Nouns- Gender, plural



Class Objective

Concept A: What are nouns?

- Nouns in German are similar to nouns in English. But the nouns in German should always start with a capital letter. Example: Katze (cat), Mann (Man), Lehrerin (Female teacher) etc.
- Even if the nouns are in the middle of a sentence, they should be written with a capital letter in the beginning
- Nouns in German have a peculiar feature: They are addressed with articles like der, die, das, dem, den, des etc



Some nouns for practise:

- **Das Jahr** (pronounced as Yahr) ➔ Year
- **Das Beispiel** ➔ Example
- **Das Haus** ➔ house
- **Der Tag** ➔ Day
- **Die Monate** ➔ Month
- **Die Arbeit** ➔ Work
- **Das Hand** ➔ hand



Concept B: Gender of the nouns

The Nouns in German language as explained in concept A is addressed with the articles.

These articles indicate the gender of the nouns.

Der : Shows that the noun is Masculine gender

Die : Shows that the noun is Feminine gender

Das : shows that the noun is Neuter gender

Example:

Der Tag indicates that Tag is masculine gender

Die Arbeit indicates that Arbeit is feminine gender

Das Beispiel indicates that it is neuter gender



Concept C: Plural indicates the counting of objects more than one. It is indicated by the article “Die”

- In German, we have singular and plural
- Singular is used for indicating any singular object
- **Example:**
- Der Tisch (Table) here is masculine gender and is singular
- The plural of Tisch is die Tische (Tables). Here the plural is indicated by
- the article “die”
