



## **Public Notification of the National School Lunch Program**

Center City Public Charter Schools participates in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) to provide free snacks to our student community and Seamless Summer Option (SSO) to provide free breakfast and lunch, and adheres to the guidelines established by the USDA. Each school year, Center City Public Charter Schools provides breakfast, lunch, and snack at no cost under the Community Eligibility Program (CEP). Center City has an obligation to continue to provide meals to our students who have qualified for a medical exemption. These students will be offered 5-day meal kits. Each Center City campus will designate and communicate a 2-3 hour window everyday for parents to pick up free breakfast and lunch meals. Each campus will place 6ft. Markers outside the building to ensure social distancing during pickup. Weather permitting, pickup will take place outside. In the event of inclement weather, families will proceed one-at-a-time to the front desk to pick up their meals. Meals will be provided free of charge under SSO and/or NSLP.

It's critical that students begin each day with a nutritious breakfast to prepare them for a successful school day.

#### **District of Columbia Human Rights Act**

Also, the District of Columbia Human Rights Act, approved December 13, 1977 (DC law 2-38; DC official code §2-1402.11(2006), as amended) states the following:
