I'd like to welcome Pat Bonner as the new Director of the Recreation Department. Pat was appointed at Monday's meeting to begin work on Monday, May 16th. As we were sad to see former director Jessica Lezcano leave Rutherford, I am excited to see how Pat's extensive background in logistics and organization helps our Rec Department evolve to suit the needs of our residents.

If you don't already know him, Pat Bonner has been a great resource for this community in the past. He was the 2012 Rutherford Volunteer of the Year and over the past two decades he has volunteered his time, knowledge and talent in and around Rutherford. He was a member of one of the founding families of the Top Dawgs, a program which pairs uniquely abled children with high school students in soccer and basketball to create a fun and educational experience for everyone involved. In addition to coaching baseball, basketball, softball and soccer on the recreational level, he was the coordinator of various age levels and managed the Rutherford FC Travel soccer program for about 10 years. During his years of coaching and coordinating, Pat worked with five different Rutherford Recreation Directors. Professionally, Pat comes to Rutherford after 35 years of public service managing large-scale operations and staffs. He held various positions including overseeing facility operations, setting policies and procedures and enhancing customer service. Saturday, May 21, Lincoln Park 12-4 (rain date next day)

Volunteer experts will help you repair

- bicycles

- sewing machines

- lawnmowers

- knife sharpening

Volunteers will have the right tools, but if possible, bring any needed parts. One item (or two knives) at a time. Sevice is first-come, first-served.

The Rutherford Green Team will hold its third Repair Cafe on Saturday, May 21, from 12-4 pm (rain date May 22) in Lincoln Park in Rutherford. Part social gathering, part repair shop, the Repair Café is an international phenomenon begun in Holland where community members volunteer to help fix things that people would otherwise throw out. It will be an afternoon drop-in event where community members can bring in broken or non-functioning items to be fixed for free with the help of expert volunteers. The purpose is not only to reduce waste but also to teach people how to fix things themselves.

Area residents are invited to bring broken or non-functioning items to Lincoln Park, across from borough hall in Rutherford, where, on a first-come, first-served basis, they will be assisted and advised in making repairs. Participants must first register at the reception table across from borough hall. Participants are limited to two items at a time.
