#### County Commission to Sell Animal Shelter Property, Supports UWF Park Improvements

The Calhoun County Commission met Wednesday, May 22, 2024, in the board room of the county courthouse with all commissioners present. Neither the air conditioning in the room nor the commission's new microphone system were in working order.

were in working order.

Following the call to order, pledge of allegiance, and approval of the April 16, 2024 meeting minutes, commissioners heard input from Danielle Wilson concerning the property purchased by the county for a county animal shelter, however, the same property was under new business on the agenda with a proposal to put it up for sale at public auction. The sale of the property was tabled, pending research relating to assessed value, and logistics of such a sale.

Commissioners then heard from American Medical Company, interested in purchasing the former armory near the Calhoun/Wirt County line on Route 5 for the automated production of up to ten "long-term chronic medications." According to AMC Chairman Crystal Mersh, the company would employ up to 500 people, with salaries close to \$110,000 a year. The company is "eyeing" a Davisville, WV location, and the Calhoun location. "They're looking for a pastoral setting," Mersh said. "But it's very much a long shot." Other board members from American Medical will be visiting Calhoun again soon to review the region and the former armory property. "We are going to give them a Calhoun welcome," said Commissioner Roger Propst.

Commissioners were presented reports and updates from Jason Wilson, Director of EMS, Donnie Pitts from Calhoun County Park, Sheila Burch of the Little Kanawha Development Corporation, and Sheriff Graham Knight. Knight reported officers would be receiving body cameras in June, and that with recent hirings had outgrown the space in the sheriff's office. Deputies are already working out of the courthouse Annex, which needs some upgrades. In addition, Knight noted that Deputy Sheriff Hannah Stevens had graduated from the police academy with accolades. Commissioners approved moving Deputy Stevens to full-time employment at \$22.50 an hour.

In new business, commissioners changed the scope of their Courthouse Facilities Grant to include new HVAC units, opening sealed bids to choose a vendor who will provide HVAC units for the bottom floor of the courthouse. The chosen bid was for \$68,250.

Commissioners were unable to certify election results, due to a state law that requires them to wait until all 55 counties in West Virginia had submitted their results to the state level. Because one West Virginia county had not yet submitted, the commission tabled the certification of Calhoun election results until a later date.

Charles Scott was available to the commission to elaborate on the last line item under new business: a funding request from the Upper West Fork Park. Park volunteers have recently upgraded the "Sycamore Room," a rental facility for private meetings and parties. Unfortunately, there currently are no sidewalks leading to that facility or the bathhouse. In addition, board members would like to relocate the basketball court to remove it from the flood plain and purchase new playground equipment. Commissioner Kevin Helmick commended the park on the Sycamore Room, which has paneling and shiplap boards cut from trees on the park property and sawed on a local sawmill. With funds available in the Parks and Recreation Fund, commissioners approved the park's request for \$73,940.00.

Processed \$702,959.45 in invoices, and approved the Financial Statement for April 2024.

The next meeting of the Calhoun County Commission will be held June 10, 2024 at 9 a.m.

#### West Virginia House passes Health, Human Services Funding In Special Session

By Charles Young, The Exponent Telegram, via The WV Press Association CHARLESTON, W.Va. — Following a bit of procedural maneuvering, the members of the West Virginia House of Delegates managed to pass a bill Tuesday allocating nearly \$200 million to fund the state's Health and Human Services departments next fiscal year.

The action marked the end of the first special legislative session of the year, which was called by Gov. Jim Justice largely to address the health care funding that had been stripped out during this year's regular session.

The House voted late Monday to reject the Senate's latest amendment to Senate Bill 1001 and requested the Senate recede from its position.

On Tuesday, the Senate adjourned without taking further action on the bill.

which effectively would have killed the bill.

House members then engaged in a series of votes rolling back previous

actions on the bill, allowing them to then pass the Senate's version.

The bill passed the House by a vote of 87-to-2, with 11 members absent. It

The bill passed the House by a vote of 87-to-2, w now goes to governor's desk for his consideration.

