County Commission held Special Meeting Oct. 23rd

Calhoun County Commissioners met on Monday, October 23rd for a Special Meeting in an attempt to select a replacement for the vacant seat of Matt Walker. The two current Commissioners, President Craig Arthur and Kevin Helmick were both present. After the Pledge of Allegience, Arthur explained the process once again on how the Commission has to fill the vacant seat and that they since the two commissioners could not agree on an applicant that it went to the Republican Executive Committee for three names to choose from. Arthur went on to report the letter received from the Committee included the folling individuals for consideration were Eric Lupardus, Roger Propst and Dennis Spaur.

Commission President Craig Arthur made a motion to appoint Eric Lupardus, but the motion died for lack of a second. After a long pause, Kevin Helmick told those in attendance that he had promised to speak with someone prior to making a selection and had not had the opportunity to do so. He was confident he would have a nominee to strike during the final process on November 3rd, 2023.

At that time, the 15 days will have expired at which time Kevin Helmick will have the first strike being the senior commissioner and Craig Arthur will have the second strike. The last man standing will be the next Calhoun County Commissioner to fill that role until a new Commissioner is elected during the 2024 election process.

The only other item of business was the acceptance of a resignation by Water Board member Eric Cain for the Pleasant Hill Public Service District which passed affirmatively by both Commissioners. The next Calhoun County Commission meeting will be 9:00 a.m. on the 3rd of November, 2023.

1923, 100 YEARS: Grantsville School: The school law of West Virginia provides for medical inspection of all children attending school in the independent districts. In compliance with the above law Dr. J. A. Morford and Miss Grace Morgan made a thorough inspection of all pupils in the grades on last Thursday and Friday.

The eighth grade graduation class this year is made up of the following pupils: Lovie Reed, Gladys Marshall, Ruth Miller, Oma Harris, Mary Lutz, Mary Harris, Pearl Plaut, Edra Poling, Howard Waldo, Jr., Johnson Bennett, Robert Mollohan, Jr., McClellan Fleming, Thurl Proudfoot, Robert Offutt and Ronzel Law. These boys and girls must take the state diploma examination next spring and attain an average of eighty percent to enter high school.

Miss Perrie Jackson was unable to meet her classes Wednesday on account of a severe attack of indigestion. 1948, 75 YEARS: Military Rites for Private First Class Cogar: Full military rites will be conducted at the Pleasant Hill Methodist Church Sunday morning at 10 o'clock for Pfc. Fred Cogar, who was killed in France, September 24, 1944. Pfc. Cogar was born at White Pine the sone of Thomas and Rebecca Burrows Cogar and attended school at White Pine. He was inducted in the armed forces February 28, 1941. His mother preceded him in death a few years ago. He is survived by the following: His father, Thomas Cogar; and brothers and sisters, Lillie Gay Cogar of White Pine, Alma D. Locke of Toledo, Ohio, Roy Lafe and Lemmie Cogar, all of Grantsville, and Oda Cogar of South Parkersburg. The body arrived at the Stump Funeral Home Wednesday evening where it will remain until Sunday. The American Legion Post No. 82 and the V.F.W. will conduct the military services and the Rev. M.S. Burns will officiate. Burial will be in the Pleasant Hill Cemetery.

1973, 50 YEARS: Magic Lantern Show Race Track, Brick Yard at **Leafbank:** A magic lantern show away back in the fall of 1889 is one thing that Oak Stafford remembers about living Leafbank. A man by the name of Pat Crowe brought the magic lantern show to the Leafbank school and, draped a sheet over the blackboard for a screen. All of this made a big impression on the young boy who was staying with his grandmother, Aunt Jane Freshour.

Stafford also recalls the race track which was located at the mouth of Leafbank, in the bottom behind what is now the RF, Inc. plant. Horse traders would pass his house, often with old "plug horses" they were planning to trade. He also remembered the brink yard which was located at Leafbank, where thousands of bricks were once made.

