Class Objectives: Let us learn the basic sentence structures in Marathi.

Concept A: Basic Sentence Structure

- Marathi sentence structure can be confusing at times but generally tend to follow a Subject-Object-Verb pattern.
- Marathi nouns have genders: Masculine and Feminine.
- Masculine usually ending in “aa” (आ) and Feminine usually ending in “i” or “iya”(इ आणि ई)

Example:

Masculine	In Marathi	Feminine	In Marathi
Husband	पती (pati)	Wife	पत्नी(patni)
Boy	मुलगा (mulaga)	Girl	मुलगी (mulgi)

Example sentences:

	Subject	+	Object	+	Verb
I eat food -	मी (Me)		जेवण (jevan)		करतो . (karto)
I go to market-	मी (Me)		बाजारात (bazarat)		जातो. (jato)

Concept B: Five basic sentence structures

There are five basic sentence structures in Marathi

1. Subject-Verb - उद्देश्य(uddeshya)- क्रियापद (kriyapad)

- The boy plays.
Mulga khelto.
मुलगा खेळतो.
- Jaya eats.
Jaya khate.
