

From the desk of Mayor Frank Nunziato

Unfortunately we've seen a recent spike in positive COVID cases in Rutherford. I'd like to assure you that the Borough is in constant contact with Superintendent Hurley to make sure channels of communication are kept open to ensure the safety of our residents. Superintendent Jack Hurley, Health Inspector Brian O'Keefe and myself will be recording a round table discussion next week to explain the process and procedures related to COVID reporting and contact tracing in town. I'm looking forward to using this opportunity to show the community how efficiently Borough and Board of Ed employees continue to work throughout this pandemic.

The Rutherford Public Library reopened its building Monday, Oct. 5. The hours have changed and COVID protocols are being diligently followed, so they are asking patrons to view our website (RutherfordLibrary.org) before planning their visit. Visits are limited to browsing, borrowing, and printing, copying, and computer use.



The Rutherford Health Department will be conducting two Seasonal Influenza Vaccination Programs for residents during the third and fourth weeks in October.

The first seasonal influenza vaccination program is ONLY for residents 65 years of age and older and will be held on Friday, October 23, 2020 between the hours of 4:30 PM to 6:30 PM. Proof of age will be required to be provided and no one under 65 years of age will be vaccinated at this program.

A second seasonal influenza vaccination program will also be held on Tuesday, October 27, 2020, between 8:30 A.M. to 10:30 A.M., for all adult residents 18 years and older.

Rutherford Downtowner and Commuter Shuttle Services Resume Monday, October 19th. All passengers MUST wear a face covering to board and throughout their commute.
