Miss Virginia competition marks 90 years and a notable increase in scholarships

Excitement is building as 59 exceptional young women from across the Commonwealth prepare to compete for about \$80,000 in scholarships and the coveted titles of Miss Virginia and Miss Virginia's Teen during the 90th anniversary celebration of the Miss Virginia competition. The event is taking place this week, June 26-28, at the Berglund Center for Performing Arts in Roanoke. The winners will advance to the Miss America and Miss America's Teen competition in Orlando, Florida in September.

Becoming Miss Virginia or Miss Virginia's Teen involves a process including talent, health and fitness, evening wear, an interview with judges involving the Community Service Initiative (CSI) each young woman has developed and an on-stage question to answer. Talent may be a classic performing arts talent or the "HER Story" option—a 90-second personal story shared on-stage.

Hosted by The Miss Virginia Opportunity, Inc., this historic milestone year features 33 Miss Virginia contestants (ages 18-28) and 26 Teen contestants (ages 13-17) and also marks a record-setting year for scholarships awarded.

Miss Virginia The winner receives a \$26,000 scholarship; semi-finalists each receive a \$1,000 scholarship. Miss Virginia's Teen wins \$5,000. Thanks to the generous support of sponsors and the Margaret R. Baker Charitable Foundation, Inc., every Miss contestant will receive a minimum \$400 cash scholarship paid directly to their educational institutions.







Remembering

Fifty years ago in June 1975

June 1975 was an eventful month for Vinton, especially the graduates of William Byrd High School. Graduation ceremonies for the Class of 1975 were held on June 10 at the Roanoke Civic Center for the approximately 275 students finishing their high school careers. The three valedictorians with the highest averages, Janet Conner, Carolyn Gross, and Jan Joness, and the one salutatorian, Linda Marks, led the procession.

WBHS had been the site days before of tornado-like winds and torrential rains causing some \$20,000 in damage. There was also an estimated \$5,000 in damages to Vinton streets, storm drains, and sewers.

Principal Bob Patterson noted that one corner of the high school's roof was lifted, slammed into an interior corner and then the winds passed to a single tree on Route 24. A garbage can was sucked up at the rear of the school and then deposited 700 yards away on the highway. Exterior bricks were displaced. At least 12 classrooms suffered damage from the water following the winds on Saturday, but classes were held as normal on Monday. Several traffic accidents were caused by the tornadic winds and downpour. Junior and Senior Rescue Squad members along with the Vinton Fire Department and 80 volunteers responded to remove debris.

Earlier that week, seniors had been presented with scholarships and awards at the annual banquet. The most prestigious awards - Best All-Around Girl and Best All-Around Boy – went to Donna Montgomery and Randy

The faculty and staff at WBHS held a luncheon in honor of Patterson completing his 10th year as principal of William Byrd.

Hildrey Pollard, who had served the Vinton District on the School Board for 10 years, announced that he would not accept re-appointment. There is a time in life, "when you feel like you have given all you can give." Edwin Heptinstall was named to replace him.

Also in June 2025, Roanoke County began preserving records and documents on microfilm.

The Vinton Library Summer Reading program kicked off on June 10; staff planned several special events during June, July, and August – a pet show, Bat Cave, snake show, magician, "Big Foot Returns," a Fun House, a puppet show, a horse show, and a bike rodeo.

Band Day" at Lakeside Amusement Park in June to raise money for the marching band.

School news in June 1975 also included the combined carpentry classes at the Roanoke County Pre-vocational School in Vinton building a construction shed at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church as a class project. Vinton's continuing traffic headache – the intersection

of Washington Avenue and Pollard Street - was the subject of a conference with VDOT, Vinton town officials, and Salem Highway District officials. The meeting was requested by Vinton. Council was seeking a way to speed the flow of traffic

through the intersection, hindered at times by westbound turn lanes off Washington onto Pollard. Businessmen were concerned that making changes to the intersection would have a negative impact on their businesses.

A private consultant recommended against installing a leading green light because of the "current condition of traffic signals."

One suggestion was that the town set up a "no left turn" indicator for westbound Washington motorists,

but businessmen on Pollard said that change would create such an inconvenience for motorists trying to reach their businesses that they might start shopping elsewhere.

Several alternatives were discussed:

- Creating two eastbound lanes on Washington coming off the bridge into the Pollard intersection. The
- right hand turn would be for right turns only. Installing a traffic sign under the traffic signal telling motorists in the right-hand lane they could turn
- right on red if the way is clear. Stationing a traffic officer a block or two east of
- the Pollard Street intersection on Washington. Consider the delayed green light again.
- Consider the possibility of forbidding left turns







Chocolate Pound Cake



Here's our family recipe for Chocolate Pound Cake. Delicious.

- 2 sticks margarine or butter
- 1/2 cup shortening
- 3 cups sugar
- 5 eggs
- 3 cups plain flour 1 cup milk

with her presentation on the incredible honeybee.

She raises honeybees herself in Blue Ridge, but she also spends a great deal of her time on outreach programs. She is currently visiting all of the Roanoke County Libraries with her program on the benefits of honeybees. She visits classrooms during the school year and is working toward obtaining her state certification as a Master Beekeeper.