SB 1001 would add back \$5 million for the Department of Health and more than \$183 million for the Department of Human Services that were left out of the budget passed during the regular session.

House members expressed displeasure and dissatisfaction with having to pass the Senate's version of the bill, but said vital services such as the Intellectual/

Developmental Disabilities Waiver program would be threatened without the funds.

# WIC Cash Value Benefit for Fresh Produce Expands to Include Farmers Markets

The West Virginia WIC program's monthly cash value benefits for the purchase of fresh produce will be accepted at authorized farmers markets starting on June 1, 2024.

"The WIC Farm Market Direct mobile payment system has many benefits for both WV WIC participants and local farmers," said Heidi Staats, Director of the Office of Nutrition Services. "It simplifies the purchasing process for participants, reduces stigma by functioning like other mobile pay options, streamlines payments to farmers and farmers markets, provides real-time data for review and analysis, and ensures efficient and secure management of federal funds and benefits."

The WIC monthly cash value benefits for fresh produce are \$26 for child participants, \$47 for pregnant and postpartum participants, and \$52 for fully and partially breastfeeding participants. The FMNP maximum benefit is \$30 for eligible WIC participants to be spent from June 1 through October 31.

WV WIC and WIC FMNP participants will have a QR Code through the WICShopper Mobile App, allowing for electronic transactions with authorized farmers market vendors. Through WIC Farm Market Direct, authorized farmers scan the QR Code to initiate the purchasing process of fresh fruits and vegetables.

Farmers will then receive payment via direct deposit, which eliminates check processing fees. There are currently 136 farmers participating in the WV WIC program. A list of participating farmers and farmers markets is available on the WV WIC website at dhhr.wv.gov/WIC/Pages/Farmers-Market.aspx.

#### **WV Department of Education Offers New** Resource for Student Mental Health and Well-being

Charleston, W.Va. - As part of National Mental Health Awareness Month, the West Virginia Department of Education (WVDE) is pleased to announce a new resource available to families, educators, caregivers, and others to support student mental health. ParentGuidance.org, a 24/7 online platform, assists those who care for children to address and elevate mental health wellness and self-care. These tools are designed to enhance the human connections vital for school communities to thrive, and West Virginia is the first to offer them statewide.

Throughout the United States, Parent Guidance. org works with schools and their communities to empower families to support the mental health needs of children. In West Virginia, there is now free access to an array of tools including:

Regular one-on-one parent coaching with cognitive behavioral health coaches

On-demand parenting sessions taught by licensed therapists

"Ask a Therapist," a frequently updated question-and-answer forum

These resources are made possible through a three-year contract the WVDE has entered into with the national nonprofit The Cook Center for Human Connection to make ParentGuidance.org immediately available for West Virginia families. Across the country, 361 districts and 6,308 schools are using the organization's model offering more than 3.3 million families in 46 states access to

In 2021, the American Academy of Pediatrics declared a national emergency, noting that child and adolescent healthcare professionals are "caring for young people with soaring rates of depression, anxiety, trauma, loneliness and suicidality that will have lasting impacts on them, their families and their communities."

West Virginia, like the rest of the country, is facing a shortage of traditional mental health services. More than 700,000 people in the state live in communities that do not have enough mental health professionals. The WVDE will open access to underserved communities throughout West Virginia through ParentGuidance.org. Regardless of financial means, those needing help will have a direct line of support. Counties may also customize professional development sessions with The Cook Center to meet their individual needs. Bullying mitigation, isolation, and absenteeism are examples of nationally recognized programs available at reduced costs for counties.

"Our educators are experiencing several mental health behaviors in our children that they have not seen previously," said State Superintendent of Schools Michele L. Blatt. "ParentGuidance. org will provide resources that have never been reasonably available to many West Virginia families and communities. This will be a great asset and will make a difference in the lives of our children, the stability of our families, the mental health of teachers and school employees, and the progress of our schools."

