We can't wait to have him back and healthy so he can enjoy this town he loves so much.



National Autism Awareness Month

The Mayor and Council proudly issued a proclamation recognizing April as National Autism Awareness Month. Through the outstanding work of the Access for All Rutherford and Stigma Free committees, Rutherford has committed to championing the rights of marginalized populations and continues to examine opportunities for the Borough to provide opportunities that support an inclusive and accepting community.

To honor the advocacy efforts of our Rutherford community, a tribute to the Rutherford Special Parents Network was shared. The story of how this group began, how wide-reaching it continues to be, and how it champions the spirit of those diagnosed with autism as well as the caretakers and families, is a shining example of what makes Rutherford a special place:

"Terri Spettell, Laura Scotti, and Liz Forte, all came to know one another because they had one very important thing in common: A son with autism. Terri moved to Rutherford in 2003, and as luck would have it, she and Laura lived on the same block. Soon they met Liz and they began meeting for regular breakfasts to support one another through the ups and downs of raising a child with autism. They discussed everything that parents with typical kids might not understand. School services, behaviors, haircuts, sleep deprivation. All over endless cups of coffee. They laughed and cried together, giving one another much needed support. Recognizing the importance of being able to support one another, they founded the Rutherford Special Parents Network. The purpose of the group is to provide the parents of children with special needs with a safe place to support and encourage one another. At that time, there was nothing like it. Parents can share their stories in confidence and know they are understood. The group has hosted countless speakers, decorates the Rutherford Library window for autism awareness month, and hosts an autism awareness breakfast. Through its membership of over 60 people, it continues to build awareness of autism in our community and responds to calls from parents who have questions or are looking for support as they navigate difficulty moments or transitions."

Thank you, Terri, Laura, and Liz, for your inspiring an ever-growing network of love and support throughout our Borough and beyond. design in addition to consulting services related to procuring the Technology FFE (furniture, fixtures and equipment). 
