From the Desk of Mayor Frank Nunziato

I'm very excited that the 2nd Annual Rutherford Day is fast approaching. This is going to be a great community oriented event that has something for everyone. I'm really excited about it and hope to see you there.

Based on some conversations I've had with residents, I think there's some misinformation out there regarding both Rutherford Day and the Labor Day Street Fair.

Earlier this year, I considered what options we could add to Rutherford Day. Part of that research included the Borough speaking with a vendor who specializes in food truck festivals and has a proven track record for successful events. The suggestions made to enhance our event were very enticing but ultimately I decided to follow the script of last year's successful event. I will look to incorporate some of the suggestions into future Rutherford Day events. Unfortunately that vendor prematurely circulated his own promotion of Rutherford day. As a result of this, a rumor circulated that Rutherford Day is cancelled, which could not be farther from the truth.

Since I became Mayor, one of my top priorities has been to make it easier for residents to learn what's happening in town. That means we provide timely news and updates on our website and social media. Since you're reading this newsletter, you're probably already familiar with our various platforms. I've also heard a lot of rumor surrounding why we did not host the Labor Day Street Fair. Rutherford Fire Department

Please see the graphic on the following page of this newsletter from Fire Marshal Paul Dansbach illustrating the safety hazards and precautions that can be taken with lithium ion batteries. Fires involving these batteries are happening with more frequency throughout the country. Please take a minute to review this information - you'll be glad you did!

In the Month of August 2022, the Rutherford Fire Department responded to 68 total incidents. Included in these incidents was one structure fire located on Hackett place on August 11, 2022. There were four separate motor vehicle incidents involving injuries and entrapments on our local highways Rt 3 and Rt 17. Fire Department responded for mutual aid assistance to the Borough of North Arlington, East Rutherford and the City of Passaic fire departments last month.

In the course of August 2022, the RFD had numerous days experiencing high volume of fire incidents:

August 9 - 7 fire calls

August 11 - 6 fire calls

August 16 - 8 fire calls

August 22 - 5 fire calls

Lithium ion batteries supply power to many kinds of devices including smart phones, laptops, scooters, e-cigarettes, smoke alarms, toys, and even cars. Take care when using them. In rare cases, they can cause a fire or explosion.

The problem

- These batteries store a large amount of energy in a small amount of space.
- Sometimes batteries are not used the right way; batteries not designed for a specific use can be dangerous.
- Like any product, a small number of these batteries are defective. They can overheat, catch fire, or explode.

Safety Tips

- Purchase and use devices that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory.
- Always follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Only use the battery that is designed for the device.
- Put batteries in the device the right way.
- Only use the charging cord that came with the device.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed or on a couch.
- Keep batteries at room temperature.
- Do not place batteries in direct sunlight or keep them in hot vehicles.
- Store batteries away from anything that can catch fire.

Signs of a Problem

Stop using the battery if you notice these problems: odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking, odd noises. If it is safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire. Call **9-1-1**.

Battery Disposal

- Do not put lithium ion batteries in the trash.
- Recycling is always the best option.
- Take them to a battery recycling location or contact your community for disposal instructions.
- Do not put discarded batteries in piles.

High-Tech Luggage

Some major airlines no longer accept 'smart' luggage with non-removable lithium ion batteries as checked or carry-on luggage. The powerful batteries can potentially overheat and pose a fire hazard during flight.

In some instances, smart bags with removable lithium ion batteries will be allowed on board if the battery can be removed on site and taken on board with the customer. Check with your airline for restrictions.

Two and a half years ago, the Borough began utilizing social media as means to a better inform residents of news and updates in a consistent and timely manner.

The intent behind utilizing social media was, and is, to provide efficient and transparent messaging. The information or content we share is not generated by one single person. We compile information from our professionals, our employees, our elected officials and others to keep our residents informed. If we get something wrong, then we as an organization made the error – not one individual.

Social media naturally creates a platform for its audience to offer commentary. We of course strive to be thorough and accurate in our dissemination of information at all times. Sometimes situations arise or circumstances occur where we miss something in our reporting. Since the Borough social media accounts were opened, I'm pleased to say that the majority of commentary on our platforms has been overwhelmingly positive and civil. Occasionally when a mistake is made, the Borough is called out on it publicly, and that's okay, as long as it's done in a civil manner.

Unfortunately, some have used the Borough's social media platforms (and their own) to publicly ridicule Borough employees for errors. That is not the purpose of the Borough's social media. If you have a concern or issue with an employee, you can contact my office and we can address it. Taking to social media to publicly ridicule and embarrass any employee is unfair and quite frankly unacceptable. None of us are perfect but it seems quite often perfection is expected by those who are imperfect themselves. Most of the Borough employees are your neighbors; your friends; your children's coaches or just people trying to earn an honest living without any agendas. There is nothing wrong with holding the government accountable but let's be reasonable and fair about it. Thank you.
