I'm happy to announce that in light of the incredible drop in COVID cases locally as well as Governor Murphy's recent Executive Orders, Rutherford is able to confidently plan for events for this summer and beyond.

At Monday's meeting, Council approved road closures for Dining Out evenings on Wednesdays from June 9th through August 25th. The popular Summer Concert Series in Lincoln Park has been approved to begin June 24th.

While the Rutherford Veteran's Alliance has made the decision to forego a parade this year, there will be a ceremony at the Union Avenue bridge and Sunset Park on Monday morning. Also, the Rutherford Pride Alliance's Third Annual Pride Flag Raising will be held on Saturday, June 5th at 11 am.

In the coming weeks, we will announce details about the Farmers Market, and be having discussions regarding the Multicultural Festival as well as Rutherford Day which is being considered for Saturday, September 18th.

Rutherford Day, which would encourage Rutherford community organizations to utilize fields and parks for games and activities, is the brainchild of Mayor Nunziato. While we await his return, we will be contacting community organizations throughout June to gauge interest in participation.

On another note, I'd like to remind residents that information regarding the 2021 municipal budget is now available on the Borough website in convenient summary form. I encourage residents to review not only the larger budget document, but also the budget summary document and attend the hearing of the citizens at the June 14th Mayor and Council meeting where comments and questions regarding the budget will be welcomed.




Stigma Free Committee
