Renaissance-a revival of or renewed interest in something.

"Cinema-going is enjoying something of a renaissance."

Clutches-grasp (something) tightly.

"He stood clutching a microphone."

Monarch-a sovereign head of state, especially a king, queen, or emperor.

"The reigning monarch."

Advent-the arrival of a notable person or thing.

"The advent of television."

Infallibility-the quality of being infallible; the inability to be wrong.

"His judgement became impaired by faith in his own infallibility."

Baron-an important or powerful person in a specified business or industry.

"A press baron"

Vogue-the prevailing fashion or style at a particular time.

"The vogue is to make realistic films."
