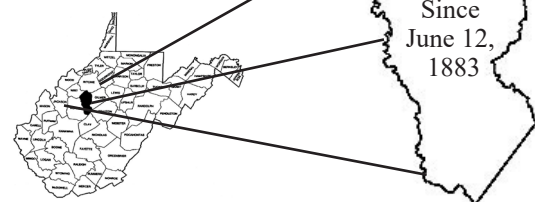

Calhoun commission votes to issue conserve water advisory

 Ironically it rained Sunday night ...
 The Calhoun County Commission had called an emergency meeting for noon at the courthouse to discuss plans for what steps needed to be taken to handle a water emergency brought on by a lengthy drought that has taken hold in West Virginia.
 Here in Calhoun County the web site www.drought.gov which is administered by National Integrated Drought Information System (NIDIS) has said we are

at a drought level D4 which is the worst (highest) level listed. It's called an exceptional drought and only occurs every so many years.
 This is one of those years.
 And while the rains Saturday and Sunday were nice cooling the air and watering the lawns they were not enough to refill dry wells and replenish needed water supplies.
 That's where the county commission stepped in.
 According to Jean Simers the Calhoun County

Clerk, “the Calhoun County Commission is issuing a conserve water advisory for all residents of Calhoun County. Please conserve water as much as possible due to the low levels of water available. The Commission is working with the Emergency Services to provide bottled water and water for household use for those in need. Please contact Kelli Barr, E911 Director, at 304-354-0911 or 304-354-9271 for more information.”
 The drought has had other effects on Calhoun County as the lack of moisture has turned the woods tinder dry.

Homecoming weekend sets up festivities and football

 For the very same reasons it is the best of times and those fun time diversions sometimes defer the attention of the football team from the game coming up.
 And a very young Calhoun football team does not need distractions as it prepares for Friday's 7 p.m. game against a 2-1 Tolsia team that the Red Devils have never played before.
 Tolsia has 46 players, 13 of which are seniors and six are juniors. The Rebels were off this past week while Calhoun played against maybe the best team in Class A when it lost to Wahama, 61-13.
 Thus far the Rebels have lost to Wayne 21-7 in the season opener but bounced back to beat Paden City 25-0 and Mount View 48-6. Tolsia is ranked 16th in the WVSSAC computer ratings.
 But before that there will be the Homecoming Parade. This year it is in Arnolds-

burg and is part of the Molasses Festival activities.
 The parade route will begin at the Dollar General in Arnoldsburg, traveling Rt. 33/119, going past Calhoun Banks and the Arnoldsburg Park, before ending at Stump Funeral Home. The parade line up will begin at 2:00 p.m. and the parade will start at 2:30 p.m.
 After that the action shifts to Mount Zion where the Red Devils will play host to the Tolsia Rebels and the 2024 queen and her court will be honored as will certain graduating classes which have gathered for the game.
 Following the game, win or lose, the celebration continues as various graduating classes will hold mini reunions on Saturday and Sunday.
 Then on Saturday night the big event – at least for the students is the Homecoming Dance.
 This year students are invited to “Get your Dancing Shoes On!”
 The Homecoming Dance 2024 will be on Saturday from 7pm-10pm for grades 9-12 here at CCMHS. This is a formal dance, no jeans, dirty boots or casual attire will be allowed.

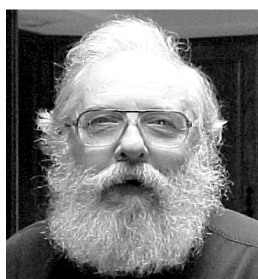

ONE OF MY RELATIVES: This week for our 11th Calhoun Hall of Fame we are listing one of my relatives or ancestors to be more exact.

But that is not the reason The Rev. William Burns is being nominated. No, he is being nominated because he was a builder on Baptist churches here in central West Virginia, many of which are still in existence.

This is a brief biography of The Rev. William Burns and Florinda W. (Stump) Burns.

Again, being related to me is not what makes him famous and a pillar of Calhoun County's religious development.