She brought along an observational beehive, some honey, and the tools needed to be a successful beekeeper. The purpose of the beehive was to let the audience explore how bees work, socialize, and eat. She talked about their life processes, the role of queen, worker, and drone honeybees, and how bees work together as a team.

She focused on how to make the honeybees in her hives happy, challenges bees face (pests and pesticides, especially), the critical role that they play in the lives of human beings, and why we should do everything we can to "save the bees."

She said there is no reason to fear bees. She has three children and only one of them has ever been stung, and that's because she inadvertently sat on the bee.

McCrady has been a beekeeper for over five years; her husband bought her first hives for a Valentine's Day gift. She started with two hives and now has 24.

She says her uncle in Greece first piqued her interest in bees. Apparently, bees get more respect in Greece than in the United States with their role as nature's pollinators revered. Bees are the only insect that we harvest which produces food. She described bees as 'the most influential insect in history."

Bees were memorialized in cave paintings several thousand years ago. Bee fossils have been found from millions of years ago. Bees were brought to North America on the Mayflower. Unfortunately, when the Pilgrims first arrived, they brought apple trees on the boats, but no bees, so the trees could not be pollinated. They learned their lesson and returned on the next trip with bees. McCrady talked about drone, queen, and worker bees. The drones have brief lives; their only job is to mate with the

The queen bee (there's just one) spends her time looking for empty cells in the hive where she can lay her eggs (about 2,000 a day), her main occupation. She leaves the hive just one time in her life - to mate. She is usually marked with a dot by the beekeeper to differentiate her from the other female bees and to keep track of her age. There is a specific color scheme beekeepers maintain for the markings, this year they are marked with blue dots. If the queen bee is not producing adequately, the worker bees may decide to replace

The worker bees do virtually all of the work inside the hive from cleaning the cells, to tending the baby bee nursery, to building the honeycomb that protects bees from wildlife such as bears, opossums, and raccoons. Workers make up approximately 97% of the bees in the hive.

Drones usually live about eight weeks, workers 20-190 days, and the queen 2-5

McCrady dispelled one myth about bears and bees. Bears do not invade hives mainly for the honey; they happen to love bee larvae.

Honeybees collect pollen as a source of protein, which they need especially during the winter months. They scrape the pollen from flowers and carry it back to the hive in pockets on their back legs and drop it off. They also collect nectar, a sticky liquid used in making honey.

Bees also need water for survival, vitamins, and minerals, which they collect from pools, ponds, puddles, and other places. McCrady said that it is helpful to bees to keep water out for them – just remember to add a little salt to keep it sanitary. If a honeybee lands on and licks you, it may be because they smell you or detect the salt on your skin.

McCrady only harvests honey once a year and sells honey seasonally - she



leaves the other honey as nutrition for the bees. She said that not only is honey delicious, it is also healthy. Honey is used in hospital ICUs as a natural antibiotic to treat wounds.

Another fascinating tidbit of information she shared is that sick bees can be treated by veterinarians. Oh, and bees, unlike humans, love the pesky kudzu plant.

McGrady said that good beekeepers are conservative in harvesting and leave plenty of honey in the hive for the bees to eat during winter months to survive.

Cold and/or rainy weather is challenging for bees, as are several insect

McCrady shared a dark story about bees. One way the bees are victorious over some of the pests (like wasps and hornets) who attack them is to "cook their brains" by surrounding them in a process called "balling" which causes them to overheat. The bees form a tight cluster around the intruder to the hive to immobilize and neutralize it. They create a literal ball of bee bodies around the invader. Then they all start to vibrate their flight muscles, generating heat through the rapid movement. The heat at the center of the ball begins to rise, and the unfortunate victim will slowly expire. It's unclear if the suffocation, stinging or slow cooking finishes the job, but the combination seems to be a highly effective defense strategy.

McCrady encouraged those in attendance to think twice before using pesticides around bees which might kill the entire hive.

She talked about the structure of beehives which can be purchased. She cautioned that a beehive full of honey can weigh up to 90 pounds. and is

For those interested in raising bees, she suggested putting the hives in places with lots of sunlight, an entrance toward the southeast, with a wind barrier, good food and water sources, dry ground underneath, avoiding areas of high foot traffic, and with space between hives.

She also pointed out that raising bees is not cheap and that not many turn a profit from selling honey. Starting up two hives can cost over \$700 without the bees - and you do need two hives

She mentioned that there are beekeeper organizations in the area, such as the Blue Ridge Beekeepers, the Roanoke Beekeepers, and the Botetourt Beekeepers. Classes are offered.

The Southwest Virginia Bee Festival is coming up in Elmwood Park in Roanoke on August 23 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. McCrady will be participating. Events will include pollination education, honey tastings, mead tastings, raffles, live music, community outreach from beekeepers, libraries, gardeners, naturalists, the Clean Valley Council, and others, along with food and craft vendors and a Kids Zone.







Vinton teams are runnersup in RAYBA baseball tourneys

The Vinton 10u and 12u all-star baseball teams both won the winners' bracket but couldn't close the deal as Green Hill Park hosted Roanoke Area Youth Baseball Association(RAYBA) tournaments last week.

In the 10u tournament Vinton opened with a 15-2 win over North Roanoke, then beat Glenvar on Thursday and Salem, 14-6, on Friday to head into the weekend needing one more win.
