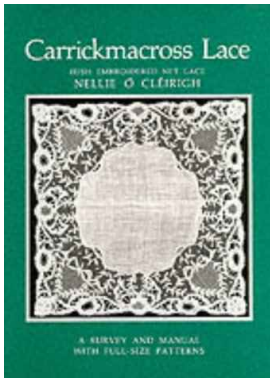

This is a good book for the history of this kind of lace and for its patterns. However, the instructions for doing it are not very good and are reprints from old books. This might be good for people who already know how to embroider on net, but not for beginners. I found better instructions for doing the embroidery elsewhere.

This lace design was inspired by Italian applique lace, brought to Ireland by Mrs. Grey Porter of Carrickmacross, County Monaghan, when she returned from her continental honeymoon in 1816. She created an individual style and established a lace-making cottage industry, founding a school of lacemakers to create gainful work for women. In this, fine examples of both varieties (Applique and Guipure) of Carrickmacross Lace are illustrated, and a practical section explains the stitches and procedures used with full-sized patterns drawn from historic examples.
