff, Engineer for Protesta updated the PSD that they were continuing to update the plans to replace the booster station on Phillips run, paint the fencing at the Sand Ridge tank, replace a 2" line at Sycamore, determine what Radio meters need to be replaced, update the PRV going into Arnoldsburg, and look inside and inspect the tank. Mike Hersman of WV Rural Water offered to provide a drone that could look inside the tank to determine its condition. Mr. Sankoff also informed the PSD Board that he would be providing a pressure gauge to Jeremy Westfall to put on a meter tile to check the water pressure every 30 seconds on the Grantsville side of the Booster station.

Jake Frady of the Mid Ohio Valley Regional Council reported to the board that there was an issue with an invoice of Dunn & Thrasher for "Special Services," that was denied when they attempted to shift funds to pay it, but they were in agreement to pay a partial payment of \$60,281.43 to Thrasher which the Board approved.

A motion was made by Anita West for the approval of Iona Rhodes as Mt. Zion PSD Secretary, stating that no objection had been made by the PSD attorney when contacted about Rhodes relationship with Jeremy Westfall. However, neither Robin Hughes, nor Ari White would approve her hiring. The discussion was moved into executive session to reconsider the objection but after the executive session ended the matter was tabled to be discussed again next month. With regard to the Mt. Zion PSD's request for financial assistance from the Calhoun County Commission, Ari White recommended that a financial statement be provided to the Commission upon making the request so that they could lead by example. A motion to pay invoices was approved, of which the amount of \$12,353.15 was due to the Town of Grantsville for the September Water usage wholesale. Anita West informed the group that she found a check where the Mt. Zion PSD paid One Call system. Aryeh White suggested a letter be written and delivered to the Pleasant Hill PSD about this situation. After the meeting it was discovered that a deposit was found that showed that Pleasant Hill PSD did pay for their share of the One Call system they shared. Jeremy Westfall reported that all required reporting notices were up to date and there was no longer an issue with e.coli. Ari asked if the State site reflected such, to which Westfall said it did.



The Mt. Zion PSD rate increase went into effect raising the current base bill of \$36.48 to \$44.16.

Regarding the Consolidation, Mr. White asked what the current status was and was informed that the matter stalled in August with no other information given. The meeting was adjourned. Next Meeting will be held on November 6, 2023 at 2 p.m.

The Pleasant Hill PSD Board met the Board Room of the Town of Grantsville at 4 p.m. on Monday, October 2nd, 2023. Board members present were Tammy Yoak, Allen Dawson and Eric Cain. Following the approval of minutes the board voted to adopt a Drug Free Work Place in accordance with the USDA as well as a Fire Hydrant Policy.

The Norman Ridge Project was discussed reporting it was moving along. The remaining items requested from the USDA was completed, they required at least 62 households to agree to the water and it was time consuming since the maps they are using are not up to date. Board Member Tammy Yoak informed the crowd that there are now available ARPA funds in the amount of \$250,000 to be utilized towards the project.

With regards to the 2023 Audit, Secretary Stephanie Good informed the board that she had been working on it. Tammy Yoak mentioned several times during a recent training that she had learned many things that she was either unaware of or did not know needed accomplished, such as a workplace handbook. She and Allen Dawson will work on getting samples from other PSD's to create and adopt one of their own.

Jacob Bunner, Operator for Pleasant Hill PSD reported to the board that his Monthly Operational Reports were completed and sent in, their reporting was in compliance and he was working toward updating lead and copper sites as well as addresses associated with his bacti samples. By way of work being done in the system he reported that he had fixed 2 leaks, one at Pleasant Lane and the other at Leaf Bank and that two taps were due to be installed this week. Other discussions involved a leak at the home of Gary Smith and a leak on Leading Creek Road. The Annamoriah Project which has been a hot topic at Calhoun County Commission Meetings is at the forefront of planning with the PSD. The first matter of business regarding the project was to hire an Engineer to move the project forward. Two Engineer firms applied, Boyles Hildreth as well as New River. When it came to making the determination the Pleasant Hill PSD went with Boyles Hildreth because of their area knowledge, experience and assurance that there would be no problem with delays. With the current number of Water customers needing service the cost of the project would be \$125,000 per home. That amount could be reduced if more customers would come on board for service and property values could be increased because of the availability of water. Calhoun citizen, Charlotte Blair, who has kept the feet of all parties to the fire was asked and accepted the job of recruiting more homes in the area to reduce the cost. Other area for service that was discussed was the Munday Road which had all but been determined to be removed from the newest project. When Charlotte Blair explained circumstance along the route and the desperate need the PSD Board agreed to reconsider. The board entered into an executive session to discuss personnel and the meeting was later adjourned.





3. Have a "kid- and pet-free zone" of at least 3 feet (1 meter) around the stove or grill and anywhere else hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

DHHR Highlights Resources During Breast Cancer Awareness Month

CHARLESTON, W.Va. - The West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources (DHHR), Bureau for Public Health joins partners across the nation to highlight services available to West Virginians during Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

The West Virginia Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Program (WVBCCSP), within DHHR's Bureau for Public Health, Office of Maternal, Child and Family Health, helps low-income, uninsured, or underinsured women gain access to breast and cervical cancer screening services.

"The West Virginia Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Program provides resources to decrease cancer incidence, morbidity, and mortality by focusing on populations who are underserved and who have increased cancer risk due to health inequities," said Dr. Matthew Christiansen, State Health Officer and Commissioner of DHHR's Bureau for Public Health. "Through the program, uninsured or underinsured West Virginians have the availability to receive screening and information on risks and preventive measures."

