# Republican Primary for Vinton seat on Roanoke County Board of Supervisors still awaiting election results

The tightly contested race for the Vinton seat on Roanoke County's Board of Supervisors is still too close to call.

According to the Virginia Department of Elections, official results reported six of seven Vinton precincts with Tammy Shepherd as the apparent winner, ahead by 17 votes over Tim Greenway at press time. Shepherd, who was appointed to the seat in January to complete the

term of Jason Peters, received 1,068 votes (50.49%). Greenway, who has represented Vinton on the Roanoke County School Board since 2015, received 1,051 votes (49.6%).

Votes won't be certified until later this week. Official results will be made available in the June 27 edition.

# Meet the contestants for Miss Virginia 2024

# Community excited by redevelopment of **Cleveland Mart**

Just over a year ago, in May 2023, the Town of Vinton and the Roanoke County Economic Development Authority signed a performance agreement with CMART Holdings, LLC, to redevelop the former Cleveland Mart in Vinton into a mixed-use commercial and residential property. CMART Holdings is owned by Chris Dowdy and Dominic Bastile.

Vinton Economic Development Specialist Marshall Stanley explained the hopes of the town in signing the agreement as "removing blight, revitalizing the surrounding neighborhood, increasing commercial opportunities, and adding to the housing inventory." The town also looks forward to the project generating

new local tax revenues.

The property is located on East Cleveland Avenue. Renovations have picked up speed in recent weeks and have drawn the interest of neighbors and motorists passing by on one of Vinton's well-traveled roads.

"Each member of the Town Council has expressed how appreciative they are of the work being done by Chris Dowdy, Dominic Bastile, and their team at the Cleveland Mart project," said Vinton Town Manager Pete Peters. "Affordable living options are very hard to come by in the current housing market, so these units will be very timely to provide additional options for prospective new residents to Vinton.

"The site is conveniently located between both our downtown and uptown commercial districts and is walkable to many new dining and entertainment options in either direction.

"Small public investments to assist with catalyst projects such as this provide a great return to not only the immediate neighbors, but also the greater community at large.

We are hearing great positive comments from residents in the area and the investment has already made a huge impact in the Cleveland Avenue neighborhood and has sparked other redevelopment projects on nearby

Dowdy provided some details on the design of the building. The footprint of the building will not be changed. The basic structure of the building is sound.

"There will be one 'build-to-suit' commercial (office-type) unit on the front section of the building on Cleveland Avenue. The remainder of the former Cleveland Mart will be redeveloped into seven apartments. There will be five two-bedroom units ranging from 785 to 890 square feet each and two onebedroom units ranging from 690 to 720 square feet. The natural lighting provided by large windows added in the apartments will be impressive and provide some nice views of the surrounding area."

Units will have washer/dryers. There will be 12 dedicated parking spaces for the new building, with no on-street parking.

Noah Construction of Salem is the general contractor. The highly rated company specializes in commercial and residential construction, ranging from new construction work to remodeling. Mike Vanderpool is the owner.



The plan is to renovate the former Cleveland Mart into commercial space and seven apartments.

As part of the performance agreement, the Town of Vinton agreed to make some improvements to the property including demolition of a blighted home next door built in 1920 and a trailer next to the Cleveland Mart. Vinton Public Works completed that task in July 2023. That area is being turned into "green space." Stormwater pipes have also been

Dowdy and Bastile say they anticipate completing the project by the end of the year. This is their second project together.

Dowdy, Bastile, and their wives all have careers in education. Dowdy teaches health and physical education at Patrick Henry, where he is also a highly acclaimed soccer coach. Bastile is employed at North Cross School. Both families have been involved with remodeling and "flipping" houses.

# Summer Reading Adventure kicks off at the Vinton Library

A large and enthusiastic crowd attended the kickoff of the Summer Reading Adventure Program at the Vinton Public Library on June 13– despite the heat.

Participating readers this summer will earn badges by completing reading challenges, using library services, attending events. When they finish their reading challenge, they receive a bag to show off their badges.

To complete the program (and earn those badges), babies and toddlers must read 10 books, while school age children, teens, and adults read three books to earn the completion prize.

Once they meet their goal, participants are urged to keep reading help Roanoke County libraries reach a community reading goal of 30,000 books and to be eligible to win a larger prize. The program runs

through August 10.

Each Roanoke County branch library is hosting a kick-off party. The one in Vinton featured balloon creations by balloon artist Jefferson Rose, tattoos, a chalk-drawn obstacle course, giant Connect Four and Zenga games, free bags of popcorn, plus the famous hot dogs grilled by Community Resource Ófficer Will Holland and other members of the Vinton Police Dept.