"We are proud to collaborate with the West Virginia Department of Education for the benefit of West Virginia families. This shows that they truly care about the role of parents in their children's emotional well-being," said Cook Center for Human Connection President and CEO Anne Brown. #### There's a solution to the doctor shortage

Sadly, this is a common refrain in doctors' offices today. How many times have you tried to schedule a follow-up or a yearly physical, only to be given an absurd timeline?

That's because we're amid a nationwide physician shortage. The average wait time for a doctor's appointment in cities is 26 days.

Yet getting treated doesn't need to be this difficult. We may have a limited number of doctors, but there's another source of high-quality, professional care. Our hospitals and healthcare providers need to rely more on physician assistants -- who at the moment, are often barred from working at the level for which they're trained. That needs to change.

Physician assistants are licensed medical professionals who handle some routine duties that would otherwise require doctors' time. Their ranks are increasing: in the past decade, the number of boardcertified physician assistants grew by more than 75%.

As an emergency room doctor for more than 20 years, I witnessed their rising presence. I experienced, firsthand, how incredibly useful and even crucial physician assistants can be; they handled duties like suturing and treating minor injuries, freeing me up to focus on more complex cases.

This essential work takes some responsibility off doctors' plates and allows more patients to be treated sooner. But in many states, physician assistants aren't allowed to practice to the full extent of their training -- at the "top of their license" in industry speak. That means that even a physician assistant who had performed a procedure thousands of times is prohibited from doing

Neither observation nor research supports the notion that expanding scope of practice for physician assistants will hurt patients. And a study performed by Health Services Research found that primary care patients who see nurse practitioners have similar health outcomes compared to patients who see physicians.

For sure, it's tough to see a doctor. But physician assistants are helping patients every day. Let's ensure

they are able to continue doing so.



#### The CONservative Justices are Just Conning Us

"Once you have the courts, you can pretty much do what you want." Jason Stanley, How Fascism Works

The Supreme Court hearing arguments on presidential immunity in late April seemed like a game show in another language with rules the right-wing contestants chose not to grasp. Or maybe there was a new rule – you won points by straying the furthest from the question presented – in service to Donald Trump.

Those of us still hanging onto reality remember that Donald Trump, former US president, is charged by indictment with conspiracy to defraud the US by obstructing the certification of the 2020 election results, a conspiracy against rights.

On January 6 th, 2021, the forces that Trump had summoned to Washington overran the Capitol, smashing and looting, defecating in the building, and forcing members of the House of Representatives to flee to safe locations. The 2020 results were not certified until 2:00 a.m. the next morning.

Trump's lawyers argued that as president, Trump had complete immunity from all criminal prosecution. Their plan was simply to delay Trump's trial, at least until the 2024 election. No reasonable or knowledgeable legal commentator thought presidential immunity was the law, had ever been the law, or should be the law.

Because of the critical nature of the controversy for the country's next election and the necessity for speed, special prosecutor Jack Smith asked the Supreme Court for special dispensation to hear the case directly from the district court, bypassing the court of appeals. Instead, the Supreme Court gave Trump his first delay by sending the case to the DC Court of Appeals, which ruled quickly, concluding that "now-citizen" Trump had no executive immunity to protect him from this prosecution. The Supreme Court could have simply affirmed. But no, they set it for oral argument and held oral argument. A ruling could be months away. Delay, delay, delay.

The conservative Court has already given Trump much more delay than he could have hoped for. But the oral argument suggested that five and perhaps all six of the conservative justices were open to giving presidents immunity for official acts – and possibly finding that some of the crimes Trump is charged with were done in his capacity as president.

That would be a shocking result – an invention that would topple the rule of law, our three-part government, and ultimately democracy.

The question presented to the Court is obvious even to a layperson: is a former president immune from prosecution for attempting to remain in power after losing the election, thus depriving the country of the services of the rightful successor to the powers of the presidency? Can a coup be an official act of the presidency?

The right-wing justices seemed to fear a greater danger from unhinged prosecutors who sought to prosecute their political enemies. Apparently, they agree with their political master Trump that justice is generally a witch hunt. They seem oblivious that such revenge and retribution is precisely what Trump has promised in a second term. They even seemed to suggest that Jack Smith's prosecution, with the traditional safeguards of grand juries and judicial oversight, was itself dangerous and illegitimate.

