- Community Events In accordance with Governor
 Murphy's order that all gatherings over 50 people should be
 cancelled, as well as the recommendation from the White
 House to cancel events of 10 or more, the Borough has
 cancelled all town wide events up until and including May
 17th. the Governing Body will be re-assessing at each
 Mayor/Council meeting events scheduled after May 17th
 for potential additional cancellations as more information
 becomes available. If anything should change we will be
 sure to notify our residents accordingly.
- Shade Tree Commission As many of you have seen, multiple trees have been taken down between Park and West Newell Aves. 4 have been scheduled on the shade tree's list to be removed due to decay and disease for over a year. 3 others were scheduled to be trimmed due to their proximity to property and roofs. Borough trees that utility companies normally trim every few years were scheduled to be trimmed due to their proximity to property and roofs. Unfortunately when our crews attempted to trim the upper branches, they noticed significant decay on many of the large branches creating a hazardous condition. Therefore the branches had to be removed fearing any type of storm or wind event would cause them to fall potentially injuring someone or causing property damaged. Unfortunately, due to the amount of branches that needed to be removed, they became no longer viable and the difficult decision was made to remove them entirely. When we return to normal operations later this year, this area is scheduled for installation of new trees to replace those removed.