The Rev. William and Florinda Stump Burns established several churches in Calhoun and the region, including Enon Baptist where he is buried. He was also the pastor of the First Baptist Church of Grantsville (1890-1900). He died in 1910 and is buried at Enon.

His brother Anderson Burns established the Oneida Baptist Institute in Kentucky.

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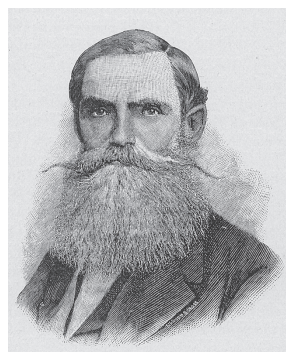

Sept. 26, 1816: David Hunter Strother was born in Martinsburg. He was an artist and an author who used the pen name "Porte Crayon."



Sept. 26, 1863: The Great Seal of West Virginia was adopted by the legislature. The seal, which has remained unchanged, was designed by Joseph H. Diss Debar.



Sept. 27, 1914: Author Catherine Marshall was born in Johnson City, Tennessee. Her family moved to West Virginia and lived in Keyser during the late 1920s and the 1930s. Her best-loved novel, *Christy*

(1967), was based on her mother's girlhood in the southern mountains.

Sept. 28, 1955: Labor activist Sarah "Mother" Blizzard died at age 90. Blizzard was deeply involved in the United Mine Workers of America, from



the organization's early beginnings in the late 19th century.

Sept. 29, 1861: The Kanawha Valley experienced severe flooding. The Kanawha River



reached 46.87 feet in Charleston, more than 16 feet above flood stage.

Sept. 29, 1927: Artist June Kilgore was born in Huntington. She was an abstract expression-



ist painter who spent 30 years as an art professor at Marshall University.

Sept. 30, 1832: Social activist Anne Reeves Jarvis was born in Virginia. Years later, in Taylor County, she organized Mother's Day Work Clubs to improve health conditions and to nurse Union and Confederate soldiers during the Civil War. She was the inspiration for Mother's Day, first celebrated in Grafton in 1908.

Sept. 30, 1872: Educator Fannie Cobb Carter was born in Charleston. She organized the teacher-training department at what is now West Virginia State University, led the State Industrial Home for Colored Girls in Huntington, and was director of adult education in Kanawha County.

Sept. 30, 2010: Facing an economic downturn and foreign competition, Wheeling-LaBelle Nail Company closed. The company was founded in 1852 as LaBelle Ironworks. By 1875, Wheeling was known as the Nail



City, and La Belle was the city's leading nail producer.

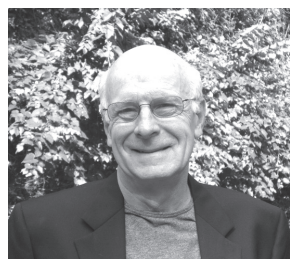
Oct. 1, 1896: Rural



Free Delivery began in West Virginia's Eastern

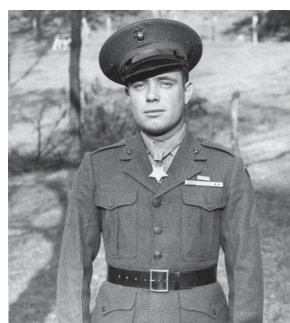
Panhandle. Before this, there was no rural mail delivery, although more than half the country's citizens lived in rural areas.

Oct. 1, 1950: West Virginia Poet Laureate Marc Harshman was born in Indiana, graduated from Bethany College, and later moved to Wheeling. He is a noted storyteller, chil-



dren's author, and poet who wrote and recited his poem "A Song for West Virginia" for our state's sesquicentennial in 2013.

Oct. 2, 1923: Hershel "Woody" Williams was born in Quiet Dell. During World War II, Williams neutralized seven concrete pillboxes at the



Battle of Iwo Jima. Prior to his death in 2022, he was the last surviving Medal of Honor recipient from World War II.