Oct. 26, 1801: Jefferson County was established from a portion of Berkeley County by the Virginia General Assembly and named for Thomas Jefferson.

Oct. 26, 1934: Athlete Rodney Clark "Hot

Hundley earned first team All-American University.

He averaged 24.5 points per game and scored 2,180 points over his college career, ranking second in WVU history.



Oct. 27, 1879: Howard B. Lee was born in Wirt County.

He was elected state attorney general in 1924, and served for eight challenging years.

His term saw the impeachment of a state auditor, the lawlessness of Prohibition, and labor troubles in the coalfields.



Oct. 28, 1972: Brad Paisley was born in Glen Dale.

Paisleyhasreceived the Entertainer of the Year award from the Country Music Association and 14 Academy of Country Music Awards.

Oct. 29, 1861: Confederate commander Robert E. Lee ended his ill-fated western Virginia campaign.

His three months in the region were marked by rain, mud, inexperienced officers, diseases among the troops, and rampant criticism of his leadership.

Oct. 29-30, 2012: Following Hurricane Sandy, heavy wet snow fell across West



With accumulations approaching 40 inches, it surpassed all previously known October snowstorms.

Oct. 30, 1825: Randolph McCoy was born in Logan County. In 1878, McCoy's accusation against a cousin of Anderson "Devil Anse" Hatfield for stealing a hog set off a deadly series of events in the Hatfield-McCoy Feud.



Oct. 31, 1877: Herman Guy Kump was born in Capon Springs, Hampshire County.

He was the 19th governor of West Virginia, serving from 1933 to 1937.



Oct. 31, 1940: Gale Catlett, West Virginia University basketball player and coach, was born in Hedgesville. Catlett coached WVU to 13 20-win seasons before he retired in 2002.



Oct. 31, 1946: Labor leader Cecil Edward Roberts

Jr. was born on Cabin Creek, Kanawha County. A sixth-generation coal miner and a fiery orator, Roberts has served as president of the United Mine Workers of America since 1995.



Nov. 1, 1688: Morgan Morgan was born in Wales. For many years, Morgan was traditionally considered the first white settler of West Virginia. He settled in the Bunker Hill area in 1731, building a log house that still

Nov. 1, 1848: Israel Charles White was born in Monongalia County. White was West Virginia's first state geologist, appointed in 1897 and serving until his death in 1927, working without pay for all but two of those years.

Nov. 1, 1961: The first non-commercial radio station in West Virginia, WMUL-FM at Marshall University, began broadcasting.

As weeks go, this past one wasn't so bad. I actually spent a few evenings at home, which doesn't happen often these days. I look forward to coming home at the end of a long day to the candles in my windows, a fire in the fireplace, and my favorite blanket. This might mean I am getting old, but I'm okay with that too.

I did manage to get most of my schoolwork finished before I left the building on Friday. This meant staying late a few evenings, but it was worth it to have free time on the weekend. I had planned to spend Friday evening reading a new book, but my magic blanket and leather couch soon lulled me off to sleep after only a few chapters.

My Grandma Haught always said people need more sleep in the fall, so I am going to go with that as my excuse.

Saturday morning, I decided it was time to rearrange my bedroom. When the air-conditioner is on in the summer months, I have to move my bed to the opposite wall.

Now that the AC days are over, it is time to put my bedroom back to its original arrangement. While I am doing this, it is a good time to sweep, dust and clean the ceiling fan. I can now turn on the heater in my bedroom when it gets cold enough.

While I was doing all of these tasks, I got the laundry going. This way the sheets would be ready to put back on my bed when I was finished.

Once my bedroom was complete and the laundry put away, I turned my attention to making dinner. I had seen a recipe online for a burrito bowl that looked really good and easy to make. I had purchased all of the ingredients earlier in the week but just hadn't had the time to make it. I invited the Mlyneks to join me and then set to work.

