Hello. According to the Rutherford Health Department, as of 3:00 pm today, the total number of COVID-19 positive cases in Rutherford has risen to a total of 173.

The residents with new positive results range in age from 26 to 44. The situation continues to be closely monitored by our Health Department. Our first responders continue to take all possible precautions when assisting our community.

We'd like to remind you that ticketing for alternate side of the street parking will resume on Monday, May 4th. Please help us keep your neighborhood beautiful by remembering to move your car on your scheduled day.

I'd like to congratulate Rutherford resident Christine Beidel for being chosen a "Bergen County Hero" by Bergen County Freeholder Tracy Silna Zur. Christine and 4 other Bergen County residents founded the Bergen Mask Task Force. Together, they use their skills to sew washable fabric masks for front line heroes around Bergen County and New York City.
