### From the Desk of Mayor Frank Nunziato

As you may know, last Thursday an event was planned at the Williams Center that, based on online intelligence, led our Police Department to believe could create a potential for confrontation.

This situation created a complicated set of circumstances, almost all of which are beyond my control as Mayor. What I am obligated to do as Mayor is weigh in on safety concerns as they relate to our community. On that afternoon, facts were presented to me from law enforcement that indicated we could have a public safety hazard on our hands that evening in our Downtown, as it seemed proper security measures had not been taken into account by the venue. Chief Russo alerted the owner of the Wiliams Center to these concerns and, because the venue cancelled with little notice, we maintained an increase in police presence throughout the night out of an abundance of caution. Police and public safety professionals train for all kinds of unique situations. This particular one was conducted in a text book manner. Communication flowed easily and action was taken as needed. I'd like to thank Police Chief Russo for managing the quickly moving situation throughout that day with state and county officials in order to protect Rutherford as he was sworn to do.

I understand the swift and passionate reaction many residents had when they first heard a potentially contentious event almost took place in Rutherford. I take tremendous comfort in knowing that as a whole, our community reacted with great care and concern for the health and safety of their fellow neighbors when the potential for a confrontational situation arose.

I'd like to remind everyone that we have some amazing events coming up next Saturday that really underscore what Rutherford is all about - community. We will kick off the holiday season with Santa on a float stopping at various locations throughout town. That float will then join the 70th Annual Chamber of Commerce Holiday Parade and continue up to the holiday tree lighting at the Library, after which I invite everyone to gather at Lincoln Park for our annual Holiday Village. I'd especially like to thank the Chamber of Commerce for all their hard work bringing back this parade after a few years off. Organizing a parade like this is no easy feat and I hope everyone takes a moment to thank the volunteer members of the Chamber of Commerce for pulling it together.

I'd like to wish Rutherford a Happy Thanksgiving and encourage you all take time to give thanks to those who keep our community safe and make it a special place to live.
