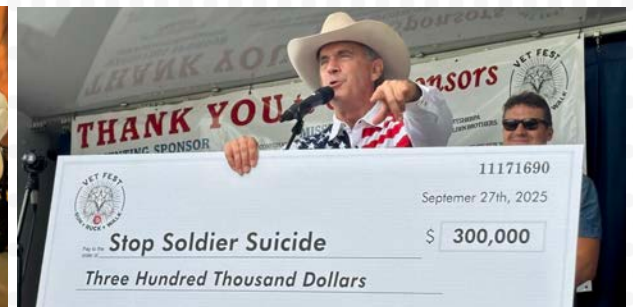

your commitment inspires in us – to rethink, to evolve, and to lead differently.

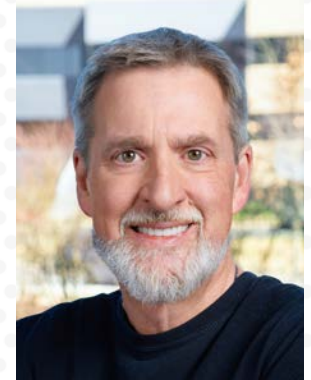


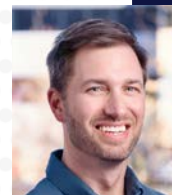

A LETTER FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

In 2010, while deployed in Haiti, an idea took hold. A few months later, from my first desk on Wall Street, I recruited two fellow veterans, Nick Black and Craig Gridelli, and together we founded Stop Soldier Suicide on a simple conviction. No one who has worn the cloth of this nation should die by suicide because help failed to reach them. Fifteen years later, that conviction has only strengthened.

I will be direct.

The suicide prevention industry is broken. Billions have been spent. Awareness has increased. Programs have multiplied. Yet the numbers have not moved in twenty years. We have mistaken effort for progress and compassion for strategy. We have been optimizing a failed model that intervenes after crisis has already taken hold.

We are building something different.

Fifteen years of direct care have given us trust, credibility, and proprietary insight. That foundation enables us to do what no one else is building.

The Black Box Project will make suicide risk predictable.

Not through intuition or better questionnaires. Through the disciplined integration of clinical expertise, behavioral science, and machine intelligence, designed as a system to identify risk before

crisis emerges. This is not incremental progress. This is category creation.

The implication extends well beyond veterans. The same system that identifies risk in a veteran will identify it in first responders, construction workers, and young adults. This is not a program. It is infrastructure with the potential to redefine suicide prevention across every high-risk population in the United States and, over time, globally.

This is not charity. It is catalytic capital directed at a problem that has never been engineered correctly. The downside is limited. The upside is civilization-scale.

I have never taken a dollar from this organization. My return has been measured in lives saved and nothing else. I am asking you to stand with us not because success is assured, but because this is how enduring institutions are built.

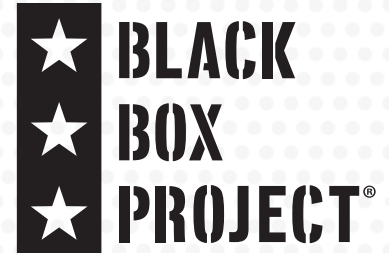


Founded in 2010 by Army veterans, Stop Soldier Suicide is the first national nonprofit focused solely on solving the issue of suicide among U.S. veterans and service members. We have a vision for a nation where service members and veterans have no greater risk for suicide than any other American. Our two primary lines of effort, **ROGER Wellness Service** and **Black Box Project**, are how we will make this vision a reality.

ROGER

ROGER Wellness Service provides veterans and service members with evidence-based, suicide-specific care from our team of clinicians.

Thanks to donors and partners nationwide, these confidential telehealth services are 100% free for every U.S. veteran and active service member, no matter their branch or discharge status.



Through this groundbreaking data initiative, we are turning loss into legacy, converting data into hope, and using innovation to save lives. Loss-surviving families generously loan us the electronic devices of their loved ones so that we can identify and analyze the data.