By refusing to examine the case before them, they're not even pretending to be judges in the American legal system. Now they are nothing but partisan hacks doing Trump's business in service to the continuing power of the Republican party.

Fomenting, implementing, and conspiring to create a coup to stay in office, to steal an election, cannot in any sense of the law or the English language be part of the official duties of an American president. Unless, of course, you look at the problem from the close-minded viewpoint of six Republican enablers who are themselves immune from being removed, being overturned, or having their judgment rejected.

These justices are not "conservatives." They are simply "CONS," conning us into believing they are pronouncing the truth.



Charleston WV – The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to *e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia* at www.wvencyclopedia.org.

May 30, 1940: Smoke Hole Caverns in Grant County opened for tours. The cave is beautifully decorated with stalactites hanging in rows along the ceiling; the main room is called the "Room of a Million Stalactites."

May 31, 1946: Writer Meredith Sue Willis was born in Clarksburg and raised in Shinnston. Willis has authored books for children and on the subject of writing, and much of her adult fiction is

set in West Virginia.



June 3, 1856: Harriet B. Jones was born in Pennsylvania. After attending Wheeling Female College and graduating from the Women's Medical College of Baltimore, she opened a private practice

in Wheeling, becoming the first woman licensed to practice medicine in West Virginia.

**June 3, 1861**: The first land battle of the Civil War between organized troops took place in Philippi. About 3,000 federal troops drove about 800 Confederates from the town.

**June 3, 1936**: The first Strawberry Festival was held in Buckhannon. More than 6,000 spectators attended the festivities, which also included a parade of 30 princesses down Main Street.

Kessinger was among the most prolific and influential fiddlers of the 20th century, and one of West Virginia's most important traditional musicians.

June 5, 1859: A great frost killed crops in the Preston County fields. The

June 4, 1975: Clark Kessinger died in St. Albans, Kanawha County.

fields were replanted with hardy buckwheat, which was successful and became a staple crop, celebrated in the annual Buckwheat Festival in Kingwood.

**June 5, 1915**: Four young people were killed at the Rock Springs amusement park in Chester when the Old Mill ride caught fire.

Have you seen the pool?

It's fantastic. I wish I had a beach body. I wish I was younger. I wish I could swim. But I get a big negatory on all three counts.

Still the pool is fantastic.

Let me tell you a little about the new swimming pool. It was built on Wayne Underwood Field at the old Calhoun High School in Grantsville. And while there is still work going on getting all the amenities in place it is a world class pool ranking right up there with pools in any bigger town or resort area statewide.

The facility which is called The Saundra Johnson Aquatic Center held its grand opening Saturday and was covered by many of the state's biggest media members including the Charleston Gazette and television stations WSAZ, WCHS and WOWK. It was that big of a deal.

No, no because it was a fantastic facility, which it is, but because of where it is and its history including the struggle to get it built and the unlikeliness it would ever have been done.

First off, the aquatic center is in Grantsville, a declining town in rural central West Virginia. It is a town with a population of slightly more than 500 which has been oozing population since the 1960s and businesses and jobs for about the same length of time.

And the facility that was bought to get things under way was Calhoun County High School. It opened in 1923 with the first class graduating in 1924. It burned in 1942 with only he cut stone walls surviving. It closed when a new facility was opened at Mount Zion.

After that the school was bought and sold several times but never renovated or refurbished. Instead, it was ravaged by time, weather and vandals and when it finally was bought by somebody who was actually going to renovate it it was in a sorry condition with parts that were simply going to have to be torn down because they were beyond repair and renovation.

They have come a long way since then and frankly the aquatic center is just the cherry op top of the facility the 1982 Foundation has decided to name Avalon.

There is so much more to this facility than just a world class aquatic facility.

To wit: There will be enterprise zones, recovery zones, learning zones, restaurants, apartments, schools, sales areas, entertainment areas and a porch for sitting.

