Concept A: Interrogative Pronoun wer, wen, wem, wessen and was

- Interrogative pronouns are also called the *question words*. The interrogative
- pronouns which are used in German grammar are wer, was, wem, wen,
- **and wessen.** Generally, we use interrogative pronouns to replace the **noun**
- or **pronoun** that we are asking after in <u>questions</u>.

- > WER It is used to ask after people in the **nominative case**.
 - Example:
 - Wer hat die Hausaufgabe gemacht?



Concept A: Interrogative Pronoun wer, wen, wem, wessen and was

> WEN - It is used to ask after people in the accusative case.

Example:

Wen besuchen wir?

> WEM - It is used to ask after people in the **dative case.**

Example:

Wem hast du das Geschenk gegeben?



Concept A: Interrogative Pronoun wer, wen, wem, wessen and was

WESSEN - It is used to ask after people in the genitive case.

Example:

Wessen Tasche ist das?

Was - It is used to ask after things in all of the German cases.

Example:

Was machst du heute?

Was haben Sie gestern gegessen?



Concept B: Fragepronomen Welch

The Interrogative Pronoun Welch is used when you are asking after something specific/particular. Hence, welch is declined.

Kasus	Maskulin	Feminin	Neutral	Plural
Nom.	welcher	welche	welches	welche
Akk.	welchen	welche	welches	welche
