



An additional cushion rests on the side structure and becomes an armrest soft that increases the surface area for lounging. The design is distinguished by the pleasant "wrinkles" that are created on the upholstery, which enhance the softness of the design and the sense of visual comfort that the entire collection wants to communicate.










Uragano Table by Natuzzi Design Center

Uragano is a dining table that pays homage to **the beauty and natural richness of the Apulian territory.** The large oval-shaped glass plate is supported by a majestic olive wood base, which seems to develop in space like the trunk of a centuries-old olive tree that starts from the earth and its strong roots and grows upward to benefit from the sun and breeze that give color to Puglia.

Uragano almost seems to wrap itself in its own support, and thus creates an asymmetrical effect that makes the dining table a moving sculpture. The imposing dimensions make Uragano the ideal complement for all those who love the conviviality typical of the Mediterranean.

Comfort is not a purely physical sensation; on the contrary it is a total experience, which can involve all the senses, even more than one at a time. Proof of this is the work of Renzo Buttazzo. a master sculptor in working with Pietra Leccese, an ancient limestone rock typical of Salento and famous for its ease of working. Thanks to more than 25 years of experimentation, the artist manages to give, to an apparently hard and unbreakable material, an aspect of lightness and harmony that give the observer, a unique feeling of peace and mental relaxation. No one would have guessed that the hard stone would be so comfortable.







The Green Rabbit's hole. Armchair

Lewis Carroll taught us that to imagine fantastic worlds, one need only fall down a rabbit hole. Twenty years ago, Negramaro, like Alice, chased their green rabbit by unveiling unexplored musical scenarios, frescoing them with notes and words that have marked the collective imagination. On the stroke of twenty years, Negramaro felt the need to give a body to that guiding spirit that had caught their attention, so the green rabbit took shape through the creative and realizing ability of fellow travelers such as Fabio Novembre and Pasquale Junior Natuzzi, friends born under the same Apulian sky.

Making the best use of their expressive potential, the project developed into an enveloping cocoon, an armchair that took inspiration from "Sound," Natuzzi's first experience in sonic comfort, becoming a microcosm for listening to suggestions. developing a hearing that transcends the noise pollution of our times, tuning in to frequencies that only a rabbit could pick up. The rich symbolism associated with the rabbit figure and the coincidence with the year of the Chinese horoscope make it a unique opportunity to let ourselves slip into that comfortable den while everything flows before our enchanted eyes.
