Things to remember

- Park hours April 1 to Sept. 30, 8 a.m. to dusk.
- Winter schedule This park is closed in the winter. Although most parks are open year round, some parks or portions of parks are closed during the winter. For a winter schedule and information about seasonal closures, visit www.parks.state.wa.us or call the information center at (360) 902-8844.
- Wildlife, plants and all park buildings, signs, tables and other structures are protected; removal or damage of any kind is prohibited. Hunting, feeding of wildlife and gathering firewood on state park property is prohibited.
- Pets must be on leash and under physical control at all times.
- Pet owners must clean up after pets on all state park lands.



The Discover Pass is required for day visits to state parks and access to other state-managed recreation lands. The pass provides access to millions of acres of parks, wildlife areas, trails, natural areas and water-access sites. The annual pass is transferable between two vehicles.

• Annual pass: \$30 • One-day pass: \$10 (transaction and dealer fees may apply)



WELCOME

Joseph Whidbey State Park is a day-use park on Whidbey Island in the northern Puget Sound. With 3,100 feet of saltwater shoreline along the Strait of Juan de Fuca, the 112-acre

park sits on one of the grandest stretches of beach found on Whidbey Island. The forested park is abundant with wildlife and is a popular location for beach exploration and bird watching.

The park is part of the Cascade Marine Trail and offers one water trail campsite to those who arrive by human- and wind-powered watercraft. The water-trail campsite is available on a first-come, first-served basis, and primitive camping fees apply.

Nearby overnight accommodations

Camping accommodations are available at nearby Fort Ebey and Fort Casey state parks.

Fort Ebey offers 39 standard campsites and 11 partial-utility campsites. Maximum site length will accommodate most extra large RVs (limited availability). The campground is closed November 1-February 28.

Fort Casey State Park offers 22 standard campsites and 13 partial-utility campsites with accommodations for RVs up to 40 feet long. The campground is open year-round.

Campsites are first-come, first-served during the off-season, and by online reservation from May 15 -September 15. Camping reservations can be made at www.parks.state.wa.us or by calling (888) CAMPOUT.

Park amenities and facilities

Joseph Whidbey State Park offers several amenities and facilities to make your visit more enjoyable and comfortable, including:

- · A group day-use shelter. Reservable by calling (888) CAMPOUT or (888) 226-7688
- · Nine unsheltered picnic tables available first come, first served
- 0.5-mile hiking trail accessible to people with disabilities, 1 mile of beach trail, 3 miles of easy walking trails and 2 miles of forested trails
- Two large grass fields (nets may be put up or games can be played on the grass)
- · One restroom, accessible to people with disabilities
