LIVE STREAMING

Technological advances allowed us to begin live streaming our 10:45 morning worship service in 2018. 

DIRECTION AND CONTROL


The Finance Department, with a staff of five, is led by Lorie Bradshaw, who reports to Don McMinn, Senior Associate Pastor of Arts and Administration. Lorie has more than 20 years of experience in church accounting and has served Stonebriar since 2003.

Our Finance Committee, composed of Stonebriar members and one elder, meets quarterly to review financial reports and recommend financial direction and actions to the elders.

An annual audit is performed by an independent audit firm, PSK. The audited financial statement for 2017–2018 is available at <u>stonebriar.org/annualreport</u>. Our auditors consistently affirm the integrity with which we handle our finances.

The annual budget is composed by the staff, submitted to the Finance Committee for review, and approved by the elders.

Our fiscal year is July 1-June 30.



AUDITOR'S STATEMENT

PSK LLP performs an annual financial statement audit for the church. As an independent third party, our audits are performed in conjunction with auditing standards set forth by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. In each of our annual reports, we have expressed an unqualified (clean) opinion as to the fairness of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We commend the church and its leadership for handling its business affairs with a high degree of integrity.

VALUE OF LAND AND BUILDINGS

In 1999, the elders led the church to purchase 61 acres of land in an underdeveloped area of the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex—Frisco. Subsequent acquisitions have brought our total land area to 85 acres. Few people could have imagined that Frisco would become one of the fastest growing cities in the United States. Our buildings and parking occupy approximately 40 acres; 45 acres are undeveloped.

The replacement value of our developed campus (301,000 sq. ft. of conditioned buildings) is approximately \$64 million. Depreciated value of the campus is approximately \$40 million. Based on comparable sales and listings (not an official appraisal) our undeveloped land is valued at approximately \$30 million.

DEBT STRUCTURE


History

In 2007, our total indebtedness for land and buildings was \$24 million. The annual payment on the loan was \$1.7 million and was included in our operating budget. The loan structure did not allow for early paydown prior to February 2019, but freedom from debt has consistently been a priority. At the direction of the elders, an additional \$8.7 million was set aside for debt reduction over the past six years as part of our annual budget.

Current Debt

In February of this year, the pre-payment penalty expired. We were then able to use the reserve fund along with additional designated gifts from individuals to reduce our debt by \$9,714,224.

Our loan has been renegotiated with very favorable terms and no pre-payment penalty. The current balance is \$6.6 million.

The best way to support our church financially is to give to the general fund. While designated gifts are appreciated, the church's primary ongoing ministry is sustained through our annual budget.

MINISTRY PROGRAMS

This budget area represents ministry needs, such as staff, curriculum, fellowship, worship, music, and events for ages birth to adult.

DEBT SERVICES

Our budget includes \$1.5 million per year to cover required debt service payments as well as additional reductions in principal. As of February 2019, our loan balance is \$6.6 million.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

This category covers the support departments shared by all ministry areas. Administrative Support includes Communications, Finance, Human Resources, Database Maintenance, Information Technology, and Web Services.

RESERVES

Per our auditor's recommendation, we maintain four months of operating expense in a designated cash reserve account. These funds can only be spent at the direction of the elders.

BUILDING & GROUNDS

The Building & Grounds Budget funds all activities associated with the operation, maintenance, safety, and security of all buildings, grounds, furnishings, and equipment owned by the church.

MISSIONAL LIVING

Approximately 7% of our annual budget supports ministry beyond our local church. We support multiple missions organizations including Samaritan's Purse, World Vision, Feed My Starving Children, and others. The church also sponsors special missions offerings, coordinates the gifts of individual donors, and sponsors mission trips, such that 11% of our total expenditures are spent on missions.

In addition to giving on a regular, systematic basis, many people consider long-range planning financial instruments as a way to leave a legacy that will continue through the years. Options include:

SALE-OF-LAND UPDATE

After being contacted by a local real estate developer in February 2018, who was interested in purchasing some of our undeveloped property, a committee comprised of elders, church staff, and church lay people who have extensive experience in real estate and land development was formed to further study the issue. Over the next several months, this committee took appropriate due diligence efforts such as obtaining appraisals and engaging a real estate attorney. During these months, our pastoral staff met regularly to pray about the vision of our church and how the proposed sale might affect that vision.

In June 2018, we informed our congregants about an unsolicited offer we received on a portion of our undeveloped land. We asked for your input and prayers. We carefully considered and responded to every suggestion and question. Thank you for your prayers regarding this important issue. Although the land sale had the potential to generate funding to eliminate our mortgage debt, Pastor Chuck communicated to the congregation that we would only move forward if we believed that the project was in the best interest of the church.

The parties worked hard in an attempt to find mutually agreeable terms but were unable to find sufficient common ground. In November, following prayerful deliberations and hours of discussion, our elders unanimously decided that this particular opportunity would not be in the best interest of the church. We anticipate that our undeveloped land will continue to be a valuable asset for our church.

While the sale of land could have provided immediate funds to pay off our mortgage, we have for a number of years been reserving funds to apply towards the debt when the mortgage pre-payment penalty was eliminated, which happened in January 2019. As a result, we have paid \$9.7 million toward the outstanding debt of \$16 million and negotiated favorable terms for a new loan of \$6.6 million. At our current level of debt service, we can eliminate the mortgage in about 5 years. But we believe that freedom from debt will come even sooner. As the loan is gradually reduced and we see the "finish line," we anticipate that our people will give generously to accelerate the pay-off (see Debt Reduction Plan on page 10).



DEBT REDUCTION PLAN

Our annual budget includes \$1.5 million for debt reduction. Our goal is to make additional payments toward principal whenever possible, both from our budget and from designated donor gifts. Using only budgeted funds, we will be debt-free in 2024. With additional gifts of \$300,000 per year toward debt, we could reach that goal in 2023, and save more than \$130,000 in interest expense.

Exactly twenty years after our first worship service as Stonebriar Community Church, we celebrated God's love and faithfulness with a day that can only be described as a taste of Heaven on earth. After our service, we had the privilege of seeing 57 people baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. As every person rose from the waters with smiles on their faces, they reminded us that all our church's ministries, programs, events, and services are all about just one thing: sharing the redeeming love of Jesus Christ with all people.

Throughout the morning and afternoon, our church family filled our campus with joy and laughter, feasting and enjoying God's gift of fellowship. There were little ones toddling around with cotton candy and popcorn, friends gathering to talk and share stories, and people of all ages playing games and even dancing!

There was an indescribable feeling of excitement and possibility as we looked back at all God has done and looked forward to our future together.
