

I'm always looking for ways to enhance Rutherford's Downtown. Recently, several local businesses owners approached me with a concept that I think could create an even more exciting atmosphere along Park Ave. These business owners have generously offered to pay for permanent decorative string lighting along boths ides of the avenue from the library to Ames Ave.

Other municipalities with thriving downtowns have installed similar lighting which creates an inviting feeling for pedestrians and drivers alike. I'd like to thank Chris Seidler, the DPW Superintendent, for getting on board with the vision these business owners and I presented to him and for agreeing to find a way to have his department make it happen.

We hope to have these lights installed within the next few weeks, especially now as the days are shorter and the nights longer.

Rutherford FD: On Tuesday, November 2nd, shortly after 10 pm, the Rutherford Fire Department responded to a Carbon Monoxide alarm at an apartment complex on Chesnut street. Upon arrival, the responder's CO detectors immediately registered the presence of the deadly gas. Once RFD was able to get to the UPPER floor where the alarm was registering, their equipment registered over 2,000 PPM.

According to the <u>Kidde Fire Safety website</u> readings of over 1,600 PPM will bring about Headache, dizziness and nausea within 20 minutes and death within one hour if a person is not moved to open air immediately.

Upon inspection, the gas accumulation was due to a clogged chimney which had been improperly vented, thus the gas backed up over the course of the evening. It is important for all of us to be aware of the facts about CO poisoning and prepare our homes and those of our loved ones with proper equipment to keep us safe. Please have your CO and Fire detectors checked regularly. If you do not currently have a CO detector, please visit Kidde.com for more information and where to buy a reliable detector.

I would like to extend my sincerest thanks on behalf of our mayor and council to the men and women of the RFD for always being there for our community. If not for their diligence and expediency, we would have lost several friends and neighbors that evening.
