#### Published Results for 2016 - 2017

The Iffley Academy is a community special academy for students with complex needs in years 7 – 13. Students have a primary Cognition and Learning disability and secondary needs of Autism or Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs. All students are working **below** the current floor standards due to their cognition and learning needs.

The academy sets targets and measures progress in English and Mathematics through the NC using the Progression Guidance Data set 1 and quartile data sets to assess progress in the upper, median and lower quartiles for KS3 and KS4.

Progress data presented in the box below shows that on average 67% of students at the academy have made Upper Quartile progress (English/mathematics aggregated) over the last 3 years. This is well above the national average for students with Special Educational Needs.

'Students' attainment on entry is well below the level expected for their age. This is because of their SEN. Students make excellent progress and achievement improves rapidly in a range of subjects. Students make rapid and sustained progress, achieving outstandingly well. Learning across KS3, KS4, sixth form, in all subjects, is linked very closely to needs and abilities. As a result, a very high proportion of students make better than expected progress in English and mathematics.' Ofsted January 2015

### **Progress 8**

All students at the academy have Cognition and Learning disabilities. Progress 8 measures are not applicable. Students work on qualifications in functional English and Maths from Entry Level 1 to Level 1. Vocational accreditation outcomes are linked to the development of personal, social and employability skills which do not contribute to the published school and college qualifications tables.

Targets for Year 11 exam outcomes in English and maths are set annually for each cohort and are based on individual students' rates of progress, Y6 – 11 progress measures (Progression Data set 1) and historical data sets for the academy.

The academy does not set KS4 Progress 8 or Attainment 8 measures.

#### **Sixth Form**

Students at the academy do not follow the Achievement Continuum. Accreditation targets are set each year for individual students and are linked to the outcomes in each student's Education Health and Care Plan.
