This week was National Fire Prevention Week which takes place from a Sunday to Sunday timeline in which the date of October 9th falls. It was established in 1911 to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire of 1871.

First, members of Engine Company 2 visited our young residents at Sylvan, Lincoln and Washington schools as well as The Lightbridge Academy of Rutherford. Members arrived on Engine 6, in full gear and brought their most exciting equipment.
