- The top 10% of the Indian population holds 77% of the total national wealth.
- 73% of the wealth generated in 2017 went to the richest 1%, while 67 million Indians who comprise the poorest half of the population saw only a 1% increase in their wealth.
- There are 119 billionaires in India.

Concept A: Vocabulary needed to discuss the topic:

- Income- is money what an individual or business receives in exchange for providing labor, producing a good or services
- Wealth-an abundance of valuable possessions or money.
- Absolute poverty- it is where an individual lacks income to meet his basic needs
- Poverty- poverty defined in comparison to other people's standing in the economy.
- Asset- is a resource with economic value
- Tax- it is a charge levied by any government on the income, in order to collect revenue for public works providing the best facilities and infrastructure
- Consumption-the action of using up a resource.
- Labour class-It is the class of people categorized by jobs that provide low pay, require limited skill, or physical labor.
- Income gap-is the difference between the rich and the poor.
