Shooting incident triggers lockdown of CMHS

An incident Monday morning triggered a rapid response from the Calhoun County Schools administration and showed the transparency with which it works.

At approximately 9:40 a.m. Calhoun County Dispatch received a phone call from the address of 7418 South Calhoun Hwy. stating that a man had a gun and was shooting it off.

At that time Calhoun County Middle High School

was placed on a lockdown as a preventative measure due to a police situation near the school.

The lockdown was removed shortly afterward when an all clear was given by authorities on the scene.

A little later the school administration said, “Calhoun Middle High School was placed on a quick lockdown following the reports of a man shooting a gun a short distance from the school location.”

According to reports the man had fired several shots and when police arrived, he fired in their direction before throwing his weapon on the ground.

Bernard Gay Whipkey, 70, was arrested and charged with two (2) counts of Attempted Murder and six (6) counts of Wanton Endangerment with a Firearm. He was sent to West Virginia Central Regional Jail on a \$500,000 bond.



The commission stepped up, but it should have done it earlier

Although I am glad the county commission stepped up to help the citizens of the county, especially those not hooked up to one of the three public service districts – Grantsville, Mount Zion and Pleasant Hill – with their water shortages.

But my question is why did they not do this a little sooner since we have been under a D4 drought designation for a good while?

It would seem to me that an ounce of prevention may have been able to prevent a pound of cure being needed. It seems we could have prepared and been ahead of the curve, but we were not.

Now I know the weather is hard to predict but there is long range weather trends that can be accessed and in a county with such an agrarian base is should have been done. Especially in areas where the installation of public water has been promised but not accomplished.

It should be a goal of the water districts and the county and city government to install or at least offer to install public water to every home and business in the county and to connect with public water systems in every surrounding county – Clay, Braxton, Gilmer, Ritchie, Wirt and Roane – so that each could serve as a backup for each other.

That is just the intelligent thing to do especially if central West Virginia becomes a growth area which it may become.

We need to be ready.

I used to live in Bismarck, N.D., where the average precipitation was 19.1 inches per year.

Here in West Virginia our nearest large city is Parkersburg where the average precipitation is 44.2 inches per year. Charleston, for those on the southern end of the county, is 46.2.

Both cities have twice as much rainfall as Bismarck, yet that area was not bothered by water shortages. At least not when I lived there. That’s because the North Dakotans looked at the situation and prepared accordingly.

As a matter of fact with the possible exception of Aiken, S.C., no place other than here suffered much during a drought.

The emergency meeting of the commission to address the water shortage is to be lauded but it really needs to be only a first step into getting water to everybody in the county who wants it as soon as possible.

By the way the commission sound man needs to take a look at the system since I could not hear either Roger Propst or Craig Arthur when they talked, I could hear Kevin Helmick quite well but it almost seemed as if the other two weren’t even there.

I know we are going with a tight budget, but dog gone it there is enough money to fix the sound system.

Ironically, once the commission took action the skies seemed to open with blessed rain coming down with enough intensity and enough frequency to serve as the beginning of the end of the current drought.

Hopefully the rain will continue, and the drought will be over.

Its sort of like the “well, I just washed the car today” kind of rain triggered by the commission finally taking action, but we will take it and thank the Lord for it.

GOOD BUT SCARY IDEA: After watching with something more than just a bit of casual interest this year since my new job has me taking a deeper look at happenings in Calhoun County with more than just a passing glance has brought me to ponder a few things.

What kind of things?

Things like why don’t we have a Boy or Girl Scout Camp, or for that matter do we even have Boy Scouts (sorry, Scouts, I forgot about the new politically correct name) Girl Scouts? Or Brownies or Cub Scouts? Can you get Girl Scout cookies somewhere? Is Camp Kootaga still in op-

eration? I know they shut down Allohak Council (Parkersburg) and merged it into the Buckskin Council (Charleston) a few years back.

They did this while my grandson Chris Kirkland was still an active scout.

It was quite a controversy at the time. At the risk of sparking another controversy I have a couple more questions.

First, why don’t we have a Four H camp somewhere? I know when my daughter was in the 4H they held the summer camp at Glenville, and it was a nice camp. But why doesn’t Calhoun have one? Were there ever any plans for one?