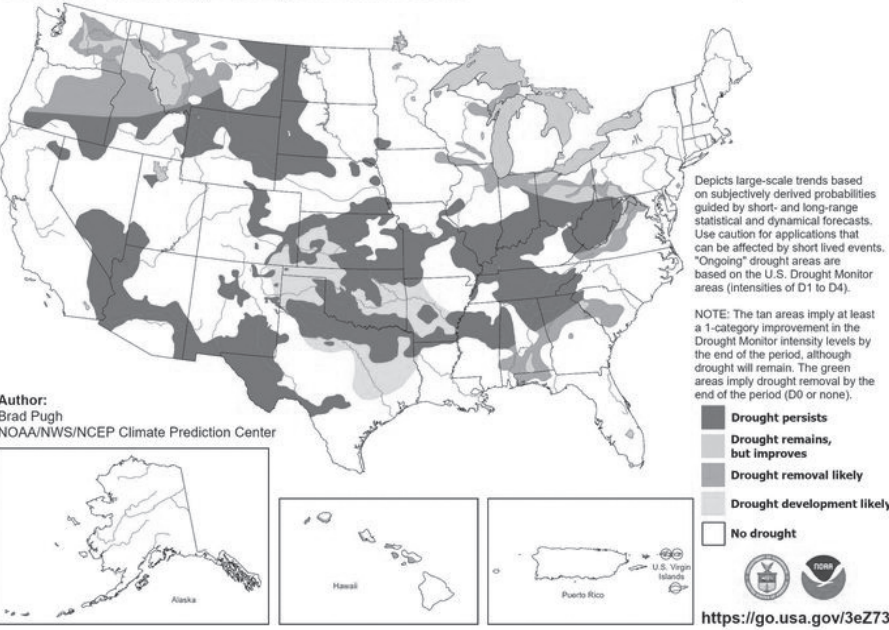

Investigation and suspension of increase in water rates and charges as a result of petitions filed in accordance with W.Va. Code §24-2-4b.

PROCEDURAL ORDER

This order sets the matter for a hearing on jurisdiction. It also requires the Grantsville Municipal Water Department (Grantsville) to file certain documents prior to the hearing.

On September 3, 2024, Grantsville adopted an ordinance increasing its water rates and charges by approximately 60%. Grantsville claimed financial distress and requested that the rates be effective immediately.

On September 10, 2024, the Commission received a protest petition apparently signed by not less than 25% of Grantsville's water customers.

On September 13, 2024, the Commission initiated a municipal appeal proceeding, made Grantsville a respondent, waived the 45 day waiting period and the 120 day suspension period, allowing the rates to take effect immediately subject to refund. The Commission also referred the matter, requiring a decision on or before December 23, 2024. The Commission required Staff to submit its final report on or before November 25, 2024. The Commission ordered notice of the proceeding to be published.

By Procedural Order issued September 16, 2024, Grantsville was required to make any objections it had to jurisdiction within ten days. The Order also set the matter for hearing on the merits on December 2, 2024.

On September 20, 2024, Grantsville objected to jurisdiction arguing that there were not enough legitimate signatures of water customers on the petition to create jurisdiction.

DISCUSSION

The matter should be set for a prompt hearing on the issue of jurisdiction.

Grantsville indicated that it had 375 water customers in its September 20, 2024 filing. In order to facilitate the hearing, Grantsville should be required to file two lists of the 375 customers with the Commission on or before September 30, 2024. One list shall be alphabetized by the customer's last name for residential customers and by business name for commercial or other customers. The second list of the 375 customers shall be alphabetized by the service location address.

Grantsville should also be required to post the attached notice of hearing at its office.