The WVBCCSP eligible population includes those who are uninsured or underinsured, at or below 250% of the federal poverty level, aged 40 to 64 years for breast cancer services, and aged 21 to 64 years for cervical cancer services.

Those who are symptomatic or high-risk under the age of 40 and those over the age of 64 who do not have Medicare Part B may also receive services through the program.

The switch to an electric car can bring a big surprise. The dollars you once spent at the gas pump will now show up on your higher electric bill. Some people forget to factor that in when considering that choice.

The age of an appliance can make a difference in the amount and duration of power it draws.

Newer, more energy efficient models can bring significant savings, and will even pay for themselves over time.

It is difficult to quantify exactly, but people have been spending more time at home since 2020.

Since the COVID-19 epidemic, many Americans choose to dine in and entertain at home.

Here are a few things that I found out by looking for ways to cut costs.

Air conditioning and heating generally are the highest energy cost factors in a home, according to a report by Direct Energy. The same group says lighting accounts for an average nine percent of household energy costs.

Forbes magazine, quoting figures from the Environmental Protection Agency, says it costs \$500 to \$600 a year to fuel the 10 most efficient electric cars. That's based on the cost to drive 15,000 miles annually in combined city and highway use. By the way, Forbes also says it is cheaper to charge your vehicle at home than at public charging stations.

The U.S. Department of Energy's website at https://energy.gov has an energy saver page that lets you calculate your annual electricity consumption and costs, and has loads of ideas for conserving resources. It suggests a wholehouse energy monitoring system for detailed information on your home's energy use.

You'll also find seasonal energy saving tips on the Public Service Commission's website at ww.psc.state.wv.us. I hope these ideas will help you make your home more energy efficient.

WAG : HELP with FERAL CAT COLONIES

The Welfare of Animals Group (WAG) is asking Calhoun county residents to help us address a long-observed problem with our animal community - feral or community cats. If you feed a feral cat colony in your neighborhood, or know someone who does, please call Linda at 304-354-7506 or notify us via our email calhounwag@yahoo.com.

Our humane and effective Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program's volunteers will live trap the cats, take them to the vet to be spayed or neutered, vaccinated for rabies, respiratory disease, worms, and fleas, and returned them to their outdoor home, at no cost to the colony's caretaker.

The colony will be healthier and no longer producing unwanted kittens. At 4 months old a female kitten can start breeding, and can have 2 or 3 litters per year. A mother cat nursing a litter of kittens goes back into heat when the kittens are only 3-4 weeks old. Removing cats from an area (catching and killing) is useless. When cats are removed from an area, then new, unsterilized cats move in to take advantage of available resources – and begin reproducing. This well-documented natural trend is known as the "vacuum effect." Trap-Neuter-Return stops the breeding cycle and eliminates mating behaviors, such as yowling, spraying, roaming, and fighting. Trap-Neuter-Return also benefits public health because community cats are vaccinated against rabies. We can only trap once a month, so please contact us so we can help with a colony.



Attorney General Morrisey Announces Calhoun vs. Williamstown as Opioid Abuse Prevention Game of the Week

CHARLESTON — West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrisey announced his office will feature the Calhoun High School vs. Williamstown High School gridiron matchup as an Opioid Abuse Prevention Game of the Week.

Throughout each week, the initiative engages with student athletes, coaches, school officials and communities across West Virginia. Representatives from the Attorney General's Office inform the respective coaches as to the dangers of opioid use and provide educational material for display and distribution in the schools to foster more discussion of the issue.

The week culminates with the Attorney General's Office staffing an information booth at each of the select sporting events to distribute opioid abuse awareness materials.

"Education and prevention are crucial in blocking opioid abuse and its devastating consequences," Attorney General Morrisey said. "By providing education and informational materials to students and their families, our goal is to end opioid abuse once and for all. Without education, families may not know how easily addiction can begin with treatment for a routine injury. There are real risks to using opioids in pain management and our goal is preventing senseless deaths by making everyone aware of how dangerous these medications can be."


Now in its seventh year, the initiative is part of a broader partnership to tackle opioid use in high school athletics. It involves the Attorney General's Office and the West Virginia Board of Medicine.

Opioid painkillers may temporarily relieve pain, but they do nothing to address the underlying injury and can have serious side effects. The medication also carries striking similarities to heroin.

The Attorney General and his partners are concerned about the unnecessary usage of opioid painkillers to treat athletic injuries, possibly leading to increased dependence, abuse and addiction.

Parents and caregivers are urged to discuss alternative treatment plans with their child's health care provider. Such alternatives include physical, occupational and massage therapy, along with chiropractic medicine, acupuncture and over-the-counter medications.

If an opioid proves necessary, parents and caregivers are encouraged to only use the medication as directed, closely monitor their child's use, safely dispose of any unused pills and talk about the inherent dangers of misuse, abuse and sharing.

Glenville State University's Pioneer Debate team competed in the National Educational Debate Association's (NEDA) Slippery Rock University tournament September 22-23.

The tournament included 74 individual competitors from seven schools: Slippery Rock, Grove City, Dayton, Wayne State, Glenville State, Capital, and IMSA North.

Pioneer Debate's two teams competed in the Novice Crossfire division. Rebekah Hypes (Sophomore Criminal Justice major) and teammate Sandra Crites (Sophomore Education major) finished 3rd overall.
