The 2024 Clay County Golden Delicious Festival is now a part of our history to be remembered. It all got started with some awesome festival weather for the entire event. On Thursday night, people were given the opportunity to watch as the new queens went through their coronation. Afterward, music filled the air as Clay's finest singers went head to head in the open mic night. Smoke from barbecue pits filled the air and made a person's stomach swell just from the awesome smell of pulled pork sandwiches and chicken along with some new food trucks that brought in the culture. If your taste buds weren't satisfied, you better get your tongue checked. Color sprang into action at the Clay Health Department as the quilt show opened to display some of the best talent in stitchery.

Friday was a great time to get reacquainted with friends, enjoy a cup of coffee and chase it with whatever your taste buds desired. Students from the two remaining elementary schools, Big Otter and Clay, and CCMS took the stage with some of the finest young voices in the county as it was time for the battle of the choirs. It was a great day to just settle down, get with friends and neighbors and enjoy classic festival entertainment. The new Apple Belle was crowned as Linda Love Williams accepted the crown as the 2024 Golden Delicious Belle. Music hit the stage around 4:00 and didn't stop until late in the night when Jebediah, Michael Rucker, Marissa Truman and Josh Pantry performed right up to the closing of

the doors on the festival for Friday night.

Then came Saturday; a wonderful day to have a festival. A few clouds threatened late in the day, but all was well. Pies and cakes filled the tables as judging began in earnest - each pie hand made with a touch of love and the baker's special ingredients. People came from all over to fill the streets, and music once again sounded throughout town. The parade commenced about 1:30, and the streets were lined with hundreds of people, young and old, as the sirens began to blow. Candy was flung on streets like confetti, and both kids and adults enjoyed the challenge of getting it first. Queens and princesses were dressed in their finest, rode on the finest carriages money could buy and went through town waving to the subjects. The CCHS band marched in the parade playing some cool band tunes as smiles touched ear lobes. It wouldn't be a parade without the music of the drums.

From politicians and tractors to tow trucks and fire engines, the parade was a good one. Once the parade was over, it was time for skillet flinging and corn hole. The Hall of Fame induction was held as some of the finest athletes and coaches to come out of CCHS were remembered. Local talent hit the stage before the much acclaimed group Diamond Rio brought thousands of ears the sweet harmony of their award winning tunes that they have been known for over 30 years. The Elk River Rail Trail 5K and Marathon started off at the Dundon trailhead. With the limited parking space due to the new rail car business, buses were provided as shuttles from CCHS to Dundon. Approximately 250 entrants from 19 states participated in the event, and it went off without a hitch. The lack of parking and necessary shuttling did cause a delay of approximately 30 minutes, but Clay County folks know how to adapt, improvise and overcome the obstacles from outside that threaten to hold us back. Nathan McKee won the half marathon with a time of 1:32:12.91. The female winner was Laura King with a time 1:33:02:.11. Joshua Lapetoda took home the trophy in the 5K run and walk with a time of 19:11:81. Local running legend Marissa Atha took home first place in the female division with a time

of 22:06:36. The end of the festival brings in the idea that snow is just around the corner. It has been a good festival, and it absolutely could not go on if not for those behind the scenes getting it ready, setting it up and tearing it down long after the people have gone. Many,

WV poverty rate for children among highest in nation

The number of West Virginia children living in poverty remains among the highest in the nation, and more children are living in households struggling with hunger, according to the latest federal data.

The end of pandemic supports combined with rising inflation, rent, and the cost of living, are to blame experts say.

The expanded Child Tax Credit cut child poverty in half, said Salaam Bhatti, SNAP Director with Food Research & Action Center.

When it ended, he said more families dipped back into poverty. Now, the child poverty rate has hit nearly 14%.

"Had we added a few more dollars to that program, it could have cut child poverty entirely," said Bhatti. "But it was a deliberate policy choice that the government made to not do that, and then another deliberate choice to remove that expansion."

According to the West Virginia Center on Budget and Policy, child poverty in the

Mountain State dipped from 25% in 2022 to around 20% in 2023. But despite the reduced numbers, the

number of kids living in poverty remains

among the highest in the nation.

Nearly 14 million children live in households currently experiencing food insecurity, up by more than 3% from

Bhatti noted that nearly 35% of single parent households headed by women struggle to pay for groceries.

He said his organization wants Congress to protect the Thrifty Food Plan, which sets the standard for the maximum amount of SNAP benefits households receive.

"Some lawmakers want to cut that Thrifty Food Plan adjustment," said Bhatti, "and as a result, that would cut \$30 billion from SNAP benefits over the next 10 years."

Experts say kids who eat healthy meals are less likely to develop high blood pressure, diabetes, dental cavities, and other health problems.

But as more kids go hungry or lack access to quality food, they're also more likely to be uninsured.

According to data from the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities, the number of children without health coverage rose to nearly 6% in 2023.

