

At the April 27 Mayor and Council meeting, the following resolutions were passed:

- Ordinance introduced on 1st reading ordinance to exceed budget and establish a CAP bank State law authorizes a municipality to increase budget from the prior year by an amount not to exceed 2.5% of those prior year appropriations. However, state law further allows a municipality to increase appropriations from prior year by 3.5% if done via ordinance. This routine action provides the municipality with additional available spending capacity in the event of unanticipated expenses that exceed the 2.5% limit. This action in no way guarantees the expenditure of these extra dollars, however this is an important financial "insurance policy" for the Borough to have available in case the unexpected should arise this year or in the two succeeding years.
- Passed Resolution No. 85 Introduction of the 2020 Municipal Budget. A public hearing related to the budget will be held on May 26th. Residents are encouraged to review the budget which will be available online next week and make every effort to participate in the public hearing or reach out with any questions or concerns they may have.
- Passed Resolution No. 84 Emergency Temporary Budget for May 2020 - this resolution authorizes a temporary budget for the month of May as we continue to finalize our full CY2020 municipal budget.
- Passed Resolution No. 82 Awarding a contract for the demolition of 17 West Passaic Avenue to Caravella Demolition Inc. in the amount of \$38,985 17 West Passaic Avenue was purchased by the Borough as a part of the larger Police Building Project. Demolition of the structure allows this vital project to continue to move forward.