It will be something spectacular and it will be a draw bringing people to the area, which will help other businesses in the area if they are prepared for the influx of people.

As much as I hate the term "new beginning" because all beginnings are by reason new this may actually be a new beginning.

Let's take advantage of it.

After the wonderful opening day at the Saundra Johnson Aquatic Center, I was able to watch a rarity on television when I watched President Donald Trump speak to the Libertarian National convention.

It was interesting.

Trump was not heckled or derided and if the "mainstream" media or democrats say he was they are just lying but those two entities lying should not come as a surprise because lying along with stealing elections like they did in 2020 are what they do best.

His speech to the Libertarians was well received but they were not (as of right now) ready to endorse him as their presidential candidate although they probably did have to agree that the Libertarians and Republicans should work together since they have so many things in common.

Although I was the former Executive Chair of the Calhoun County Republican

Party the truth of the matter is I am probably more of a Libertarian. The problem is the Libertarian party is too small to win many elections.

Principles of Libertarians include:

Individualism. Libertarians see the individual as the basic unit of social analysis. Only individuals make choices and are responsible for their actions.

Individual Rights. Because individuals are moral agents, they have a right to be secure in their life, liberty, and property. These rights are not granted by government or by society; they are inherent in the nature of human beings.

The Rule of Law. Libertarianism is not libertinism or hedonism. It is not a claim that "people can do anything they want to, and nobody else can say anything." Rather, libertarianism proposes a society of liberty under law, in which individuals are free to pursue their own lives so long as they respect the equal rights of others.

Limited Government. To protect rights, individuals form governments. But government is a dangerous institution. Libertarians have a great antipathy to concentrated power, for as Lord Acton said, "Power tends to corrupt and absolute power corrupts absolutely."

Free Markets. To survive and to flourish, individuals need to engage in economic activity. The right to property entails the right to exchange property by mutual agreement.

The Virtue of Production. Much of the impetus for libertarianism in the seventeenth century was a reaction against monarchs and aristocrats who lived off the productive labor of other people. Libertarians defended the right of people to keep the fruits of their labor.

Peace. Libertarians have always battled the age-old scourge of war. They understood that war brought death and destruction on a grand scale, disrupted family and economic life, and put more power in the hands of the ruling class — which might explain why the rulers did not always share the popular sentiment for peace.

Anyhow I believe in those principles and that probably makes me a Libertarian.

MEMORIAL DAY OR VETERAN'S DAY: What is the difference? Basically, as a veteran (Veteran's Day) you served in the military while on Memorial Day you died for your country.

Maj. Gen. John A. Logan declared that Decoration Day should be observed on May 30. It is believed that date was chosen because flowers would be in bloom all over the country."

The passage of the National Holiday Act of 1971 by Congress made it an official holiday.

Veterans Day: This federal holiday falls on November 11 and is designated as a day to honor all who have served in the military. According to Military.com, Veterans Day began as Armistice Day to honor the end of World War I, which officially took place on November 11, 1918.

"In 1954, after having been through both World War II and the Korean War, the 83rd U.S. Congress – at the urging of the veteran's service organizations – amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting the word "Veterans," the site says. "With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars."

#### Social Media Can Impact Your Child's Mental Health

In 2023, U.S. Surgeon General Vivek Murthy issued an advisory warning that children using social media are susceptible to mental health and other safety risks, including feelings of isolation and depression. In fact, research shows that adolescents who spend more than 3 hours per day on social media face double the risk of poor mental health outcomes.

"Frequent social media use may be associated with distinct changes in the developing brain in the amygdala (important for emotional learning and behavior) and the prefrontal cortex (important for impulse control, emotional regulation, and moderating social behavior."

