Things to remember

- Park hours 8 a.m. to dusk year round.
- Winter schedule Although most parks are open year round, some parks or portions of parks are closed during the winter. For a winter schedule and information about seasonal closures, visit www.parks.state.wa.us or call the information center at (360) 902-8844.
- · Wildlife, plants and all park buildings, signs, tables and other structures are protected; removal or damage of any kind is prohibited. Hunting, feeding of wildlife and gathering firewood on state park property is prohibited.
- · Pets must be on leash and under physical control at all times. This includes trail areas and campsites. Pet owners must clean up after pets on all state park lands.



The Discover Pass is required for day visits to state parks and access to other state-managed recreation lands. The pass provides access to millions of acres of parks, wildlife areas, trails, natural areas and water-access sites. The annual pass is transferable between two vehicles.

• Annual pass: \$30 • One-day pass: \$10 (transaction and dealer fees may apply)


Welcome to Flaming Geyser

Flaming Geyser State Park is a 480-acre day-use park with more than three miles of freshwater shoreline on the Green River. The park's most unique feature is its "geysers" (methane seeps). In 1911, miners drilled a coal test hole at the edge of Christy Creek. The miners hit pockets of methane gas and salty water at around 1,000 feet down. For many years, fire reached heights of 25 feet and nearly 20 gallons of water a minute spewed from the hole. Because most of the gas has been depleted, the geyser has been reduced to a small flicker with dribbles of water.

The park offers more than four miles of trails for hikers. Equestrians may enjoy the 1-mile trail or a 25-acre open field. The park also features white-water kayaking for experts on the Green River, fishing and swimming. The park is very popular for remote-control, model-airplane flying.

Flaming Geyser and river habitat interpretive walks lead by a park ranger are usually available with one week's advance request for groups of 10 to 20 people. There also is a self-guided, Salmon Interpretive Trail that is accessible to people with disabilities.
