From the Desk of Mayor Frank Nunziato

At Monday's meeting, we heard from a group of residents who passionately spoke about the conditions of the baseball diamond on which the Babe Ruth and RHS varsity teams play at Memorial Park. "Diamond 2" as it's known, has for decades maintained a dirt infield as opposed to a traditional grass infield. By all accounts, a dirt (or clay) infield is less desirable to a grass one. I, myself, played on that field in high school under those conditions and remember the envy my team would have when we visited other towns with grass infields.

The upgrade of Diamond 2 is long overdue and accounted for in the larger redesign of Memorial Park currently being worked on. Last month, Mr. Keeler, a generous resident, offered a donation that would pay to sod the Diamond 2 infield before the start of the 2024 baseball season, which will begin in about two months. He was made aware that any work done at this time would likely be replaced once redesign construction begins.

The Borough Administrator, Bob Kakoleski, and I met with Mr. Keeler, at which point we agreed the Borough would look into the possibility of accepting his donation, and feasibility of placing sod on the infield on Mr. Keeler's requested timeline, considering we are in the middle of winter.

Immediately following that meeting, Bob began weeks of research, spoke with several professionals, including the resident's proposed contractor of choice, as well as two companies the Borough has in the past contracted with for improvements at Memorial Park. He consulted with the necessary Department Heads and DPW grounds team and explored every scenario that would help or hinder this project - specifically the unpredictability of weather in February and March. He shared all these findings with my colleagues and me in a detailed and timely manner.

Ultimately, the input collected from the professionals offers no guarantee that the field could be ready in time for the start of the season, which could require the rescheduling of High School and Babe Ruth baseball.

It is the collective professionals' recommendations that the potential risks and complications of beginning the project

at this time of year outweigh the potential rewards for the 2024 season. There were just too many variables in play to guarantee a successful project at this time.

I encourage you to watch the Borough Administrator's detailed explanation of these findings on the YouTube recording of Monday's meeting which can be found on the Borough website.

My colleagues and I are all disappointed that this is such a difficult project to execute so quickly, and are in agreement this conversation should have begun last fall. If that had happened, boys baseball would likely have begun in March 2024 with a beautiful grass infield on Diamond 2.

This offer was not taken lightly. The Borough must responsibly vet all projects, whether they're paid for with public or private funding. While frustrating at times, we are required to follow several statutory requirements in terms of procurement methods and awarding contracts. Unfortunately a project on public land can't be expedited the same ways you could expedite a project at your house.

I would like to thank the Borough Administrator for his dilligence on this matter and for listening to input from the community. As a result of the issues brought forth to him last month, Bob is exploring immediate improvements to Diamond 2 that are feasible before the baseball season commences. This includes replacing some of the existing clay with the clay and conditioner recommended by Mr. Keeler's contractor, at the Borough's cost.

While we believe it's unlikely our concerns will change, we will continue to evaluate achievable options in the coming weeks.

I'd also like to thank Mr. Keeler for his generosity and desire to invest in the community. I know his offer comes from the heart and I look forward to collaborating with him and the rest of the Rutherford baseball family in preparation for the 2025 season.