Next question why don’t we have a county fair?

This one would be easy to do. This past week showed us just how easy when he had the FFA (Future Farmers of America) members animal judging and sales and the then Molasses Festival happening back-to-back in seamless fashion.

We could easily merge the two and add a few more things and have an honest to goodness Calhoun County Fair if we so desired. We could even continue to call it the Molasses Festival if people so desired while it would be the de facto county fair.

It strikes me as an idea that could bring Calhoun County together and that is not a bad thing.

NUMBER 12 KNOWN TO ME: Lester McCumbers was born in 1921 in southern Calhoun County, and carried on a rich tradition of fiddling, singing and guitar playing that thrived in his family for generations.

I knew him and some of his kids as they were about my age and were members of my class at Calhoun High School.

I really didn’t think of them as anything more than schoolmates although I knew they were musicians.

But they were more than that I learned later on they were purveyors of traditional mountain music that had been passed down from generation to generation among their family and friends and folks that lived in their neighborhoods since transportation back then was very limited.

Lester McCumbers performed widely for more than 60 years with old-time and bluegrass music groups at concerts, contests, festivals and radio.

He kept music as an important part of his life, developing a personal style of playing and singing marked by sincerity, drive and emotion. McCumbers continued to pass on knowledge to others, including family members, apprentices and workshop participants.

He and his wife Linda had known each other since childhood. They were married in 1937 and raised nine children.

For a while in the mid-1960s, they hosted a weekly radio show on WSPZ (now WVRC) in Spencer. The couple’s first CD recording, “Old Timey,” was released in 2002 and featured 26 of their old-time fiddle tunes and songs.

He also made fiddles, sometimes using local woods.

He used the “pancake grip” when holding his fiddle resting the fiddle against his chest rather than under his chin, with the palm of his hand flat against the bottom of the fiddle’s neck.

McCumbers often performed with his wife and children, as well as banjo player McCumbers often performed with his wife and children, as well as the banjo player Kim Johnson, who lived near him. The couple’s first CD recording, “Old Timey,” was released in 2002 and featured 26 old-time fiddle tunes and songs.

He was well known in music circles and in 1999 was the subject of an article by the New York Times.

For a guy that enjoyed staying home and playing music he cut a pretty wide swath in the final analysis.

Until next time stay safe but don’t live your life in a bubble.

Kickoff Classic coming to Glenville next year

In an innovative collaboration, Gilmer County Schools and Glenville State University are teaming up to create a brand-new tradition for West Virginia High School Football.

Nathan Haynes, Athletic Director for Gilmer County High School, and Jesse Skiles, Athletic Director of Glenville State University, have worked together to pioneer the Glenville State University High School Football Kickoff Classic.

The inaugural kickoff will take place on Saturday, August 30, 2025. This new event – which is slated to take place every year in August – will feature a full day of competitive football from high school teams from around the state and beyond. Participating schools will have the opportunity to watch a Glenville State football practice, engage in a tour of the campus, and compete with some of the top schools for early-season gridiron supremacy.

The 2025 edition of the GSU High School Football Classic will play host to four games between schools that run the gamut of A to AAA.

The day will begin with the opportunity for teams to watch a Glenville State University football practice from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. At 11:00 a.m., Midland Trail High School will face off against Clay County. The action continues at 2:10 p.m. with Williamstown High School vs. James Monroe. At 5:20 p.m., Nitro High School will take on Hedgesville in the penultimate contest, and Greenbrier West High School will take on Roane County at approximately 8:30 p.m. to cap off the festivities. The final game will have a special guest to perform a ceremonial coin toss: State Superintendent of Schools Michele Blatt. Fans can purchase a ticket that is good for all four games at a cost of \$12 for an adult and \$5 for a student. Parking for the event is \$5.

The focus of the event might be the football games, but the kickoff offers a great opportunity for student-athletes to become acquainted with the myriad of possibilities that are available on GSU’s campus. Players and fans from every participating school will have the chance to tour the university’s facilities and interface with academics, admissions, and extracurricular programs seeking up-and-coming prospects for the future. The

event’s organizers hope to attract 1,200 students to the tour, potentially enticing prospective students to enroll at GSU. “Really, the purpose is to showcase the town of Glenville—this county and this community,” Skiles stated. “We have an amazing history of what Gilmer County students have accomplished not just athletically but academically throughout the years. We want to take that relationship to another level and collaborate where we are part of this together. These are some traditional power schools that are coming, and to get them here and to give them a great experience – we are really excited about that.”

GSU, GCHS and participating schools will all benefit financially from the Kickoff Classic. As the local high school, GCHS will provide logistical support and run the ticket gate, from which they will earn 20 percent of the proceeds. In addition, each team that plays in the Kickoff Classic on Saturday will receive 10 percent payout from Saturdays total gate ticket profit. GSU will retain all profit from running concessions and parking during the event. Additionally, both Skiles and Haynes posited that the influx of fans will provide a boost for the local economy as well.

When asked about potential growth for the future, GCHS Athletic Director Haynes was optimistic about how the Kickoff Classic could become a perennial showcase of the top schools in the state.

“I think that this could be the biggest high school event in the state of West Virginia outside of the state championship games,” said Haynes. Not just for the best schools in West Virginia – I’ve reached out to schools in Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. I think we are going to be able to attract some of the best competition in four or five states.”

The inception of the Glenville State University High School Kickoff Classic marks a significant milestone for both the relationship between the two institutions and the high school football landscape in West Virginia. The collision of exciting gridiron action with the showcase of educational and extracurricular opportunities at Glenville State University will surely build community engagement and create lasting memories.



player Vicky Bullett was born in Martinsburg. While starring at the University of Maryland, she helped lead the U.S. women's basketball team to a gold medal in the 1988 Olympics.

Oct. 5, 1992: Andrews Methodist Episcopal



Church in Grafton was designated as a National Historic Landmark, one of only 17 in the state. The first Mother's Day observance took place at the church on May 10, 1908.

Oct. 6, 1928: Traditional musician William "Frank"



George was born in Bluefield. The multi-instrumentalist and his wife, Jane George, were leaders in the old-time revival of the 1960s and 1970s.

Oct. 7, 1747: Pioneer Ebenezer Zane, the found-



er of Wheeling, was born on the South of the West Virginia Poetry Society and served as the state's poet laureate for 38 years.

Oct. 7, 1957: Musician Michael W. Smith was



born in Kenova. One of the top-selling artists in gospel music history, he has recorded 25 albums, had 35 number-one songs,

and written over a dozen books.

Oct. 8, 1993: The Rev. Bernard Coffindaffer died unexpectedly of a heart attack. Starting in 1984, Coffindaffer began erecting clusters of crosses in West Virginia and other states. He was buried in Nicholas County, just across the highway from a set of his crosses.

Oct. 9, 1877: The Epis-



copal Church created the Diocese of West Virginia. The initial convention of the new diocese met at St. John's Episcopal in Charleston, with 14 clergy and 16 lay delegates.

Oct. 9, 2014: Following court rulings and announcements by the governor and the attorney general, same-sex marriage was effectively legalized in West Virginia.

NOTICE OF FILING AND HEARING

On July 31, 2024, Mountaineer Gas Company (Mountaineer) filed its annual Application for approval of an Infrastructure Replacement and Expansion Program for 2025 (2025 IREP) with revised IREP rates for 2025, pursuant to W.Va. Code § 24-2-1k, which authorizes the Public Service Commission (Commission) of West Virginia to approve cost recovery of projects to replace, upgrade and expand natural gas utility infrastructure that are deemed to be just and reasonable and in the public interest.

In its Application, Mountaineer forecasts capital investment for calendar year 2025 of \$74 million as part of its multi-year plan. The 2025 IREP covers several categories of plant asset replacements and improvements, including mains, service lines, measurement and regulator stations, and house regulators. These plant investments are proposed to be made in Mountaineer service territories throughout the State. These investments are identified in the Application, which is on file and available for public inspection at the Commission's offices at 201 Brooks Street, Charleston, West Virginia and which may be viewed on the Commission's website, www.sc.state.wv.us.