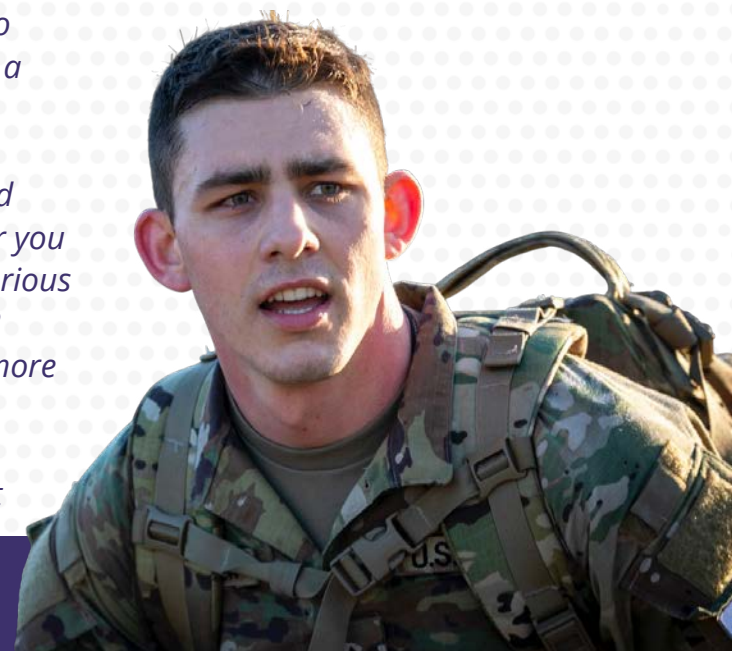
OUTREACH & SCHEDULING



When someone reaches out for help, time matters. Most individuals who submit an online help request hear from our team within **four minutes**. That first connection allows us to confirm their needs and determine whether immediate crisis support is required.

TURNING LOSS INTO LEGACY

Together, we can build a world where suicide is not just preventable in theory, but prevented in practice. The challenge is that for far too many people, their suicide risk remains hidden.

Nearly two-thirds of individuals who die by suicide never shared their suicidal thoughts with anyone – not family, not friends, not even the healthcare system. Their vulnerability went unseen until it was too late.

Black Box Project makes that invisible risk visible by reconstructing the journeys of those we've lost, using data that has never before been available to researchers.

The project's initial findings represent more than early insights – they signal a shift in how suicide prevention can be understood, informed, and ultimately transformed.

CELEBRATING 10 YEARS OF VET FEST

What began 10 years ago as a grassroots fundraiser has grown into a powerful platform that unites communities, embraces Gold Star families, educates civilians, supports veterans and service members, and advances the fight against veteran suicide.

Led by volunteer chair, Brian DiSabatino, Vet Fest is an uplifting and educational day that brings military and civilian communities together in shared purpose. Participants run, ruck, and walk in support of Stop Soldier Suicide, while engaging in meaningful fundraising, community connection, mental health outreach, and visible demonstrations of military pride and gratitude.

In its milestone 10th year, Vet Fest raised more than \$300,000, with 700 runners, ruckers, walkers, and motorcyclists taking part alongside nearly 80 corporate partners and community organizations. Together, a decade of Vet Fest has generated an incredible \$1.3 million in support – fueling life-saving work and proving what’s possible when a community comes together with intention and heart.

MOVEMENT & A MISSION

One challenger's journey to honor her son

Robin Quint has experienced the profound pain of losing her second-born son, James – a Navy sailor – to suicide. In the early days, she wasn't sure how she would keep moving forward.

About 18 months after losing James, the Stop Soldier Suicide "Never Walk Alone" Dog Walking Challenge appeared on her Facebook feed. Something in her said, "I'm going to do it." Signing up wasn't just about participating – it was the moment she chose to share her story publicly for the first time.

As Robin began to share her story on Facebook and other platforms, she found encouragement, kindness, and connection. A retired Army veteran – a complete stranger – even donated to her challenge. She reached her initial fundraising goal within two weeks and continued raising it, determined to honor

James and spread the message: "You're never alone. You don't have to be alone."

And somewhere in the process, something shifted – sharing became healing, vulnerability became strength, and grief found movement.

Each day as she walked with her dog, she carried her love for James and her commitment to helping others. The timing of the challenge, the message, the community ... she said it all "came together" in a deeply meaningful way.

Robin has said that for her the words she holds dear are not "never forget," but rather "always remember." We are deeply honored that our challenge was what Robin needed in that moment and that it led to important connections for her and those she met along the way.