Meet the Transportation Division

The Public Service Commission's Transportation Division is staffed by state-certified police officers, experienced railroad inspectors, and other transportation professionals. Our officers patrol the highways for unsafe semi-trucks, buses, and coal trucks. The majority of big trucks on the road are safe, but when they are not, our officers try to find them.

The Transportation Division is run by former State Trooper Jeff Schoolcraft. Transportation Safety Enforcement's 48 officers patrolled the state's 36,000 miles of highways last year. We even have four officers who are designated to patrol the West Virginia Turnpike. In 2023, they inspected more than 21,000 trucks throughout the state.

The division has two officers assigned to patrol the Coal Resource Transportation System, or CRTS, along with inspectors who monitor the coal companies. CRTS is a specially designated road network that the Legislature established in 2003. The system spans 15 southern West Virginia counties.

Last year, the CRTS program monitored 157 coal facilities, 193 trucking companies, and nearly 1,600 permitted trucks. Of those shipments, the program held companies to a 99 percent compliance level for weight limits. Increased penalties reduced the probability of both speeding and overweight coal trucks. The state collected more than \$387,000 in administrative sanctions last year.

All of our officers cooperate with other law enforcement agencies to battle any number of problems, including human trafficking. They participate in enforcing seat belt laws, distracted driving enforcement, work-zone enforcement, speed regulation, and a host of related programs.

Our officers conduct outreach and training for motor carriers and take part in programs that educate high school students about good driving tactics.

Our Railroad Safety Section inspects trains and locomotives, and ensures that railroad crossings and tracks are safe. The 10 inspectors

examined nearly 30,000 rail cars and locomotives last year, 3,500 miles of railroad track, and 282 highway-rail crossings.

I hope you feel confident that these Public Service Commission professionals are out there every day giving it their best to keep you safe, whether on the asphalt or on the rails. I'm very proud of these officers, and I hope you are, too.

SBA to Help West Virginia Businesses **Affected by Drought**

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) announced that federal Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) are available in West Virginia for small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture, and most private nonprofit organizations with economic losses due to drought that began on Aug. 20.

The declaration includes the primary counties of Barbour, Braxton, Cabell, Clay, Doddridge, Harrison, Lewis, Lincoln, Nicholas, Ritchie, Upshur, Webster and Wood in West Virginia, and the adjacent counties of Boone, Calhoun, Fayette, Gilmer, Greenbrier, Jackson, Kanawha, Logan, Marion, Mason, Mingo, Pleasants, Pocahontas, Preston, Putnam, Randolph, Roane, Taylor, Tucker, Tyler, Wayne, Wetzel and Wirt, in West Virginia, and Athens, Gallia, Lawrence, Meigs and Washing-

"Working capital loans from the SBA are essential to eligible small businesses when the Secretary of Agriculture declares a disaster due to farmers' crop losses," said Francisco Sánchez, Jr., associate administrator for the SBA's Office of Disaster Recovery and Resilience. "These loans help sustain rural economies when a disaster occurs."

Under this declaration, the SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) program is available to eligible farm-related and nonfarm-related entities that suffered financial losses as a direct result of this disaster. Apart from aquaculture enterprises, SBA cannot provide disaster loans to agricultural producers, farmers, and ranchers. Nurseries are eligible to apply for economic injury disaster loans for losses caused by drought conditions.

The loan amount can be up to \$2 million with interest rates of 4% for small businesses and 3.25% for private nonprofit organizations, with terms up to 30 years. Interest does not accrue, and payments are not due, until 12 months from the date of the first loan disbursement. The SBA sets loan amounts and terms based on each applicant's financial condition. Eligibility is based on the size of the applicant, type of activity and its financial resources. These working capital loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable, and other bills that could have been paid had the disaster not occurred. The loans are not intended to replace lost sales

Submit completed loan applications to SBA no later than April 28, 2025.

Sept. 25, 1864: George Smith Patton was killed at the Third Battle of Winchester. Patton, a Charleston lawyer, had organized the Kanawha Riflemen, a Virginia militia company. He was the grandfather of Gen. George S. Patton of World War II.

Sept. 26, 1816: David Hunter Strother was born in Martinsburg. He was an artist and an author who used the pen name "Porte Crayon."

Sept. 26, 1863: The Great Seal of West Virginia was adopted by the legislature. The seal, which has remained unchanged, was designed by Joseph H. Diss Debar.



Sept. 27, 1914: Author Catherine Marshall was born in Johnson City, Tennessee. Her family moved to West Virginia and lived in Keyser during the late 1920s and the 1930s.Her best-loved novel, Christy (1967), was based on her mother's girlhood in the southern mountains.



Sept. 28, 1955: Labor

activist Sarah "Mother" Blizzard died at age 90. Blizzard was deeply involved in the United Mine Workers of America, from the organization's early beginnings in the late 19th century.



Sept. 29, 1861: The Kanawha Valley experienced severe flooding. The Kanawha River reached 46.87 feet in Charleston, more than 16 feet above flood stage.


