Hello. According to the Rutherford Health Department, as of 3:00 pm today, the total number of COVID-19 positive cases in Rutherford has risen to a total of 158.

The residents with new positive results range in age from 21 to 58. The situation continues to be closely monitored by the Health Department. Our first responders continue to take all possible precautions when assisting our community.

I'd like to thank all of our first responders for your tremendous dedication to our community. Please continue to support them by donating N-95 and non N-95 masks, disposable gloves and disposable gowns. Please contact the Mayor's office directly at 201-460-3022.

Today the President signed a bill that delivers a \$310 billion infusion to the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), which helps businesses with fewer than 500 employees obtain loans that can cover eight weeks of their payroll, benefits and other expenses. The bill also provided an additional \$50 billion for the Small Business Administration's emergency disaster lending and \$10 billion in SBA disaster grants. They are still open for take out food and please keep them in mind when you are thinking about where to order dinner.
