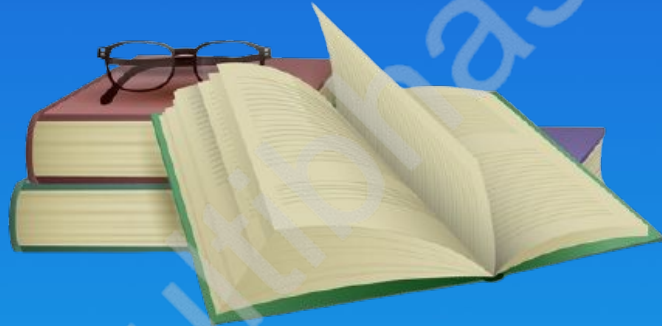

Concept A: Indirect object pronoun

	Singular	Plural
1st person	Me/A mi	Nos/a nosotros
2nd person	Te/a ti	Os/a vosotros
3rd person	Le//A el/ella/usted	Les//a ellos/ellas/ustedes

Singular	Plural
Gusta	Gustan



- Gustar - to like/to be pleasing
For example:

~ A mí, me gustan las playas.(I like beaches)

To me, beaches are pleasing.

~ A mí, me gusta la playa.

I like beach.



Negative:
For example:

~ Maria doesn't like flowers.

A Maria, no le gustan flores.

~ Roberto likes history and Spanish.

A Roberto, le gustan la historia y el Español.



Concept B:

Tambien and tampoco are two words we can use when we agree with someone else's opinion or also preference.

“A mí tambien.” (también) means: “To me too.” or “To me also.”

- Let's see how to **agree with someone** else's opinions.

~ I like coffee

A mí, también

~ No me gusta leer novelas.

A mí tampoco
