Site History Tour



Duration: 90 Minutes

A guided tour of The Astor Theatre including a history of the location, 70mm/35mm vs Digital presentation followed by a screening compilation of retro cartoons and historic news reels culminating with an activity sheet (varied by age).

Site History Tour + Film Screening



Duration: 30mins + film duration

A short, guided tour of The Astor Theatre including the history of the location, 70mm/35mm vs Digital presentation followed by a screening of an iconic 70mm/35mm film work such as The Story of the Kelly Gang (1906) Citizen Kane (1941) or a film from the Palace Cinemas Education program.

About the Astor





The Astor Theatre is a cinema in the grand, old manner. The last single screen cinema of its kind in continuous operation in Melbourne, still standing since its grand opening in 1936, and one of only a few single screen movie theatres from the 1930s in the world screening repertory movie programming.

The Astor Theatre is listed on the Victorian Heritage Register, under record number H1751, this heritage protection ensures the preservation and longevity of the building. This heritage protection also demands that all original fixtures remain, for example, if you ever wondered why The Astor's auditorium seating feels a little dated and lacking in modern comforts, well, that is because the many seats in the Astor cannot be updated due to their heritage value and protection. We kinda like them that way too.


Of Love And Lies (PG)


The Three Musketeers: D'Artagnan (M)


Michael Collins (M)

The film explores Australia-US relations during the Cold War: the setting up of ASIO to appease American agencies worried about Communist influence; the Petrov Affair and disunity in the Labor Party; and the determination of Sir Robert Menzies to follow the US into Vietnam. It's the story also of the "covert wars" in South-East Asia, especially Indonesia, and Australia's role in support of US policy and intervention.


Spencer (M)


Bigger Than Us (M)






Homeland Story (M)







The Australian outback, 1922... four men relentlessly track a fugitive, an aboriginal man accused of murdering a white woman. In charge of the expedition is the Fanatic, calculating and complex. The Follower is new to the frontier, a greenhorn. The Veteran is along for the ride, placing thoughts before action. But all three white men are dependant on the mysterious figure of the black Tracker (David Gulpilil - Cargo, Rabbit-Proof Fence). When an interrogation of a small group of indigenous people turns into a massacre, paranoia sets in and the question becomes not will the fugitive be caught, but what is black and what is white... and who is leading whom?


Backtrack Boys (MA15+)




Puberty Blues (M)



Puberty Blues traces the lives of two adolescent girls who have spent the first part of their lives in a group by themselves, while desperately trying to break into the "in" crowd who dominate the Greenhill beach. Once they are accepted into the group, they realise that the group's laidback, ultra-cool facade is just that: a glossy cover-up. The main protagonist, Debbie, and her life-long companion Sue fall into all of the group's vices, including drug usage and casual sex. At first, they willingly present themselves to the males of the group as virtual slaves, ready to serve their pre-chosen lover's every need. Soon, though, the girls grow tired of occupying the victim role, and they work to regain respect and equality






