The Rutherford Health Department feels it's important for residents to know that most local governments and municipalities do not have control over distribution of the COVID vaccines. Many factors, including but not limited to having the necessary cold storage that the vaccines require, currently prohibit local municipalities from handling the vaccine. It is not anticipated that the Rutherford Health Department will be vaccinating residents against COVID-19.

The Health Department has established a 24-hour hotline at **201-460-3000 x3154** with the most recent information available regarding the vaccine. A transcript of the hotline recording can be found on the <u>Health Department's page on the Borough website</u>.