The recently launched Roanoke County Library "WoW" Bookmobile was on-site and set up a station for creating giant bubbles. The Bookmobile program, directed by Community Engagement Librarian Allyson Frick, is full of books and equipped with bookshelf slides. Patrons do not board the van; they view what is available from the parking lot. The van was donated by Roanoke County Parks and Rec and wrapped

by Sun Solutions of Vinton. The RoCo WoW! Bookmobile is funded through the county library budget; the van is housed at South County Library.

The WoW Bookmobile travels from library to library and, upon request, visits preschools, assisted living centers, special events like the Vinton Senior Expo and Dogwood Festival, Touch a Truck, the Blue Ridge Kite Festival, and more. It will be visiting the Vinton Farmers' Market for storytimes this summer on weekends in July.





There are 50 Lions Club in District 24-C. Twenty-one clubs have contributed to the fundraiser so far, along with 19 community organizations (like Rosie's) and individuals. This is the first time all the Lions Clubs in the district have worked together on such a vast project. The Lions' goal has been to raise \$90,000, including funding from the Lions of Virginia Foundation, and matching funds in the amount of \$90,000 from the Lions Club International Foundation.

The Lions said that they periodically receive "wish lists" from Carilion of needs for the pediatric multi-purpose

Patrick says the Lions Club hopes to continue their contributions to the pediatric center when it is complete with donations of their time as volunteers. She also mentions other ways that the Lions serve the needs of children with eye exams, eyeglasses, vision screening- and soon a hearing screening program.

Rosie's Gaming Emporium has been a dedicated partner with the community since it opened through monetary gifts and by providing volunteers at, and support for, community events. Their gifts total \$100,000 each year. In recent days, Rosie's donated \$3,000 to Lishy's Gift which is dedicated to improving the lives of young adults in the Roanoke Valley with cancer, \$5,000 to the D-Day Memorial, and the \$5,000 to the Lions. On June 19, there will be another check presentation to the Franklin County Humane Society for \$5,000.





# Remebering Vinton

#### Remembering Vinton 50 years ago in June, 1974

William Byrd High School held its graduation exercises on June 7, 1974, salutatorian.

One-third of the graduates were planning on attending college. Twenty seniors had received scholarships. Vickie Graves had been named Best All-Around Senior Girl at the annual awards banquet; Barry Trent was named Best All-Around Senior Boy for 1974.

The School Board announced cuts totaling \$550,000 in a \$28 million budget, eliminating four guidance counselors and 28 teacher aides. Teachers received a 1.4% pay cut. The School Board sent the budget on to the Board of Supervisors with hopes that it would restore the funding.

opened on Hardy Road with a ribboncutting ceremony. The ribbon was made of dollar bills. The bills were presented to Mayor Gus Nicks (center in photo) to donate to his favorite charity. He presented them to the Vinton Fire Dept.

Vinton police were investigating an early-morning break-in at the McDonald's restaurant on Hardy Road. Over \$2,000 was taken by thieves who knocked off a doorknob on a rear door. There was another break-in that same week resulting in the theft of a "soupedup" 302 Chevrolet engine, and a third at Super-X Drug Store. A 1963 Ford was also reported stolen from a home on Cleveland Avenue but found behind the Lee Theater in Roanoke the same day.

Senior Citizen Program took a day-trip to Winston-Salem for lunch and a tour of "Old Salem" followed the next week by an outing to Smith Mountain Lake.

Vinton Town Council adopted a \$1,240,741 municipal budget, 9% higher than the previous year. Vinton's tax rate was \$1.25 per \$100 of assessed value. It had been the same for 20 years.

The town was in the process of "smoke bomb testing" of Vinton's sewer system to discover leaks in the system. This was preliminary to testing using closed-circuit television screening.

H&H Supermarket, a landmark, changed hands in 1974 after 34 years in business. Owner Warren Huddleston sold the store to James Witt, Jr., who said, "Warren Huddleston has built a wonderful reputation as a good, honest, and fair grocer here in Vinton. We intend to continue the example set by him."

Huddleston started in the food business in 1930 at age 21 as a meat cutter. He and William Harris (a meat department manager for a group of grocery stores) joined forces in 1940 to open a small store on Pollard Street and Lee Avenue in downtown Vinton. They changed locations and then continued to expand and remodel through the years, growing from 1,500 square feet to 9,500 square feet. They opened with three employees and, at the time of the sale, employed 15. In the beginning, they stocked 1,600 items; by 1974 they were stocking over 8,000. H&H introduced frozen foods, pre-packaged meats and produce, and automatic cash registers to

Harris retired in 1970 and sold his

interest in the business to Huddleston. At the time Huddleston retired, Vinton Messenger ads show that beef roasts were selling for 69 cents a pound, bread was three loaves for \$1, and tomatoes were 39 cents a pound.





in 10U, one in 12U and two in 15U.






