Indirect object pronoun (Le pronom objet indirect)



Class Objective

To learn about the indirect object pronoun and its usage in French



Concept A: Transitive and Intransitive verbs:

- Transitive verbs are those verbs that require an object to complete the sense.
- Intransitive verbs are those verbs that do not require an object to complete the sense

Examples

1. J'écris un lettre. - I write a letter.
2. Tu parles français. - You speak French.
3. Tu parles au professeur. - You speak to the teacher.
4. Je dors. - I sleep
5. Le chien aboie. - The dog barks.
6. L'oiseau vole.- The bird flies.



Concept A: Transitive and Intransitive verbs:



In the above examples, the first three sentences are examples of transitive verbs and the next three are examples of intransitive verbs.



Concept B: Indirect objects:

Those objects of transitive verbs that follow the verb after a prépositions are called indirect objects.

Examples:

1. Je parle au professeur. - I speak to the teacher.
2. Je téléphone à mes parents. - I call my parents.
3. J'écris à Nicholas. - I write to Nicholas.
4. Elle donne les fleurs à Patrick. - She gives flowers to Patrick.



Concept B: Indirect objects:



In the above sentences, professeur, mes parents, Nicholas and Patrick are used after the verb with preposition à or its contracted article forms, hence are indirect objects.