The recipe is all made in one big pan on the stovetop. I started with some olive oil, diced onion and green peppers, and some garlic. Then I added ground beef and drained the extra fat off when the meat was cooked.

After that it was simply a matter of adding a can of drained black beans, a can of drained corn, a can of diced tomatoes with chilis, and a cup of brown rice. Next, I added some taco seasoning, red pepper flakes, and two cups of chicken broth. The lid went on the pan, and I left it to simmer for 20 minutes. Sunday was church in the morning and a church picnic and bonfire in the afternoon complete with a hayride.


A great time was had by all, and I was once again thankful for my church family. It is now time to go pack my lunch and start getting ready for the upcoming week.

Often, I'm asked about the meanings of words and phrases. The questions are genuine, and the definitions and origins are interesting. Yet, on their own, they're too short to make up a full column.

A few weeks ago, I began a series called "Miscellaneous Meanings." This is the third and final installment.

"Mayday!" This is a verbal distress call that has nothing to do with spring or a day in May. It comes from the French m'aidez, meaning "help me." It was adopted as an international distress call, similar to the telegraphy "S.O.S.," because it is brief, clear and generally unmistakable.

May Day. (See what I did there?) Unlike the entry above, this one DOES having something to do with a day in May. It is a European festival that originated in ancient times and celebrates the coming of summer on May 1.

Ouija (as in Ouija board). This was a popular game in the 1950s. The word is a combination of the French oui, meaning "yes," and the German ja, also meaning "yes." A "yes, yes" to cheer for the desired answer, I guess. The meaning was obscured by a bad pronunciation of the German part. As a result, we have "wee-jee," instead of "wee-yah."

"Stung to the quick." In this case, "quick" doesn't mean "speedy" or "fast," but is an older word meaning "living." In religious contexts, you may have heard something like "judge the quick and the dead," (I Peter 4:5). Quicksilver, the old name for mercury, was applied because the liquid moves and seems to be alive. Quicksand will swallow you as if it's alive. And, we refer to the sensitive area under the fingernail as the quick. So, when we are "stung to the quick," we are stung deeply, or hurt to the living tissue.

Biweekly. Does it mean twice a week or every two weeks? My dictionary tells me that it can mean both. The same goes with bimonthly. However, the preferred terms for twice a week and twice a month are "semiweekly" and "semimonthly" respectively.

There you have it! Three weeks' worth of miscellaneous meanings to satisfy your curiosity. Time to start building a new list!


Let's Talk Turkey by Linda Crawford

A variety of gobbler calls could be heard on wither side of the creek at various times. I enjoyed playing the call boxes from my brothers' collection. One of our family fiends who has been hunting for years had the best turkey hunt and shot the bigger tom ever just this past year.

Turkeys can "fly." It looks more like gliding to me. One of the old, old pine trees that looked some what like a ladder by the road was frequently loaded with perched turkeys. Me? I though every feather was a treat from God.

In Mexico, my son engineered a traditional American Thanksgiving for his co-workers some years back. A number of people there do the turkey thing but as many here, many serve a different menu but they do celebrate Thanksgiving. When cooking for family and friends, I always did the largest turkey for Thanksgiving then Christmas. They were always roasted breast down to keep breast moist. 

RED DEVILS HOST HAWKS IN **DOWNPOUR**

Last Friday night in Mount Zion, the Calhoun County Red Devils hosted the South Harrison Hawks in the eighth game of the 2023 season. The game was part of the National Guard Gridiron Series, and a recruiter was an honored guest on the home sideline. Unfortunately, there was also an unwelcome guest at the game: Mother Nature.

Friday had been a chilly, rainy day, and the night brought a cold downpour by game time. The contest was close through most of the first half, but the visiting Hawks pulled away in the second half to claim a 30-8 win.

The game started in a moderate rain that ceased midway through the first quarter. Calhoun received the opening kickoff, but netted only two yards in three plays and had to punt the ball away. After taking possession, the Hawks began a sustained drive – all rushing plays – that culminated in the first touchdown of the evening on a four-yard run.

