From the Desk of **Mayor Frank Nunziato**

I'm pleased to be able to bring you an update on the Diamond 2 repairs at Memorial Park.

In my last newsletter, I reported it was unlikely the Borough would be able to accept a donation from a resident to make certain repairs to Diamond 2, where Rutherford Varsity Baseball primarily plays, in time for the spring season.

After several weeks of exploring every possible scenario that could help or hinder this project, the Borough presented the resident, Mr. Keeler, with an agreement that can satisfy the concerns of both parties.

Large capital improvements such as redesigning Memorial Park have many moving pieces and it took some time to see how a Diamond 2 repair could fit into the overall plans, which are currently in the process of being finalized.

The date by which Diamond 2 will be playable, once the sod is laid, is mainly dependent on the weather, but I'd like to thank Superintendent Hurley for being open to rescheduling high school baseball games as needed should this interrupt the spring schedule.

I thank Mr. Keeler for his generosity as well as his flexibility on this matter as we enlisted our professionals to ensure all options were explored, considered and deliberated in pursuit of a successful outcome.

Additionally, I'm excited that it won't be long before we finalize the vision for the entirety of Memorial Park and timeline for work. My colleagues and I are all looking forward to making this dream a reality for the residents and athletes of Rutherford.

Snow Emergency Information

As we continue to encounter winter weather, please be mindful of parking restrictions and other important information for homeowners anytime snow accumulates.

Did you know there are 63 designated snow emergency streets in Rutherford?

To find out if your street is one of them, visit www.rutherfordboronj.com/resident-info/snow-emergency-info for the complete list of snow emergency streets in Rutherford, as well as other valuable information.

- NO Parking on snow emergency streets once road is covered with snow.
- If snow is in the forecast, move your car BEFORE it starts
- Parking on snow emergency streets resumes once the roadway is clear and plowed to the curb
- Plowing around parked cars adds signicant time to overall plowing operations, which leads to longer snow emergencies
- Please be mindful of fire hydrants when clearing sidewalks and make them accessible to the Fire Department in the event of a fire.
- All sidewalks must be cleared of snow and ice within 12 hours of daylight after a snowfall or a winter storm.
- No one can place any object, including but not limited to chairs, traffic cones, garbage cans, etc., into the street with the intent to save a parking space.

The ice skating rink has been set up for this season in the Memorial Field Parking lot. It is only usable when weather conditions permit, as we need a stretch of sub-freezing days to make it skateable.

Users will skate at their own risk. Badges will not be required.

Rabies Clinic for Dogs and Cats -Saturday, March 16th, 10:00am-12:00pm Mortimer Ave Firehouse - 400 Mortimer Ave.

Previously vaccinated dogs and cats, with proof of vaccination, will receive a 3-year dose. Cats and dogs vaccinated at the age of three (3) to eleven (11) months will require revaccination after one (1) year.