Mountaineer proposes to increase IREP revenues by \$8.9 million, an overall revenue increase of approximately 2.80%. The IREP investments included in this filing reflect plant additions made or projected to be made from 2023 to 2025. The increased rates are requested to be effective January 1, 2025. The IREP rates apply as either fixed or volumetric rate increments, depending on the applicable rate schedule under which service is rendered. Mountaineer projects that if the program and IREP rate increase are approved as requested, the average monthly bill for its various classes of customers will be changed on January 1, 2025, as shown below:

The increases shown above are compared to the rates currently in place and are based on averages of all customers in the indicated class. Each class may receive an increase greater or less than stated here. Individual customers may receive an increase that is greater or less than average. Furthermore, the requested rates and charges are only a proposal and are subject to change (increase or decrease) by the Commission in its review of the filing. Any change in rates and charges will not become effective until authorized and approved by the Commission.

Plant flower bulbs now to boost biodiversity and improve the climate

Did you know that we are not the only species that experience happiness through flower bulbs? In spring, their flowers are also very popular with bees and butterflies. What's more, they also improve our climate.

So, why not help out and plant flower bulbs now?

Natural water storage

The green leaves of flower bulbs absorb CO2 from the air and produce oxygen in return. Soil planted with greenery also allows rainwater to soak into the soil better. This type of natural water storage is a major advantage during downpours.

Mix it up to your heart's content

When insects go searching for sustenance in spring after a long winter, early flowering bulbs provide for their every need. The crocus is a well-known example. Glory-of-the-snow (Chionodoxa) is another one of these early bloomers brimming with nectar and pollen in the cheerful star-shaped flowers. The same goes for winter aconite (Eranthis hemalums), which grows into yellow carpets. Next, it's the turn of bulbs like grape hyacinth (Muscari), Allium and bluebells (Hyacinthoides) to take

over. Mix different varieties to your heart's content, it will only benefit biodiversity.

Step-by-step plan

Planting flower bulbs is not difficult at all. On a nice fall day, you can turn it into a fun outdoor activity.

Dig holes in the soil with a small scoop; you can find the planting distance on the packaging.

Plant your bulbs twice as deep as they are high;

Put your bulbs in the holes with the growing tip (the nose) facing up;

Fill up the hole with soil and press lightly;

Water the bulbs.

A colorful result

If you are planting your bulbs in a pot, you can plant them a little closer together. Make sure there are holes in the bottom of the pot to allow excess water to drain away. Water your bulbs during prolonged droughts, otherwise you can leave them as they are. In spring, the bulbs will grow naturally to produce a colorful result.

Rinker's new book Garbage Crew to the Rescue was released last week.



According to the fruits and nuts hunting will be average in 2024

Hunters getting ready for fall hunting seasons may now consult the 2024 Hunting Outlook and Mast Survey, the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources (WVDNR) announced. The annual publication, which provides details about the abundance of wild fruits and nuts produced by 18 species of trees and shrubs, forecasts similar harvests for deer, black bear, wild turkey, squirrel and bobwhite quail compared to last year. "On behalf of the WVDNR, I would like to extend our sincerest gratitude to everyone who helped us collect data and make this important survey possible," said WVDNR Director Brett McMillion. "Every hunting season in West Virginia comes with unique opportunities and challenges, so I encourage folks to use this report to their advantage as they enjoy a great hunting season this fall." The report, which is compiled by active and retired staff from the WVDNR's Wildlife Resources

Section and West Virginia Division of Forestry, may be downloaded at WVdnr.gov/mast-survey. According to the report, which includes outlooks for individual game species, hard and soft mast production was mixed this year. White and chestnut oak acorn production is up compared to last year in some parts of the state, but production for red/black and scarlet oak is down, though results are near the long-term average. Beech, walnut and hickory mast is down compared to 2023 levels and from the long-term average. "The availability of mast is mixed across the state this year, which can change where and how animals move and create new opportunities for hunters to have a successful harvest," said Holly Morris, furbearer and small game project leader for the WVDNR's Wildlife Resources Section. "As every year, we recommend hunters review the mast survey for more information on predicted wildlife harvests and mast production in each West



Virginia region as they plan their hunting adventures." All hunters 15 and older are required to have a valid West Virginia hunting license and valid form of identification while hunting, which can be purchased at license agents across the state or online at WVhunt.com.

Calhoun student honored; FFA does judging


