

Laita and its usage

ليت و استخدامها

Class Objective:

To study Laita and its usage.

Synopsis:

- We remind you that the nominal sentence consists of two main parts:
The subject (المُبْتَدَأُ /al mubtada
The predicate (الخبر /al khabar/)
The subject and the predicate are both originally in nominative case, i.e. is signed originally with /ḍammah/ (') on the last letter.
- The annullers which we will study in this lesson are not verbs, instead they are particles. These annullers are called in Arabic (الْحُرُوفُ النَّاسِخَةُ /al ħurūf an nāsikhah/), i.e. the annuler particles.
- We will only study one of the annuler particles in this lesson - /Laita/ and its uses. In this lesson we will learn what /Laita/ means and what its uses. Please have a look at the following examples (read from right to left):
- We will also learn in this lesson the function of /Laita/ and its uses. We will study their effect on the declension of the two parts of the nominal sentence, i.e. the subject and the predicate. Look at the following examples, and consider the declension before and after the annuler particle:

Concept A: Laita

Laita/ ليت : is a particle of wishing. It is used for something that you wish for but you know will never happen. See the following examples:

Here's the conjugation of Laita with nouns only so kindly pay attention to its uses:

<i>English</i>	<i>Transliteration</i>	<i>Arabic</i>
If only the students are hardworking.	Laitat tullabu yanjahun.	ليت الطلاب ينجحون.
If only Youthfulness comes back.	Laitash shababu yaud.	ليت الشباب يعود.
If only the teacher taught us this lesson.	Laital modarriso yodarresuna hazad dars.	ليت المدرس يدرسنا هذا الدرس.
If only the dreams come true.	Laital ahlamu yusbehu haqiqiyan.	ليت الاحلام يصبح حقيقيا.
