Unfortunately today I must announce that a 60 year old male resident was taken by Rutherford Volunteer Ambulance Corps to a hospital. He was tested at his doctor's office on March 12th and taken to the hospital by the Rutherford Volunteer Ambulance Corps on March 16th. The positive result was reported to Rutherford Health Department on March 18th at approximately 11:50 am. No children from the Rutherford school district live in his home.

Governor Murphy and County Executive Tedesco have issued public health state of emergency declarations for New Jersey and Bergen County and have implemented guidelines and mandates for all to follow. They have also provided assistance and resources to local municipalities as needed. The Borough has also provided direction and has issued our own directives, all of which is intended to keep residents safe and reduce the spread of this terrible outbreak.

I urge all residents to comply with all the guidance from the public health organizations and mandates set forth by Governor Murphy and County Executive Tedesco.