GATHERINGS OF IMPACT

LEDCOR 100-MILE CHALLENGE

Ledcor veterans organized two events this year – a 100-mile challenge in May, and a 20-mile walk in November. With participants from across the Americas, Ledcor raised over \$60,000 in 2025 and nearly \$250,000 since 2022.



BLACKSTONE RUCK

Blackstone hosted their second annual Ruck for Stop Soldier Suicide in September. More than 300 Blackstone employees and partner groups marched across New York City, Miami and San Francisco raising over \$80,000.



CAPTAIN AUSTIN MURGA GOLF OUTING

During the past 5 years, Kevin and Gay Murga, with their surrounding Southport community have raised nearly \$400,000 for Stop Soldier Suicide through their annual Captain Austin Murga Memorial Golf Outing.

CORNHOLE TOURNAMENT

In its second year, the CPL Jake Bryan "Our Man on the Moon" Cornhole Tournament continued to honor Jake's legacy while raising critical funds for Stop Soldier Suicide, strengthening connections and support for at-risk veterans and service members.



GATHERINGS OF IMPACT (CONTINUED)

BAY AREA BRAVE

Businesses and individuals from around the Tampa Bay area gathered for an evening of hope, inspiration, and purpose, raising over \$75,000 for Stop Soldier Suicide.



RIDE THE TIDE

After losing their son Mitchell to suicide in 2020, his father Neil – an avid biker – channeled his grief into Stop Soldier Suicide’s 250 Mile Bike Challenge. Inspired by the rides he once shared with Mitch, the family went on to create Ride the Tide, a community cycling event that raised more than \$47,000 in its first year.



MARINE CORPS MARATHON

The 50th Marine Corps Marathon marked SSS’s first foray into marathon event fundraising. With more than 40 runners, Team SSS raised nearly \$70,000, demonstrating the power of endurance events to drive both community engagement and impact.



C2MS GOLF INVITATIONAL

Since 2023, Scott and Greg Wuestner have hosted a golf scramble in Atlanta, GA, benefiting Stop Soldier Suicide. Alongside QTS Data Centers, organizations across the construction industry have joined the effort, raising more than \$575,000 to date.





A CLEAR MISSION. A TRANSFORMATIONAL COMMITMENT.

» Jamie Barker remembers exactly where he was on September 11, 2001.

He was home in Tribeca, overlooking the Holland Tunnel, while he held his 9-month-old son in his arms. Gazing out his window he watched the first plane fly toward the city – an unfamiliar path that immediately caught his attention. Seconds later, he heard the explosion. Friends. Colleagues. People he knew and loved were lost that day.

“In that moment,” Jamie says, “I told myself that someday, I was going to give back – in their honor and memory.”

That promise stayed with him. What began as a personal commitment to service eventually led him to Stop Soldier Suicide – and became some of the most meaningful work of his more than 40-year career.

“I don’t think there is much more important work we can do than to save a human life,”

Jamie says. “And if it’s someone who served our country, why wouldn’t you want to help? It’s pretty simple.”

For Jamie, Stop Soldier Suicide stands out because the mission is clear: veterans are dying at alarming rates, and proven care can save lives. There’s no ambiguity about the need, or the urgency. That clarity is what drew him in, and it’s what keeps him committed.

Jamie doesn’t just support the mission – he lives it out loud. When he’s not in a boardroom, he’s often wearing Stop Soldier Suicide gear. Wherever he goes, conversations follow – sometimes casual, sometimes urgent. Those moments have become opportunities to invite others into the mission, turning awareness into action and supporters into advocates.

Those interactions changed how Jamie shows up. He redesigned his business cards to include crisis resources, knowing a simple exchange

could become a life-saving connection.

Drawing on his professional background and personal commitment, Jamie also serves on Stop Soldier Suicide’s New York City Executive Leadership Team, where he helps expand Stop Soldier Suicide’s organization’s reach by bringing new partners, leaders, and champions into the fight.

“I made a commitment on 9/11 to give back,” he says. “Stop Soldier Suicide is at the top of that list. Even if this helped save just one life, it would be worth it.”

As Jamie reflects on the convergence of three anniversaries – the 10-year milestone of Eden Rock, 15 years of Stop Soldier Suicide, and 25 years since 9/11 – his commitment is clear: to honor them not just with reflection, but with significant action that makes a real difference.

“This mission is simple,” Jamie says. “The need is clear. And the impact is real.”