ORDER

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that Grantsville file with the Commission no later than September 30, 2024, two lists of its 375 water customers. One list shall be alphabetized by last name of residential customers and business name for all others. The list shall include the name of the customer, account number and service location. The second list shall be alphabetized by service location but include the same information as on the first list.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the matter be, and hereby is, set for hearing on October 3, 2024, at 10:30 a.m., in the County Commission Courtroom, Calhoun County Courthouse, Main St., Grantsville.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Grantsville publish notice of this hearing by posting a copy of the notice in a prominent place in its office. It shall leave the posting up until after the hearing occurs.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Executive Secretary's Office serve this Order upon Commission Staff by hand delivery, upon all parties of record who have filed an e-service agreement with the Commission by electronic service and upon all other parties by U.S. First Class Mail. It shall also serve Eric Lupardus, 1897 Hattie Run Road, Grantsville, WV 26147.

November 5th General Election officially began on Sept. 20th

The Nov. 5 General Election officially began on Friday, Sept. 20, as county clerks began fulfilling absentee ballot requests.

Under State Code, clerks are directed to begin mailing absentee ballots through the United States Postal Service to voters who have met the requirements for absentee voting. Eligible voters include registered voters who cannot make it to the polling place during the entire early-voting period and Election Day, such as those who are on personal or business travel. Eligible voters must apply for an absentee ballot with their county clerk. A list of excuses for voting absentee can be found here.

The deadline to apply for an absentee ballot is the close of business on October 30, but eligible voters should apply as soon as possible to ensure any delays in the Postal Service do not affect their ability to vote.

West Virginia Code also allows a limited group of voters to vote using an electronic ballot transmission system. Certain deployed military voters, overseas voters, voters with a physical disability that prevents them from voting in person and absentee without assistance, as well as first responders called away on the eve of the election, can choose to participate using the state-approved transmission system. Learn more about this electronic option at GoVoteWV.com.

The General Election began on Friday, said Secretary Warner. "We've made it

easier than ever for registered West Virginia voters to participate in the election and cast a ballot."

Warner reminds eligible citizens that Oct. 15 is the voter registration deadline for the General Election. That is the same deadline for currently registered voters to update their registration if they've moved or changed their name since they voted last. Register or update your registration at GoVoteWV.com.

Working with all 55 county clerks, Warner said that his office has helped register more than 340,000 new voters in the last seven years.

"Confidence in West Virginia elections has never been higher," Warner said. "My office has worked with the West Virginia legislature as well as our county clerks and political party leaders throughout the state to make it easy to vote and hard to cheat."

Warner said that he wants to remind citizens that his office takes all complaints regarding election law violations very seriously. He said that his Investigations Division reviews all complaints made to his office, and those with actionable allegations will be investigated. All election law investigations are confidential and cannot be made public, including identities of complainants and witnesses. To file an election law complaint, complete the Elections Complaint Form.

ity to work in stressful environments, ignore distractions, and provide therapy to people with diverse backgrounds and circumstances.