Neither team was able to score again until halfway through the second quarter, when South Harrison picked off a Calhoun pass and returned it 59 yards to put the Hawks up 16-0.

Following the score, Joe Nelson took the Hawks' kickoff and returned it to the Calhoun 40-yard line. Facing a third and ten, Jayton Gibson took a handoff and completed a halfback pass to Logan Tingler, good for 48 yards and a first down. This was the first pass completed by either team, and would end up being the longest play from scrimmage during the game. Two plays later, Tyler Nelson scampered around the left end into the end zone for a Red Devil touchdown. Jayton Gibson hauled in a pass from Owen Taylor for the extra points, cutting South Harrison's lead to 16-8.

Following the score, South Harrison mishandled Gabe Waldron's kickoff. Jayton Gibson pounced on the loose ball and gave Calhoun possession at its own 46-yard line.

The Red Devils moved the ball to the Hawks' 19-yard line – thanks in large part to a 20-yard run by Owen Taylor and a 12-yard pass from Gibson to Brennan Carpenter – but were forced to turn the ball over on downs there. The half ended two plays later, but Calhoun County faced only a 16-8 deficit and had all the momentum on its side.

Unfortunately, that momentum disappeared along with the clear skies in an ugly third quarter. The Hawks took the second half kickoff and embarked on a scoring drive.

As the rains returned, the Hawks covered 47 yards in five plays to make it a 24-8 game. On its following possession, Calhoun turned the ball over on downs when a fourth down pass fell incomplete. The Red Devil defense held and forced a Hawk punt, but the ball bounced off a Calhoun player and South Harrison recovered to regain possession.

With the visitors nearing Calhoun's goal line, Owen Taylor intercepted a South Harrison pass at the 14-yard line to snuff the Hawks' scoring threat.

A mere three plays later, South Harrison returned the favor and intercepted a Calhoun pass, returning it 22 yards for another touchdown. The run for extra points failed, but the Hawks held a 30-8 advantage.

Calhoun County had time to run only one play before the third quarter ended at midfield. By this time the rain had become a downpour, and most everyone at the field was miserable. Players on both sides – frustrated by the weather, bad field conditions, multiple holding penalties and turnovers – had been venting those frustrations during the quarter. As the clock expired on the period of play, the head official warned everyone on the line of scrimmage that if the pushing, shoving and jawing didn't stop, he'd kick both teams off the

Both teams backed off in the fourth quarter, even though the precipitation did not. Calhoun County moved the ball to the South Harrison 19-yard line, but lost the ball there on a fumble. The Hawks ran 13 plays to eat up the remaining 8:40 of the game, putting an end to a very wet, sloppy game.

Unsurprisingly on such a slippery night, the game was filled with frequent fumbles, holding calls and the lack of a passing game. The two teams combined for eight fumbles – losing three – and committed a total of 16 penalties for 138 yards, many of which derailed promising drives. Neither starting quarterback completed a single pass; halfback Jayton Gibson had the only two completions of the night for either team. Sadly, the slick turf also claimed a victim during the game, as one of South Harrison's ball carriers had to be carted off the field to the ambulance after their third play of the game.

This Friday night, the Calhoun County Red Devils will host the Webster County Highlanders, who are celebrating their 50th season of football. This will be Homecoming for Calhoun County, so everyone is encouraged to come to the field to see old friends and to support the team. Kickoff is at 7:00.

In other words, the Companies propose to recover the \$91.9 million deferred from the last ENEC case and half of the pres-

ent under-recovery. The Companies request a four percent carrying charge for the remaining \$75,566,983. The proposed ENEC rates represent a 9.9% increase in total rates with an impact to the average residential

customer using 1,000 kWhs per month being an increase in monthly bills from \$120.20 to \$120.39 or 7.8%. This matter is scheduled for an evidentiary hearing on Thursday November 30, 2023.
