

## Things to remember

- **Park hours** – 8 a.m. to dusk daily.
- **Winter schedule** – Although most parks are open year round, some parks or portions of parks are closed during the winter. For a winter schedule and information about seasonal closures, visit [www.parks.state.wa.us](http://www.parks.state.wa.us) or call the information center at (360) 902-8844.
- Wildlife, plants and all park buildings, signs, tables and other structures are protected; removal or damage of any kind is prohibited. Hunting, feeding of wildlife and gathering firewood on state park property is prohibited.
- One camping party is allowed per site. Maximum of eight people per campsite.
- Campsites may not be held for other parties.
- Camping check-in time is 2:30 p.m., and check-out time is 1 p.m.
- Extra vehicle overnight - \$10 per night in designated area for each vehicle in excess of the one allowed per site. Does not apply to vehicle towed by a recreational vehicle.
- Pets must be on leash and under physical control at all times. This includes trail areas and campsites. Pet owners must clean up after pets on all state park lands.
- Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.
- Engine-driven electric generators may be operated only between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 p.m.

The **Discover Pass** is required for day visits to state parks and access to other state-managed recreation lands. The pass provides access to millions of acres of parks, wildlife areas, trails, natural areas and water-access sites. The annual pass is transferable between two vehicles.

- Annual pass: \$30 • One-day pass: \$10  
(transaction and dealer fees may apply)

# Illahee State Park



EMBRACE YOUR NATURE

**Illahee State Park is a 75-acre marine camping park with 1,785 feet of saltwater frontage on Port Orchard Bay, 3 miles northeast of Bremerton. The park has plenty of parking space, lots of fresh air, facilities for a number of outdoor activities and access to a wide variety of water sports.**

**The park features a veterans' war memorial and the last stand of old-growth timber in Kitsap County. One of the largest yew trees in the nation grows in this park. The beach provides great views of Puget Sound.**

**The park also offers a variety of recreational activities, including boating, diving, fishing, personal watercraft, horseshoes, softball, volleyball and a children's play area. Other activities include both geocaching and metal detecting.**

#### Overnight accommodations

The park offers 23 tent spaces, two utility spaces, one dump station, four restrooms (two accessible to people with disabilities) and two showers. Tent spaces are suitable for any RV, but provide no hookups. Maximum site length is 40 feet (may have limited availability). Camping reservations may be made for arrival dates between May 15 and Sept. 15 by calling (888) CAMPOUT (888-226-7688) or online at [www.park.state.wa.us](http://www.park.state.wa.us). Reservations may be made up to nine months in advance.

#### Park history

Illahee State Park was established in 1934, by a land donation of 13 acres from Kitsap County.

#### Park amenities and facilities

Illahee State Park offers several amenities and facilities to make your visit more enjoyable and comfortable, including:

- Four reservable picnic shelters with electricity, 90 unsheltered picnic sites. For kitchen shelter reservation, call (360) 478-6460

- Picnic sites available on a first-come, first-served basis
- Day-use groups of 20 or more required to register and pay applicable fees
- Veterans' war memorial with a restored gun display
- Ball field, play area and horseshoe pits
- Modern restrooms with hot showers
- One-lane boat launch available on Port Orchard Bay
- Pier, 356 feet of moorage at docks and five moorage buoys
- Trailer dump station
- 1.9 miles of hiking trails
