

Pratham Books Launches PhoneStories to Bring Joyful Reading Experiences to Children via Mobile Devices

Bangalore – November 13, 2017: Pratham Books, a not-for-profit publisher, today announced that it has launched PhoneStories, an initiative that weaves together words, images and sounds to create a delightful reading experience for children. An innovative approach in publishing, PhoneStories have been designed to be mobile first and available at no cost so that children across the country can access them easily.

The underlying thought behind PhoneStories is to leverage the high penetration of mobile devices across India and develop a series of books that can be accessed, shared and enjoyed on them. It is also an attempt to provide an engaging platform for children that enhances reading accuracy, makes reading a source of pleasure and improves comprehension. Intended to elevate the joy of hearing stories beautifully told by engaging storytellers, four PhoneStories themed on nature will be released every week with an aim to provide young readers with engaging content and strengthen their relationship with the great outdoors.

The first of the four PhoneStories to be launched is titled, *Watch Out! The Tiger is Here!* The book, based on the wonderful world of Indian wildlife, is authored by wildlife and travel writer Sejal Mehta, illustrated by award-winning cartoonist Rohan Chakravarty, and narrated by stand-up comedian Rohan Joshi in English and Purnesh Kumar Tripathi in Hindi. The three other books of the series will be released in the following weeks, every Friday, and are titled, *Did You Hear?*, *Wild Cat! Wild Cat!*, and *Who Ate All that Up?* The books have been jointly edited by Bijal Vachharajani and Aparna Kapur of Pratham Books. The books will introduce children to fascinating Indian animals, birds, and insects, and their way of life, and will be available in English and Hindi in an audio-visual format. It will also be available in multiple languages on StoryWeaver to read, download, print and share for free.

The launch of the book is augmented by interesting on-ground activation events. In collaboration with Pratham Books' partner organisations, focused engagements are outlined to make the stories readily accessible to children of over 600 aanganwadis/preschools and 1000+ schools across India. The educators will be connected by a common group on WhatsApp to enable easy sharing of stories. The purpose of the approach is to reach the educator directly and facilitate them to bring wildlife to the classrooms through activity based learning and laughter. Contests around these books will be hosted on the group so that teachers get a chance to be creative and share it with other educators.

The first book, *Watch Out! The Tiger is Here!* will be launched by the author in one of Pratham Books' outreach partner schools in Bengaluru. The event will include a book reading, some fun activities followed by a Q&A session with the author.