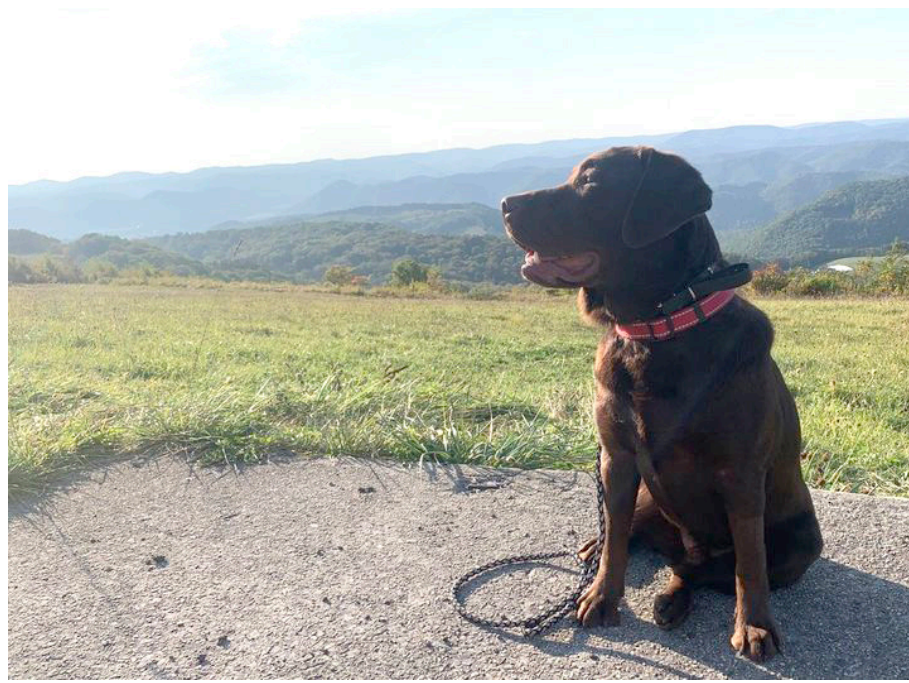

Gov. Justice announces elk management tours return to Chief Logan State Park

Gov. Jim Justice announced the much-anticipated return of Elk Management Tours, offering an exciting opportunity for nature enthusiasts and wildlife lovers to witness the majestic elk population in their natural habitat. Historically, tickets have sold out quickly so those interested are encouraged to book their tour.

Under Gov. Justice's Administration, the Elk Restoration Project has flourished. Several elk have been introduced to the Tomblin Wildlife Management Area in Logan County, and the population is now estimated to be 130-140. Additionally, the WVDNR has recorded 60 native elk calf births since launching its Elk Restoration Project.

These four-hour guided tours, which start and end at Chief Logan State Park, are led by knowledgeable park staff and take visitors through the picturesque landscapes of West Virginia's wilderness. Tours provide a unique and educational experience through the Tomblin Wildlife Management Area (WMA) in Logan County.

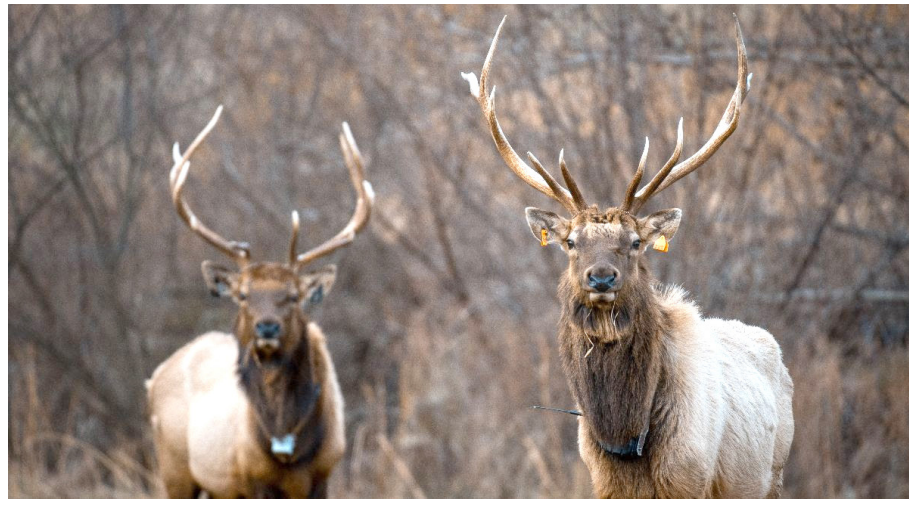
The WVDNR reminds people that the

tour does include a short hike from the van to the viewing area. Guests may get an opportunity to observe these magnificent creatures while learning about their history, behavior, and ongoing conservation efforts to protect this iconic species. However, a sighting is not guaranteed as the elk roam freely around the WMA.

The WVDNR launched its Elk Restoration Project in 2016 with the release of 24 elk acquired from the Land Between the Lakes. Since 2018, the WVDNR has introduced 95 elk (53 from Kentucky and 42 from Arizona) to the Tomblin Wildlife Management Area in Logan County.

To raise awareness about its elk restoration project, the WVDNR has of-

fered guided elk tours in Logan County, where participants can learn more about the history of elk in West Virginia and get a chance to see elk in a natural setting. Tours are offered in September and October each year and often sell out.