Social media apps use sophisticated algorithms to manipulate users into staying for longer periods by serving up content that is tailored to their interests. These algorithms may fuel large psychological issues as they can pick up on serious behaviors such as selfharm, eating disorders suicidal tendencies, etc., and then continuously funnel similar accounts toward that

Lawmakers are taking notice of these concerns. Regulators are calling on social media sites like Facebook, Instagram and TikTok to "tame toxic algorithms" to prevent kids from seeing content related to suicide, self-harm, eating disorders, and pornography. This content includes:

Pornographic content, and content which encourages, promotes, or provides instructions for suicide, self-harm, and eating disorders

Content which is abusive or incites hatred or bullying content

Content which encourages, promotes, or provides instructions for violence, dangerous stunts and challenges, and self-administering harmful substances.

#### Sen. Manchin Announces \$32.2 Million to **Expand Broadband Access**

U.S. Senator Joe Manchin (D-WV), member of the Senate Appropriations Committee, announced \$32,235,629 from the Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) for the West Virginia Department of Economic Development. This funding is made possible through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law's Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) program within the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) and will expand access to affordable, reliable broadband across West Virginia.

"I'm pleased ARC is investing more than \$32 million to ensure more West Virginians have access to dependable, high-speed internet," said Senator Manchin. "I proudly secured this historic funding in our Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to help equip every family and business in the Mountain State with the tools they need to thrive in the modern digital economy. As a member of the Senate Appropriations Committee, I will continue working with federal, state, and local officials to ensure everyone has broadband access in West

These funds will be used in conjunction with the \$1.2 billion previously allocated to West Virginia through the BEAD program, based on the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) updated broadband coverage maps. Senator Manchin successfully fought to update these maps for years to ensure they accurately reflect coverage in West Virginia.

#### **Justice Calls for Special Session of the West** Virginia Legislature

CHARLESTON, WV — Gov. Jim Justice has issued a proclamation calling for the West Virginia Legislature to convene in Special Session at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 19, 2024.

"The special session I'm calling today isn't just really important; it's critical to the health and well-being of some of our state's most vulnerable people. In my book, restoring budgets for our Departments of Health and Human Services is the most pressing item on the call. We have hundreds of thousands of people in West Virginia who are relying on us right now, including foster kids and those with disabilities. If we don't restore these funds immediately, it would be a real tragedy with real consequences," Gov. Justice said.

"While funding for those departments is most necessary, we need several others to get across the finish line. We've seen unbelievable surpluses in West Virginia over the last few years and need to use them to take care of our roads while improving access to education. When people and businesses are looking to move to West Virginia, they first ask about the roads and schools. We must continue providing additional funds for highway maintenance and school choice through the successful Hope Scholarship. We have been on a rocketship ride of growth, and this will only help bring more people to our state. Finally, we need to secure funding for a new stateof-the-art agricultural laboratory, which should be located on the campus of West Virginia State University, as I recommended during my last State of the State Address.

"I've said time and time again that I would call a special session as soon as I heard that lawmakers were ready. I know additional matters need to be taken up, but for now, these are the issues they are ready to address, so I'm calling them in for a special session."

The special session will be held during the May Interim Committee meetings to avoid incurring additional taxpayer expense.

The proclamation lists 15 items for the Legislature to consider and act upon, mostly supplemental appropriations and a few pieces of new legislation that have been requested.

One item will provide over \$80 million to the State's colleges and universities to help provide needed funding for students affected by the Federal Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) crisis. In April, the Governor declared a State of Emergency to temporarily suspend the requirement for students to complete the FAFSA in order to qualify for the state's largest financial aid programs.

"This money will be used to backfill the mess created by the federal government," Gov. Justice said. "Hopefully, they fix it soon, but we aren't going to wait for them and let our colleges fail. Our students and faculty deserve stability and support, and we're committed to providing it. This funding will ensure our students have peace of mind and our state's institutions can serve our communities effectively."

Some of the supplemental appropriations include:

\$150 million for highway maintenance and equipment.

\$50 million for new State agricultural lab facilities at West Virginia State University.

\$10 million for the Posey Perry Emergency Food Bank Fund.

\$27.3 million for Hope Scholarship funding.

\$2 million to the Department of Veterans Assistance for medical expenses.

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#### Exurban **Communities Among Nation's Fastest Growing Places**

In a possible sign of the COVID-19 pandemic's lasting impact, the country's fastest-growing places are increasingly likely to be far-flung exurban communities on the outer margins of metro areas, according to July 1, 2023, population estimates released today.

Luke Rogers, a demographer in the U.S. Census Bureau's Population Division said, "With many more people of working ages now able to work from home at least some of the time, it's likely that some people are more willing to live further away from their place of employment than they would have in the past."

Fewer of the fastest-growing places between 2022 and 2023 were inner suburbs than in 2019 before the pandemic, and more were on the far outskirts of metro areas — 30, 40, and even more than 60 miles away from the largest city's downtown.

"While the Census Bureau doesn't define exurbs, we tend to think of them as far outer suburbs of metro areas, and they often have a mix of urban and rural character," said Luke Rogers, a demographer in the Census Bureau's Population Division. "Exurbs have sometimes been among the most rapidly growing communities, but this appears to be even more true now than before the pandemic."

Multiple factors are likely behind the increased growth of exurbs. Among them: Rising housing costs after the start of the pandemic, which drove some people farther away from cities toward exurbs in search of cheaper homes. Greater opportunities to work from home also likely contributed. Before the pandemic, telework and remote work options were much less common.

"With many more people of working ages now able to work from home at least some of the time, it's likely that some people are more willing to live farther away from their place of employment than they would have in the past," Rogers said.

Using an approach outlined in a 2010 Census Special Report on Core-Based Statistical Areas, the U.S. Census Bureau defines "downtown" as the location of city hall in the largest city in a metro or micro area. We then calculated the distance from the center of each of the 500 places to that point.

There were more exurbs — places as far as 60-plus miles outside a metro area's largest city — among the nation's fastestgrowing places in 2023 than in 2019, the year before the pandemic hit. At the same time, there were fewer fast-growing places within a 10-mile radius and a 10-to-20mile radius. Numeric population change was similar: collectively, population gains increased in the areas farthest out and slowed within 20 miles of the city center.

Patterns of population growth and distribution regularly evolve, and it is too soon to tell whether the recent surge of exurban growth is a temporary blip or a more enduring phenomenon. Demographers and geographers will continue to monitor the spatial dimensions of population growth and decline for the nation's 19,000-plus cities and towns for insights.



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#### **Are tax cuts coming?** It's complicated.

When West Virginia lawmakers passed a wide-ranging tax cut in 2023, much of the attention focused on the immediate 21.25% income tax reduction. But in recent months, the main topic has turned to a "trigger" added to the law as a way to cut taxes even more in the future if the state hits certain revenue

more in the future if the state hits certain revenue goals.

That trigger, which could eventually eliminate West Virginia's income tax entirely, has already added new wrinkles to the state's budgeting process, fueling calls by some lawmakers to tighten the purse strings. That's despite the state already maintaining relatively flat budgets that have not accounted for inflation or increased agency needs in the past few years.

A review of the trigger and what it means for the state's budget could be a topic of a May special session, which the governor is expected to call on Sunday. In the meantime, it is still unclear if the state will hit the first trigger in August. If it does, the state will either need to collect more revenue next year to maintain a balanced budget or potentially cut expenses, a challenge that could arrive as other parts of the 2023 tax cuts continue to go into effect.

Here's what you need to know about the tax trigger and how it might impact the state's revenue moving forward:

What does the tax trigger do?

In 2023, West Virginia lawmakers approved a tax cut package that included an immediate 21.25% cut in the personal income tax, a series of property tax cuts, and a vehicle tax rebate.

But it also had a tax trigger, which is set to go into effect any time the revenue in a given year passes the general fund revenue collected in 2019, adjusted for inflation.

If the state clears that benchmark, the income

the general fund revenue collected in 2019, adjusted for inflation.

If the state clears that benchmark, the income tax rate would automatically be cut by a certain percentage, depending on the current excess collections and how much personal income tax revenue the state collected the year before. It can't exceed 10% in any given year. But the law also allows the state to "march to zero" on the income tax—so if the state were to consistently hit the trigger.

— so if the state were to consistently hit the trigger, the income tax could eventually be totally eliminated.

Lawmakers argued last year that the tax trigger is smart policy, allowing the state to keep an eye on revenue and only cut taxes more when it has money to spare.

But critics of the trigger argue that this isn't exactly how things would work, pointing out that the state has now automatically dedicated excess revenue to tax cuts, even when there might be more pressing matters.

What does the trigger mean for the state budget? The tax trigger creates a situation where the state will ultimately be forced to keep spending at or relatively close to current levels, even if there are increased needs.

increased needs.

The initial wave of tax cuts was already estimated to remove \$750 million in revenue from the state. And if the tax trigger does fully eliminate the income tax in the future the state will be taking almost \$2 billion in personal income tax revenue off of the table, with no dedicated source to replace it. This could give lawmakers a reason not to increase funding for key services like higher education, childcare access, and Medicaid, which have already been stretched thin.

"What's becoming clear now is that the mechanism of the triggers being automatic, like no additional action has to be taken for tax cuts to be triggered, it puts those at the front of the line in front

of spending needs," said Kelly Allen, the executive director of the West Virginia Center on Budget and Policy. "So, it doesn't matter that child care providers are saying that they're at risk of closing their doors, it doesn't matter that we are facing down a Medicaid

Similar criticisms have been raised against other states that have recently passed tax triggers. In 2017, the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities In 2017, the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities noted that income tax cut triggers were becoming increasingly common at the state level, allowing state leaders to gain political popularity for cutting taxes in the future without actually having to deal with the resulting budget issues that could result. The organization has also argued that more broadly, weaken state revenues by large and growing amounts over time, limiting these states' ability to maintain support for schools and other vital public services."

"States nationwide have been on a tax-cutting spree over the past three years coming out of the pandemic and subsequent recovery," Wesley Tharpe, the organization's senior advisor for state tax policy, told Mountain State Spotlight last year. "Many of these cuts are extremely costly and benefit houses at the top of the income scale, and West Virginia is really a cornerstone example of this trend."

Why are lawmakers disagreeing over the trigger

after passing it?
Still, the exact impact of the trigger is somewhat unclear. This August will be the first test of whether the state will hit the trigger and what, if any, further tax cuts will result.

"There's too many variables out there to make a good, firm analysis on the trigger," Mark Muchow, the deputy secretary of the state Department of Revenue, told lawmakers during interim meetings in April, adding that the state won't have final numbers until June.

Even so, the trigger has already had a significant impact in the state Capitol. Earlier this year, several key debates over the state budget revolved around the need to keep finances tight for the sake of avoiding any conflict with future tax cuts that could hit in the middle of the year. That push was largely led by Senate Finance Committee Chairman Eric Tarr, R-Putparn, who argued that the state needed to keep R-Putnam, who argued that the state needed to keep spending in check with the trigger on the horizon.

When it comes to the trigger: "We're going to have a decision to make: Do we go ahead and pay that tay cut out to West Virginians or do you postnore."

tax cut out to West Virginians, or do you postpone it?" Tarr told West Virginia Watch last month. "If we hit that trigger, I'm not inclined to say 'no' to giving a tax cut we promised."

Tarr did not respond to emailed questions about the income tax trigger and if the issue should be revisited in a future special session, as some lawmakers floated earlier this year.

But other state officials, including the governor,

But other state officials, including the governor, haven't been as cautious.

"Let's do it again," Gov. Jim Justice said last month, calling for additional tax cuts. "I mean, let's just keep doing it. The more money we put in the hands of our people — it's their money in the first place — but the more money that we put in the hands of our people, the better things happen."

With so much uncertainty around the potential impact of cutting the personal income tax — which contributes roughly 40% of the state budget, there's concern that the state might be digging itself into a hole that will be tough to escape. If that happens, it will be after Justice leaves office early next year. The governor, who is term-limited, just secured the The governor, who is term-limited, just secured the Republican nomination for the U.S. Senate running on a platform that includes his state income tax cuts.
